# RULES FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE IOWA COUNTY BOARD

- Rule 1. The hour of meeting shall be 10:00 o'clock a.m. and 2 o'clock p.m., unless a different hour shall be prescribed.
- Rule 2. The Chairman shall call the meeting to order at the hour fixed for the meeting. (1) The Clerk shall call the roll of members and (2)) a majority being present, the journal of the preceding meeting shall be read, that any mistakes may be corrected, (3) Motions may be offered.
- Rule 3. The Chairman shall preserve order and decorum, and may speak to points of order in preference to other members.
- Rule 4. The Board shall elect at their annual April meeting a chairman and also a vice-chairman who shall act in the absence, disability, death or resignation of the chairman or request to act and possess powers of the Chairman.
- Rule 5. The Chairman with the assistance of the vice-chairman shall appoint all committees unless otherwise ordered.
- Rule 6. All questions shall be stated by the chair. If the Chairman doubts as to the voice of the majority he or any member of the Board may call for a vote by either roll call or rising vote on the question to be decided.
- Rule 7. The following standing committees shall be appointed: Committee on Claims, Committee on Equalization, Committee on Treasurer's, Clerk's, and Highway Accounts, Committee on Finance, Taxation and Budget, Committee on Hospital and Home, Committee on Resolutions from without the County, Committee on Tax Claims. Committee on Eonds and Salaries, Committee on Register of Deeds, Clerk of Court and District Attorney Accounts, Committee on Public Property, Committee on Publishing and Printing, Committee on County Highway, Superintendent of Schools Committee, Committee on Agriculture, Committee on Personnel and Sheriff's Committee. The size of committees shall be limited to not less than three nor more than five members.
- Rule 8. After the journal shall have been read the order of business shall be as follows: 1. Letters, Petitions, Remonstrations, Communications and Accompanying Documents. 2. Resolutions. 3. Reports of committee, first standing and afterwards, special committees. 4. Miscellaneous business.
- Rule 9. Every member present shall vote unless excused by the Chairman.
- Rule 10. Every vote taken in regard to levying taxes, appropriating money, or dividing or altering the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be taken by Yeas and Nays, and the same shall be entered on the journal.
- Rule 11. The Yeas and Nays on any question shall be entered on the journal at the request of one of the members present.

- 12. No petitions, resolutions or motions having for its object the division or alteration of the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be entered on or considered at the same session of the Board at which it was introduced, but the same shall lie over for consideration at the next regular adjourned or special session of the Board.
- Rule 13. No mention, other than the receiving of petitions, remonstrations, communications, claims, and the reference of the same to appropriate Committees or to adjourn shall be acted upon in the absence of any committee in the regular discharge of their duty unless such motion had been made at a previous meeting and a special assignment had for its consideration.
- Rule 14. No report or resolution appropriating any money shall be acted upon until the next day after presentation without permission of a majority of the members elected.
- Rule 15. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern in all cases where they are applicable.
- Rule 16. Any of the foregoing rules, except Rules 10 and 12 may be rescinded, changed or suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- Rule 17. Rules Nos. 10 and 12 may be rescinded, altered or suspended by a two-thirds vote of all the members entitled to seats on the County Board.
- Rule 18. The Committee on Equalization shall render their report immediately after roll call on the first day of the session but said report shall not be acted upon on the day which it is presented.
- Rule 19. The Chairman shall appoint two or more members of the Board, who shall visit the County Hospital and Home any time within one month after their appointment and file their written report as to the condition found after their visit. And for each succeeding month thereafter, a like committe shall be appointed whose duties shall be the same as the first committee, but no member shall be appointed on such committee oftener than once in twelve months, the compensation to be \$5.00 per visit in full for said trip.
- Rule 20. No informal ballot cast by this Board shall be declared a formal ballot. In no case shall any official be elected by this Board by casting a unanimous vote in favor of any candidate or nominee.
- Rule 21. The Board shall meet in regular session on the third Tuesday of January of each year.
- Rule 22. All officers elected by the County Board except those elected at the April session, shall be nominated and all nominations lay over to the following day before they are voted on.

