## RULES FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE IOWA COUNTY BOARD

- Rule 1. The hour of meeting shall be 10:00 o'clock a.m. and 2 o'clock p.m., unless a different hour shall be prescribed.
- Rule 2. The Chairman shall call the meeting to order at the hour fixed for the meeting. (1) The Clerk shall call the roll of members and (2) a majority being present, the journal of the preceding meeting shall be read, that any mistakes may be corrected, (3) Motions may be offered.
- Rule 3. The Chairman shall preserve order and decorum, and may speak to points of order in preference to other members.
- Rule 4. The Board shall elect at their annual April meeting a chairman and also a vice-chairman who shall act in the absence, disability, death or resignation of the chairman or request to act and possess powers of the Chairman.
- Rule 5. The Chairman with the assistance of the vice-chairman shall appoint all committees unless otherwise ordered.
- Rule 6. All questions shall be stated by the chair. If the Chairman doubts as to the voice of the majority he or any member of the Board may call for a vote by either roll call or rising vote on the question to be decided.
- Rule 7. The following standing committees shall be appointed: Committee on Claims, Committee on Equalization, Committee on Treasurer's, Clerk's, and Highway Accounts, Committee on Finance, Taxation and Budget, Committee on Hospital and Home, Committee on Resolutions from without the County, Committee on Tax Claims, Committee on Bonds and Salaries, Committee on Register of Deeds, Clerk of Court and District Attorney Accounts, Committee on Public Property, Committee on Publishing and Printing, Committee on County Highway, Superintendent of Schools Committee, Committee on Agriculture, Committee on Personnel and Sheriff's Committee. The size of committees shall be limited to not less than three nor more than five members.
- Rule 8. After the journal shall have been read the order of business shall be as follows: 1. Letters, Petitions, Remonstrations, Communication and Accompanying Documents. 2. Resolutions. 3. Reports of committee, first standing and afterwards, special committees. 4. Miscellaneous business.
- Rule 9. Every member present shall vote unless excused by the Chairman.
- Rule 10. Every vote taken in regard to levying taxes, appropriating money, or dividing or altering the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be taken by Yeas and Nays, and the same shall be entered on the journal.
- Rule 11. The Yeas and Nays on any question shall be entered on the journal at the request of one of the members present.

- 12. No petitions, resolutions or motions having for its object the division or alteration of the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be entered on or considered at the same session of the Board at which it was introduced, but the same shall lie over for consideration at the next regular adjourned or special session of the Board.
- Rule 13. No mention, other than the receiving of petitions, remonstrations, communications, claims, and the reference of the same to appropriate Committees or to adjourn shall be acted upon in the absence of any committee in the regular discharge of their duty unless such motion had been made at a previous meeting and a special assignment had for its consideration.
- Rule 14. No report or resolution appropriating any money shall be acted upon until the next day after presentation without permission of a majority of the members elected.
- Rule 15. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern in all cases where they are applicable.
- Rule 16. Any of the foregoing rules, except Rules 10 and 12 may be rescined, changed or suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- Rule 17. Rules Nos. 10 and 12 may be rescinded, altered or suspended by a two-thirds vote of all the members entitled to seats on the County Board.
- Rule 18. The Committee on Equalization shall render their report immediately after roll call on the first day of the session but said report shall not be acted upon on the day which it is presented.
- Rule 19. The Chairman shall appoint two or more members of the Board, who shall visit the County Hospital and Home any time within one month after their appointment and file their written report as to the condition found after their visit. And for each succeeding month thereafter, a like committee shall be appointed whose duties shall be the same as the first committee, but no member shall be appointed on such committee oftener than once in twelve months, the compensation to be \$5.00 per visit in full for said trip.
- Rule 20. No informal ballot cast by this Board shall be declared a formal ballot. In no case shall any official be elected by this Board by casting a unanimous vote in favor of any candidate or nominee.

## PROCEEDINGS OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN April 17, 1956

The Board of Supervisors met in Regular Session at the Court House in the City of Dodgeville, Iowa County, Wisconsin, April 17, 1956 and was called to order by Honorable Glenn H. James, Chairman of the Board.

Appointment (No. 1) of Mr. Paul Fuchs of the Village of Hollandale as member of the Iowa County Board was read.

Hollandale, Wisconsin April 16, 1956

To the Honorable County Board of Iowa County:

Mr. Howard Hegland, the duly elected Supervisor from the Village of Hollandale, is unable to represent the Village at this Board Session as he is the acting Postmaster until a permanent appointment is made.

Therefore the Village Board requests that Mr. Paul Fuchs, the Village President, be allowed to represent the Village of Hollandale at this meeting of the County Board.

Sup. Oimoen moved the rules that governed the 1955 session govern this session.

Seconded and carried.

Recommendations (No. 2) of the Special Committee appointed by the Chairman to study the duties of committees was read.

## DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

## **Duties of the County Highway Committee**

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- I. The County Highway Committee shall have supervision over the maintenance and construction of all roads and bridges as provided by the statutes and shall submit to the County Board an annual report including the report of the County Highway Committee of all receipts and expenditures in the County Highway Department and shall submit an annual budget and recommendations for the tax levy for road and bridge purposes to the County Board at the annual session and any other duties as outlined in the statutes or as directed by County Board Action.
- 2. The County Highway Committee shall have jurisdication over all matters pertaining to the Iowa County Traffic Department.
- 3. The Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the operation of the County Ambulance.

## Duties of the Sheriff's Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. The Sheriff's Committee shall examine all accounts and claims filed against the County by the Sheriff and his deputies, and make report to the County Board at each regular meeting thereof.
- The Sheriff's Committee shall also have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the county police radio system, and shall act upon such other matters as may be referred to it by the County Board.

## Duties of the Resolution Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

1. To receive and examine all resolutions from without the County and make report thereof to the County Board.

## Duties of the General Claims Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

1. To audit, allow or disallow all claims filed in the office of the County Clerk or referred to the committee, and shall file a schedule of such claims allowed, with the County Clerk, for payment and shall make a report to the County Board of all claims audited.

## Duties of the Equalization Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To have supervision over and make an equalization of the assessments on all property in the county for taxes between the several towns, villages and cities of the county.
- It shall be the duty of this committee to make a detalled report thereof at the annual session of the board.
- This committee shall meet annually with the Supervisor of Assessments and County Assessors at their spring meeting.

## Duties of the Tax Claims Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

1. To consider, examine and report to the county board, its

findings in all matters of illegal assessments, tax titles and delinquent lands that may come before the board for action.

- 2. To supervise all delinquent taxes returned to the County, supervise the taking of tax deeds, supervise the sale of real estate taken on tax deed to the end that property is returned to the tax roll and aid in the collection of delinquent taxes. Where the value of the property involved warrants it the Committee shall have the power to appraise the property and in its descretion insure it for the benefit of the county.
- To make appraisals pursuant to Chapter 75.69 of the county owned tax deed lands.
- To sell and dispose to the best interests of the county those lands to which the county has taken tax deeds.
- To employ the services of the county surveyor to establish the location of county owned property when necessary.
- 6. To authorize and recommend the county treasurer at their descretion to assign to heirs, mortgagees or adjacent property owners, tax certificates purchased by the county at the annual sale of tax certificates.

## Duties of the Welfare Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To have charge of all matters arising from the care of the poor, and incidental matters and claims for the support and care of the indigent and poor.
- To act in an advisory capacity with the Director of Pensions and Relief when necessary.

(See Resolution (No. 38) combining two committees dated at Dodgeville, Wisconsin, November 14, 1935.

Also ordinance (No. 6) passed in the County Board Sessions of 1941).