# DUTIES OF COMMITTIEES

# Duties of the County Highway Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. The County Highway Committee shall have supervision over the maintenance and construction of all road and bridges as provided by the statutes and shall submit to the County Board an annual report including the report of the County Highway Committee of all receipts and expenditures in the County Highway Department and shall submit an annual budget and recommendations for the tax levy for road and bridge purposes to the County Board at the annual session and any other duties as outlined in the statutes or as directed by County Board Action.
- The County Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the Iowa County Traffic Department.
- 3. The Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the operation of the County Ambulance.

# Duties of the Sheriff's Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- The Sheriff's Committee shall examine all accounts and claims filed against the County by the Sheriff and his deputies, and make report to the County Board at each regular meeting thereof.
- The Sheriff's Committee shall also have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the county police radio system, and shall act upon such other matters as may be referred to it by the County Board.

### Duties of the Resolution Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To receive and examine all resolutions from without the County and make report thereof to the County Board.

# Duties of the General Claims Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To audit, allow or disallow all claims filed in the office of the County Clerk or referred to the committee, and shall file a schedule of such claims allowed, with the County Clerk, for payment and shall make a report to the County Board of all claims audited.

# Duties of the Equalization Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To have supervision over and make an equalization of the assessments on all property in the county for taxes between the several towns, villages and cities of the county.
- It shall be the duty of this committee to make a detailed report thereof at the annual session of the board.
- 3. This committee shall meet annually with the Supervisor of Assessments and County Assessors at their spring meeting.

## **Duties of the Tax Claims Committee**

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To consider, examine and report to the county board, its findings in all matters of illegal assessments, tax titles and delinquent lands that may come before the board for action.
- To supervise all delinquent taxes returned to the County, supervise the taking of tax deeds, supervise the sale of real estate

taken on tax deed to the end that property is returned to the tax roll and aid in the collection of delinquent taxes. Where the value of the property involved warrants it the Committee shall have the power to appraise the property and in its descretion insure it for the benefit of the County.

- To make appraisals pursuant to Chapter 75.69 of the county owned tax deed lands.
- 4. To sell and dispose to the best interests of the county those lands to which the county has taken tax deeds.
- 5. To employ the services of the county surveyor to establish the location of county owned property when necessary.
- 6. To authorize and recommend the county treasurer at their descretion to assign to heirs, mortgagees or adjacent property owners, tax certificates purchased by the county at the annual sale of tax certificates.

# Duties of the Welfare Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To have charge of all matters arising from the care of the poor, and incidental matters and claims for the support and care of the indigent and poor.
- To act in an advisory capacity with the Director of Pensions and Relief when necessary.
- (See Resolution (No. 38) combining two committees dated at Dodgeville, Wisconsin, November 14, 1935.

Also ordinance (No. 6) passed in the County Board Sessions of 1941).

# **Duties of the Finance Committee**

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To prepare and present to the County Board at the Annual Session the Eudget and Tax Levy; first in a temporary form, and finally in a complete form as changed during the County Board Session.
- To report upon all resolutions and petitions for appropriations presented to the Board.
- 3. To report and make recommendations on the finances of the County from time to time when required.

### Duties of the Bonds and Salaries Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To recommend to the County Board the compensation of County officers and employees.
- To determine the amount of Bonds to be furnished by the County officers to the County and to report on the sufficiency of such bonds.
- To designate and report to the County Board the Banks of Towa County that may apply as a depository for county funds.

# Duties of Agricultural Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

 To perform all duties prescribed by law as further instructed by the County Board.

According to the Statutes the personnel of the County Agriculturual Committee shall consist of the Chairman of the County Board, the Superintendent of Schools and three men actually engaged in farming, one of whom must be a member of the County Board.

The general duty of the Committee is to protect and enhancs the financial interest of the county in all things agricultural.

This committee, working in conjunction with state and federal authorities shall according to statute, enter into, consumate and cancel contracts with all extension workers and be the authority in the matter of policy of the extension office.

This committee shall bring before the proper committee requests for appropriations for fiscal years, listing the salaries and estimated expense of each department of extension work.

The agricultural committee shall examine and approve all claims filed against Iowa County by the Extension Department.

The Agricultural Committee has in the past requested the assistance of agricultural leaders of the county in the formation of an agricultural program for the year. This privilege is to continue.

When a county becomes a soil conservation district, the agricultural committee automatically becomes supervisor of said district and must sign all contracts with those who enter into soil conservation contracts.

The Agricultural Committee shall act in an advisory capacity on all agricultural appropriations unless otherwise instructed by the County Board.

# **Duties of Personnel Committee**

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To set the policy of each department when not in conflict with the Statutes or when called upon for this purpose, also to designate the duties and responsibilities of the different offices.
- To hear and consider grievances reported by county departments, county officers and county employees and to make their recommendations to the County Board.
- All matters pertaining to clerk hire, working hours and conditions, departmental problems or questions shall be referred to this committee.
  - 4. To meet annually not later than October 15 of each year.

Duties of Committee on Clerk's, Treasurer's and Highway Accounts It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To meet with the State Auditors to study and examine the report on the accounts of the County Clerk, County Treasurer and Highway Department, and to make a report to the County Board.
- 2. To audit the Accounts of the Justices of Iowa County as provided by the Wisconsin Statutes.
- 3. To approve the reports of the County Clerk and County Treasurer before being presented to the County Board.

# Duties of Committee on District Attorney, Register of Deeds and Clerk of Courts Accounts

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To approve the reports of the District Attorney, Register of Deeds and Clerk of Courts.

# **Duties of Public Property Committee**

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To supervise and have charge of the Court House, County Jail and the grounds of these buildings and the Gov. Dodge home site.
  - 2. To keep in repair and good condition these properties.
- 2. In order to maintain uniformity of equipment, the Public Property Committee shall purchase the equipment for all the offices in the Court House with the following exceptions — no office equip-

ment shall be purchased for the County Agent's office, Welfare office or Highway Department, except when such purchases are made from the General Fund.

4. This Committee shall function during the year and when the County Board is not in session.

# Duties of County Superintendent of Schools Committee It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To act as an advisory committee on all matters pertaining to the office of the County Superintendent of Schools, excepting those duties governed by statute.
- To check the superintendent's accounts and make recommendations to the board in matters of expense and appropriation.

# Duties of the Committee on County Hospital and Home It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To examine the accounts of the Hospital and Home.
- To compare the vouchers as filed with the County Clerk with the records of the institutions and to compare the revenues received at the Hospital and Home with the receipts issued by the County Treasurer.
- 3. To act as an advisory committee with the Board of Trustees in the maintenance, repairs and construction of buildings.
- 4. To report to the County Doard, but in no way interfere with the management of the Hospital and Home by the Board of Trustees as established by law.

# Duties of the Printing Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To accept bids on the printing of the County Board Proceedings, stationery ,envelopes for county officers and Court Calendars.
- To act on all matters of printing referred to them by the County Board.

## **Duties of Conservation Committee**

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To audit the accounts of any money appropriated by the County Board for conservation work.
- To supervise the purchase of equipment and supplies in which the money appropriated by the County Board is used.

# **Duties of Highway Study Committee**

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To receive all petitions referred to it by the County Board, by the regular highway committee and any citizen group relating to the construction, relocation, maintenance and repairs of any Federal State or County road in the county and report their recommendations to the next meeting of the County Board.
- To confer with the regular Highway Committee on all allocations and grants of Federal and State funds and on any other highway matters of major importance.
  - 3. This committee is merely advisory.