## **Duties of the Finance Committee**

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To prepare and present to the County Board at the Annual Session the Budget and Tax Levy; first in a temporary form, and finally in a complete form as changed during the County Board Session.
- To report upon all resolutions and petitions for appropriations presented to the Board.
- To report and make recommendations on the finances of the County from time to time when required.

## Duties of the Bonds and Salaries Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To recommend to the County Board the compensation of County officers and employees.
- To determine the amount of Bonds to be furnished by the County officers to the County and to report on the sufficiency of such bonds.
- To designate and report to the County Board the Banks of Iowa County that may apply as a depository for county funds.

## **Duties of Agricultural Committee**

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

 To perform all duties prescribed by law as further instructed by the County Board.

According to the Statutes the personnel of the County Agricultural Committee shall consist of the Chairman of the County Board, the Superintendent of Schools and three men actually engaged in farming, one of whom must be a member of the County Board.

The general duty of the Committee is to protect and enhance the financial interest of the county in all things agricultural. This committee, working in conjunction with state and federal authorities shall according to statute, enter into, consumate and cancel contracts with all extension workers and be the authority in the matter of policy of the extension office.

This committee shall bring before the proper committee requests for appropriations for fiscal years, listing the salaries and estimated expense of each department of extension work.

The agricultural committee shall examine and approve all claims filed against Iowa County by the Extension Department.

The Agricultural Committee has in the past requested the assistance of agricultural leaders of the county in the formation of an agricultural program for the year. This privilege is to continue.

When a county becomes a soil conservation district, the agricultural committee automatically becomes supervisor of said district and must sign all contracts with those who enter into soil conservaion contracts.

The Agricultural Committee shall act in an advisory capacity on all agricultural appropriations unless otherwise instructed by the County Board.

## **Duties of Personnel Committee**

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To set the policy of each department when not in conflict with the Statutes or when called upon for this purpose, also to designate the duties and responsibilities of the different offices.
- To hear and consider grievances reported by county departments, county officers and county employees and to make their recommendations to the County Board.
- All matters pertaining to clerk hire, working hours and conditions, departmental problems or questions shall be referred to this committee.
  - 4. To meet annually not later than October 15 of each year.

## Duties of Committee on Clerk's, Treasurer's and Highway Accounts It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To meet with the State Auditors to study and examine the report on the accounts of the County Clerk, County Treasurer and Highway Department, and to make a report to the County Board.
- 2. To audit the Accounts of the Justices of Iowa County as provided by the Wisconsin Statutes.
- 3. To approve the reports of the County Clerk and County Treasurer before being presented to the County Board.

## Duties of Committee on District Attorney, Register of Deeds and Clerk of Courts Accounts

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To approve the reports of the District Attorney, Register of Deeds and Clerk of Courts.

## **Duties of Public Property Committee**

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To supervise and have charge of the Court House, County Jail and the grounds of these buildings and the Governor Dodge park.
  - 2. To keep in repair and good condition these properties.
- 3. In order to maintain uniformity of equipment, the Public Property Committee shall purchase the equipment for all the offices in the Court House with the following exceptions no office equipment shall be purchased for the County Agent's office, Welfare office or Highway Department, except when such purchases are made from the General Fund.
- 4. This Committee shall function during the year and when the County Board is not in session.

## Duties of County Superintendent of Schools Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To act as an advisory committee on all matters pertaining to the office of the County Superintendent of Schools, excepting those duties governed by statute.
- To check the superintendent's accounts and make recommendations to the board in matters of expense and appropriation.

## Duties of the Committee on County Hospital and Home It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To examine the accounts of the Hospital and Home..
- To compare the vouchers as filed with the County Clerk with the records of the institutions and to compare the revenues received at the Hospital and Home with the receipts issued by the County Treasurer.
- 3. To act as an advisory committee with the Board of Trustees in the maintenance, repairs and construction of buildings.
- 4. To report to the County Board, but in no way interfere with the management of the Hospital and Home by the Board of Trustees as established by law.

## Duties of the Printing Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To accept bids on the printing of the County Board Proceedings, stationery, envelopes for county officers and Court Calendars.
- 2. To act on all matters of printing referred to them by the County Board.

Duties of Conservation Committee
It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To audit the accounts of any money appropriated by the County Board for conservation work.
- 2. To supervise the purchase of equipment and supplies in which the money appropriated by the County Board is used.

## **Duties of Highway Study Committee**

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To receive all petitions referred to it by the County Board, by the regular highway committee and any citizen group relating to the construction, relocation, maintenace and repairs of any Federal, State or County road in the county and report their recommendations to the next meeting of the County Board.
- To confer with the regular Highway Committee on all allocations and grants of Federal and State funds and on any other highway matters of major importance.
  - 3. This committee is merely advisory.

## Duties of the Health Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To act in an advisory capacity with the County Nurse on all types of health programs.
- 2. Annually plan and recommend the budget for the health program.

WHEREAS there has been a close working relationship between the Iowa County Board of Supervisors and the Iowa County Conservation Congress Committee over the past 21 years,

You are hereby notified that the estimated allotment in the fiscal year ending June 30, 1957, under the provisions of Sections 20.420(75) and 84.03(3), for expenditure on the State Trunk Highway System in your county is \$84,000.

By joint action of your county and the State Highway Commission, such allotment in the sum of \$41,000 has previously been authorized to be advanced for the improvement of portions of State

Trunk Highway 191 between Dodgeville and County Trunk Highway "Y," and

By joint action of your county and the State Highway Commission, such allotment in the sum of \$43,000 has previously been authorized to be advanced for the improvement of State Trunk Highway 23 between Dodgeville and State Trunk Highway 130. No further action is required with reference to such advance.

## Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned committees beg leave to report that an inspection was made last fall of all the County Trunks in Iowa County, and found that it would take millions of dollars to honor all petitions for construction, surfacing and placing bituminous mats on County Highways as requested.

The increased traffic load is breaking down the County Highways faster than the Highway Department can improve our highway system, as there is not enough funds to meet the public demands.

Therefore, we recommend that the County Highway Commission continue to take advantage of all Federal Funds which become available on Federal Aid County Trunk Highways, as the Federal Aid Projects on County Highways which were built on Federal standards with Federal Funds are paying dividends in the long run.

The Highway program was set up by the undersigned committees last November for matching of Federal Aid on projects programmed, maintenance, ice prevention and snow removal. This left part of the fund for emergency repairs or construction for public safety, and therefore we report that the Highway Committee will honor the petition on County Trunk Highway "W" north of Jonesdale, (known as the Jonesdale Hill) for relocation and construction of said County Highway if funds are available.

We are gradually improving our highway system, but we are still far short of the desires and needs of the traveling public.

## RESOLUTION NO. 21

Resolution Amending Resolution No. 17—County Aid Construction and maintenance during the calendar year 1956, known as the Highway resolution, adopted November 17, 1955, and set forth in the Iowa County Board proceedings of 1955 on page 49, and also setting forth the procedure of selection and tenure of the Patrolman Superintendent.

WHEREAS, on November 17, 1955, Resolution No. 17—County Aid Construction and maintenance during the calendar year 1956, known as the Highway Resolution was adopted by the Iowa County Board of Supervisors, said resolution being set forth on page 49 of the printed proceedings of said Board for the year 1955, and

WHEREAS, Section VIII of said resolution provides as follows, to-wit:

"WHEREAS the County Highway Committee and County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of

carrying out the construction and maintenance of highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory and administrative duties.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Commissioner shall have authority to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate such personnel as he deems necessary for such purposes, provided, however, that the County Highway Committee may by action recorded in its minutes determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate any such person. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen, laborers, foremen, clerks, stenographers, or other employees necessary to carry on such activities."