# Duties of the Health Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To act in an advisory capacity with the County Nurse on all types of health programs.
- 2. Annually plan and recommend the budget for the health program.

# RESOLUTION NO. 5 MILL CREEK WATERSHED OF IOWA COUNTY

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin Gentlemen:

Whereas, the County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, recognize that flood water, erosion, and sediment damage is severe in the Mill Creek Watershed in Iowa County, and

Whereas, the Supervisors of the Iowa County Soil Conservation District and the Directors of the Mill Creek Watershed Association are making application for surveys, plans, and financial assistance under the provisions of Public Law 566, 83rd Congress, as amended,

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County agree to be responsible for the maintenance of any structures installed in Iowa County in the Mill Creek Watershed under the provision of Public Law 566, except

That the County Board of Supervisors will not be held responsible

for major repairs needed as a result of damage caused by storms of greater rainfall than for which the structures were designed. Maintenance will include an inspection with the District Supervisors annually and after every major flood, keeping vegetation and rodents under control on any earth fill, and regulate grazing in structure areas.

Resolution (No. 15), a copy of Resolution No. 25 of the February, 1959 session was read.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Iowa County: Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Highway Department employees of Local 1266, petitioned the Highway Committee and County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County for additions and amendments to the wages, hours and fringe benefit policy now enjoyed by the highway employees, and,

WHEREAS, the officers of the highway employees Local 1266 and their legal advisor met with the Highway Committee on January 13th, 1959 on the petition as filed with the county committees, which is as follows:

- That all hourly paid employees be granted a ten (10c) cent per hour wage increase and that monthly paid employees be granted a proportional increase in monthly pay.
- 2. That all employees be granted one week vacation with full pay after one year of service and two (2) weeks vacation with full pay after three (3) years of service.
- 3. That all employees be granted "Good Friday" afternoon off with no loss of pay.
- That sick leave be granted at the rate of one day per month of service for twelve (12 days per year accumulative to forty-five (45) days.
- That employees be paid for one-half of travel time, this to be accomplished by the employees traveling to the job on his own time and from the job on county time.

WHEREAS, the undersigned committee made a careful study of the wages, hours and fringe benefit policy enjoyed by highway employees in other counties in the State of Wisconsin which are comparable to Iowa County, and we feel that the hours and fringe benefits should be made more uniform to conform with the average standards of Division No. 1, and standards adopted by the County Board of Supervisors,

THEREFORE, we, the undersigned committee recommend to the Iowa County Board of Supervisors that the highway employees be granted the following hour and fringe benefits:

- 1-No action taken.
- 2—That employees be granted one week vacation with full pay after one year of continuous service and two (2) weeks of vacation with full pay after three (3) years of continuous service.
- 3—Sick leave one-half (1/2) day per month to accumulate to a maximum of 60 days.
  - 4—That one-half (1/2) day be granted for worship on Good Friday.
- 5—That highway employees be granted not to exceed one-half (½) hour each day traveling time from the job, wherever the project may be located in the county.

WHEREAS, the undersigned committee have made a survey of salaries paid highway clerks and their assistants in other counties in Division 1, we find that the salary in Iowa County is the lowest in the Division.

### CIVIL DEFENSE REPORT

November 9, 1959

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Iowa County; Gentlemen:

We, your Civil Defense Committee and County Coordinator report on the activities for the period from December 1958 to November, 1959.

During the winter months a total of 116 persons completed the First Aid Course. These first aid classes were held at Hollandale, Dodgeville, Cobb, Mineral Point, Avoca, Linden, Barneveld and Arena. The Dodgeville class was instructed by Mr. Schmoekel and Mr. Eichorst of Dodgeville. The other seven classes were instructed by members of the Mineral Point Fire Department under the supervision of H. J. Maynard, Iowa County First Aid Chairman.

The Iowa County Medical Association recommended Dr. E. J. Hohler, Mineral Point as County Civil Defense Medical Officer. He was appointed in April, 1959.