WHEREAS, Section 83.01(4) of the Wisconsin Statutes for 1955 provides that the power to appoint assistants for the County Highway Commissioner is vested in the County Board, and

WHEREAS, the Attorney General of the State of Wisconsin has ruled on numerous occasions that this power may be delegated to the County Highway Commissioner or to the County Highway Committee or to both jointly, and

WHEREAS, it appears from said Resolution No. 17 that said Iowa County Board of Supervisors have delegated said power to the Highway Committee and Highway Commissioner jointly, and

WHEREAS, occasions frequently arise which make it wise and desirable that the County Board of Supervisors exercise power given it by Statute, one of said powers being set forth in Section 83.01(4) of the Wisconsin Statutes for 1955, and that said County Board of Supervisors not delegate all the authority so granted it under said Section of the Statute,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Section VII of Resolution No. 17, known as the Highway Resolution, said resolution being printed on page 49 of the Iowa County Board Proceedings of 1955 be amended to read as follows, to-wit:

WHEREAS the County Highway Committee and County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenance of highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory and administrative duties.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the County Highway Commissioner shall have authority to employ, discharge, suspend or reinstate such personnel as he shall deem necessary for such purposes, except that the Patrolman Superintendent shall be selected by the Iowa County Board of Supervisors, provided, however, that the Iowa County Highway Committee may by action recorded in its minutes determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend or reinstate any such person, except that said Committee shall exercise no such powers in regard to the Patrolman Superintendent, said powers over that position being vested in the Iowa County Board of Supervisors. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen except the Patrolman Superintendent, all laborers, foremen, clerks, stenographers, or other employees necessary to carry on such activities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Patrolman Superintendent shall be elected by the County Board of Supervisors at the same time as the County Highway Commissioner and for the same term.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Patrolman Superin-

tendent performs all duties required of him by the Highway Committee and Highway Commissioner.

SECTION IV. WHEREAS it appears that certain additional highway improvements in the county are necessary and warranted,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby appropriate the following sums for the purpose hereinafter set forth:

- (1) For the maintenance of the County Trunk Highway System and Matching Federal Aid Secondary Funds, Snow and Ice Control, the sum of One hundred seventy thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$170,-000.00).

- (6) For County Traffic Regulation Thirteen thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$13,000.00).

Total authorized in this section \$203,000.00.

SECTION V. WHEREAS appropriations are made herein, in addition to the amounts to be received from the state and available for work in the county under Section 20.420 of the Statutes,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby levy a tax on all of the property in the County to meet such appropriation as follows:

- (1) For County Aid under Section 83.14 as provided by Section III hereof the sum of Forty-seven thousand five hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$47,500.00).
- (2) For the various purposes as set forth in Section IV hereof the sum of Two hundred three thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$203,000.00).

WARNING: It is directed that provision for this levy shall be made in the county budget, but that this levy shall not be duplicated.

The County Clerk is directed to levy the special benefit assessments made herein as special charges against the respective municipalities as provided by law.

SECTION VI. WHEREAS the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefor,

BE IT RESOLVED that this board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the county budget, for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year.

SECTION VII. WHEREAS the exact amount of the funds that will become available from the state for highway purposes in the county under Section 20.420 of the Statutes will not be known until on or after June 30, 1957,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as hereinbefore authorized, from any funds in the county treasury that are not required for the purposes for which appropriated prior to August 1, 1957, and to reimburse such funds in the county treasury from the sums received under Section 20.420 of the Statutes.

SECTION VIII. WHEREAS the County Highway Committee and County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenance of highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory and administrative duties,

WHEREAS, it is deemed more expedient, workable and less costly to have the County Welfare Department furnish the services required by the Statute in relation to Juvenile investigation and supervision,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Iowa County Board of Supervisors that the Iowa County Welfare Department be authorized to provide the services necessary and required for investigation and supervision of cases in Juvenile matters for the Juvenile Court as set forth in Sections 48.06 and 48.22 of the Wisconsin Statutes for 1955.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of the Iowa County Welfare Department be authorized to obtain the necessary personnel to perform the services required by the Juvenile Court as set forth by Statute.

We, your Committee on Hospital and Home beg leave to report that on the 5th day of November, 1956, we examined the accounts of the Hospital and Home for the fiscal year ending June 3, 1956. The books of the Hospital and Home were checked and found in accordance with the County Clerks accounts. The report of the revenues received at the institutions for the Hospital and Home were compared with the receipts issued by the County Treasurer and found them also to be correct.

We wish to recommend that an appropriation of \$18,000.00 be made for the upkeep of the Home and care of the home inmates. We further recommend that an appropriation equal to the amount due the hospital fund for the care of county patients at the County Hospital at the rate of \$8.613 per week for 2557 patient weeks or a total of \$22,023.44 less collections for care of county patients amounting to \$4,184.65, be made. The total county appropriation for the County Hospital recommended by this committee is \$17,838.79. The anticipated state aids for the Hospital is \$127,775.08. The anticipated farm revenue is \$30,000.00. The total of the above mentioned appropriations and anticipated revenues will give the Iowa County Hospital a working fund of \$175,613.89 for the year 1957.

Sup. Grunow moved to recommend to the Public Property Committee in their final plan for offices in the Court House they give preference to the County Court Rooms as an eventual office for the County Clerk.

Sup. Bohan seconded the motion.

Sup. J. Harris moved to lay the previous motion on the table. Sup. E. Rowe seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. Hicks moved the Public Property Committee be allowed to purchase storage cabinets for the second floor of the Court House out of the regular Court House funds.

Sup. Brunker seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. E. Rowe moved the matter of an increase in Per Diem for County Board Supervisors be referred to the Committee on Bonds and Salaries and they make their report at this session of the Board.

Seconded and Carried.

Sup. Grunow moved to recess to 2:00 p.m. Seconded and Carried.

# 2:00 P.M. — January 15, 1957 —

Meeting called to order by the Chairman.

Report (No. 1) of the Budget and Finance Committee on the Public Hearing held at the Court House on the 10th day of December, 1956, relative to a Small Claims Court was read.

Dodgeville, Wisconsin January 15, 1957

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Gentlemen:

We, the Committee on Finance, Taxation & Budget respectfully submit the following relative to a report on the Small Claims Court:

That a public hearing was held at the Courthouse in the City of Dodgeville, Wisconsin, at 8:00 o'clock p.m., on the 10th day of December, 1956, and that on the 11th day of January, 1957, the said Committee met and recommended as follows:

On motion by Fred Grunow and seconded by Fred Bohan it was passed unanimously that the Finance, Taxation & Budget Committee recommend to the Iowa County Board of Supervisors that the Iowa County Board apply to the Legislature of the State of Wisconsin for an amendment to the Iowa County Court Act to provide for the following Small Claims Court feature of the present Iowa County Court Act:

- 1. That in all civil actions and proceedings where either at law or in equity, of every kind and nature, and in all special proceeding of every kind and nature, at law on contract where the debt or balance due or damage claimed in the complaint are less than the sum of \$500 the following forms, procedure, costs and fees may be used by the party or parties commencing such action or proceeding, it being the intent to provide within the County Court Act for Iowa County certain of the forms, proceedings, costs and fees similar to the small claims court provision in actions involving similar amounts.
- 2. The form of summons, warrants, writs, process, judgments, executions, or other documents or papers which shall be used under the provisions of the Iowa County Court Act, shall follow those which are now or may hereafter be prescribed by law for use in civil actions and proceedings, with such changes and additions as the judge of said

court, in his discretion, may deem necessary for use in actions commenced under the section involving amounts of less than \$500.