Several joint meetings of the Civil Defense Committee and the Sheriff's Committee were held in Dodgeville during June and July to discuss ways and means of obtaining a new county wide communication system. Representatives from radio manufacturers appeared before the committee. Finally the services of Douglas Lewis, a communication expert from the Madison Police and Sheriff's Department was obtained. Through his advice the committees voted to install a new system which would conform to the latest Federal regulations. This equipment was to be purchased through the Civil Defense, under which the Federal government would appropriate matching funds.

Mr. Lewis assisted the committees in making application for the Federal Aid and also gave valuable advice as to the equipment to order. It was voted by the joint committee to apply for Federal Aid, known as matching funds in the amount of \$4,100.05. This application for Federal Aid was approved by N. A. Blum, State Director of Communications and by Ralph J. Olson, State Director of Civil Defense.

The application was made June 30, 1959 and was approved by the Regional Director, Paul K. McDonald on September 8, 1959. The amount of aid will be \$4100.05 for the system. The equipment is on order at this time.

Periodic inspections were made of the 200 bed emergency hospital unit as well as of other equipment at the Iowa County Shop, General Hospital and St. Joseph's Hospital. The required reports of these inspections were sent to the state office of Civil Defense according to regulations.

New organization plans have been made by the State Department of Civil Defense regarding this District. Dodgeville will become one of the key cities for the southwest exacuation region. The supply depot for the entire southwest section of the state will be located here. This means that all supplies for five counties in the evacuation area will be stored here as well as for the some 150,000 evacuees who will come from Madison and Dane County, a target area, in case of an emergency.

# COUNTY AID CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1960

SECTION I. The County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the county for highway work in the year 1960 under the provisions of Section 20.420 and Chapter 83 of the Statutes and the additional sums herein appropriated shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

SECTION II. COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENT. WHEREAS the State Highway Commission has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be One Hundred eighty-four thousand five hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$184,500.00) will become

available at the end of the fiscal year under the provisions of Sections 83.10 and 20.420(83) and (84) of the Statutes, for the county trunk highway system in the county, but the actual amount will not be known until the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1960.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the said sum to the extent required to match and supplement Federal aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any Federal projects located on the county trunk highway system in said county, which are not recovered from Federal funds, and to expend any balance for constructing, repairing, and maintaining such county trunk highway system and the bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 83.10(1) of the Statutes, and to reimburse the general fund for any expenditures that may be made therefrom pursuant to Section 83.01(6) of the Statutes.

SECTION III. WHEREAS it appears that certain additional highway improvements in the county are necessary and warranted,

- (1) For the maintenance of the County Trunk Highway System and matching Federal Aid Secondary Funds, Snow and Ice Removal the sum of One Hundred eighty-thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$180,000.00).
- (2) For emergency road or bridge repairs or construction, the necessity for which is determined by the County Highway Committee and for which other funds are not available, the sum of Fifteen Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$15,000.00).
- (3) For the purchase of machinery not to exceed \$100,000.00 and for machinery repairs the sum Received from Machinery Rentals.
- (4) For the purchase of county gravel pits and stone quarries the sum Received from Sale of Materials.
- (5) For administration, including salaries, per diem, office and travel expense of the County Highway Committee, the County Highway Commissioner, his clerks and assistants not paid from construction or maintenance funds, the sum of Thirteen thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$13,000.00).
- (6) For County Traffic Regulation the sum of Fourteen Thousand five-hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$14,500.00).

Total Authorized by this Section \$222,500.00.

The County Clerk is directed to levy the special benefit assessments made herein as special charges against the respective municipalities as provided by law.

SECTION IV. WHEREAS the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefor,

BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the county budget, for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year.

SECTION V. WHEREAS the exact amount of the funds that will become available from the state for highway purposes in the county under Section 20.420 of the Statutes will not be known until on or after June 30, 1960,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby authorzed and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as hereinbefore authorized, from any funds in the county treasury that are not required for the purposes for which appropriated prior to August 1, 1960, and to reimburse such funds in the county treasury from the sums received under Section 20.420 of the Statutes.