- 3. At the time of issuance of every summons and process in a proceeding not commenced by a summons, the plaintiff shall pay to the clerk of said court a docket fee of 25c, plus a state tax of 10 cents. When a summons is issued in blank to an attorney the docketing fee shall be paid before the summons may be served.
- The issuance of summons shall be in accordance with the provisions of Section 254.09 of the Small Claims Court Statute.
- 5. Every summons or other order or paper shall be made returnable not less than 6 nor more than 15 days from the date when it is served upon the defendant, if service is made other than by mail. If service is made by mail, the summons or other order or paper shall be made returnable not less than 8 nor more than 17 days from the date of mailing. If a summons is issued by an attorney, it shall be made returnable on such day of the week as shall be designated by the clerk of said court. If service is made by mailing, the clerk shall make the summons or other order or paper returnable at intervals throughout the hours of the day on the days specified, to the end that cases may be heard with as little delay as possible.
- Any summons or other legal process or paper shall be served in accordance with the provisions of Section 254.11 of Small Claims Court Statute.
- 7. Docketing of actions shall be in accordance with the provisions of Section 254.12 of Small Claims Court Statute.
- 8. Trial by court shall be in accordance with the provisions of Section 254.13 of Small Claims Court Statute.
- Trial by jury shall be in accordance with the terms and provisions of Section 254.14 of Small Claim Court Statute.
- 10. Before the entry of any money judgment or dismissal of any action in which a money judgment was sought otherwise than by agreement, the prevailing party shall pay, to the clerk, an additional fee as follows:

Before the entry or any judgment other than a money judgment, or the dismissal of any action other than by agreement, the prevailing party shall pay to the clerk such fees as are comparable to fees for money judgments when the value of the subject of the action is considered or 50 cents if no other fee is determinable.

All fees received by the clerk, other than garnishee tender fees, shall be paid monthly to the treasurer of the county, and shall be used to defray the expenses of said court. The amounts received by the clerk as state tax shall be paid, by the clerk, to the county treasurer to create a fund to be applied to the payment of the salary of said judge.

Except as may be otherwise specifically provided in this chapter, no party shall be taxed or required to pay any other or further costs or fees in any civil action or proceeding in said court.

11. The costs in every action and proceeding shall be in accord-

ance with the provisions of Section 254.16 of Small Claims Court Statute.

12. In the event actual service by mail is not made, then the provisions in Section 254.18 of Small Claims Court Statute shall apply.

This Committee further recommends unanimously that the above and foregoing sections of Small Claims Court Statute be incorporated into the Iowa County Court Act and that the proper legislative committee submit the same to the Wisconsin Legislature in the 1957 session for the necessary amendment to the Iowa County Court Act.

Our Disabled Aid case load continues about the same as Blind Aid. (4) cases were receiving Disabled Aid at the beginning of the year and (3) cases were receiving aid at the end of the period. The medical expense for this aid has been high as some of our cases reside at the hospitals and this does require more medical expense.

#### GENERAL INFORMATION

The aged, blind, disabled and families with dependent children who meet certain legal requirements and who have little or no means of support apply to the public welfare department for financial assistance. The amount of aid granted depends upon their living situation and resources available to them. Need is determined on the basis of a budget for which a fixed amount is allowed for food, clothing, personal, household, and school supplies. These amounts are set according to the number of persons in the family arrangement, age and activity. Shelter and fuel are determined at the actual cost and utilities according to the type, amount and current rates.

All income or resources evailable to the individual or family are deducted from the total budget needs. Assistance is granted on the difference between total budget needs and income. Checks are mailed at the first of each month.

All recipients of aid are entitled to medical care services which

are properly authorized by the department. Fee schedules for such medical services are used in determining the amount of payment.

The welfare department like many other county government services carries out its function through personal contacts with the public. Persons coming to the welfare department for help have experienced financial or personal difficulty and many are anxious and distressed. Prompt and courteous attention helps to put visitors at ease.

Many persons in the community are unfamiliar with the functions and operating procedures of a county welfare department. Therefore, careful interpretation of the agency program is essential to good public relations.

In conclusion, because of the fact that I am separating from this department, I wish to take this opportunity of expressing my appreciation to each member of the County Board of Supervisors and especially to my Advisory Committee for their fine cooperation during the past twenty-two years.