SECTION VI. WHEREAS the County Highway Committee and County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenance of highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory and administrative duties,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Commissioner shall have authority to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate such personnel as he deems necessary for such purposes, provided, however, that the County Highway Committee may by action recorded in its minutes determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate any such person. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen, laborers, foremen, clerks, stenographers, or other employees necessary to carry on such activities.

## RESOLUTION NO. 23

To the Honorable County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, There is an increasing relief burden due to the fact

that able-bodied men are now receiving General Relief due to increasing seasonal unemployment, and

WHEREAS, It is considered advisable both financially to the county and best interest of the individual that work is provided whenever possible, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED By the Iowa County Board of Supervisors pursuant to Section 49.05 of the Wisconsin Statutes, that the Welfare Department be authorized to establish and maintain a work relief project for the benefit of the county wherever and whenever advisable according to the following conditions:

- Recipient's eligibility and estimated number of hours of work necessary to meet recipient's budget requirements to be determined by the Welfare Director.
- Liability Insurance and Workmen's Compensation to be supplied from the county General Fund in the same manner as all other departments.
- Any special problems of transportation, clothing, gas, physical condition, etc. will be determined by the Welfare Department.
- 4. Transportation of crews will be decided on the basis of situations existing. If gas is not furnished to the driver of the car, transporting the workers to the job, if practical, a county vehicle could possibly be rented from the Iowa County Highway Commission.
- 5. Wages to be set at 80c an hour. The foreman's wages to be determined by the Iowa County Welfare Board. The cost of the foreman to be paid from the General Fund.
- 6. A foreman shall be supplied by the Department for which the work program is instituted and his salary paid by that Department. The foreman need not be on relief in order to qualify for this position.
- 7. This Work Relief Project to be set up when there are 7 to 10 able-bodied men available and eligible for such work.
- 8. In case work can be done for other county Departments and for cities, villages and townships, in Iowa County, the conditions noted above will apply with the respective department head, city ward chairmen, village and town clerks or their respective committee chairmen having this responsibility.
- 9. In the event a township or city requests work relief personnel for a township or city project, that municipality shall repay the county the prevailing wages of the personnel on the Work Relief Project. The Iowa County Welfare Department shall submit an itemized statement of hours worked by Work Relief personnel to the Township or City upon completion of the Work Project.

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Resolution (No. 24) relative to amending the state law for a more equitable distribution of Federal Aid Funds on Social Security Aids was read.

## RESOLUTION NO. 24

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Iowa County: Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, In 1958 Congress again changed the federal aid formula for recipients of Old Age Assistance grants by raising the maxi-

mum amounts subject to federal matching by increasing the federal share of assistance payments and by providing that the reimbursement would be made on the basis of "state-wide" overall caseload average costs including both the regular grants (money payment to recipients) and vendor payments for medical care (direct payments to doctor, hospital, etc.) rather than the former separate payment formulas for money grants and vendor payments on an individual case by case basis, and

WHEREAS, Present Wisconsin state aid laws which have not been revised since the new federal aid formula have the effect of retaining approximately 75% of these increased funds at the state level of government with the counties sharing in only the remaining 25% as evidenced by the following table:

WHEREAS, A study of the effect of this federal formula change shows that in order to hold the same relative position in the sharing of Old Age Assistance costs between the state and counties that existed prior to October 1, 1958 (the effective date of the new federal difformula) approximately \$1,500,000 additional portion of the new federal aid received by the state should be apportioned to counties. annually, and

WHEREAS, This can best be accomplished by changing the state aid formula for medical care costs of the aged (vendor's payments) so as to provide that the counties and the state share 50-50 in these costs "after" applying the federal aid received by the counties for this purpose (now state 35% - counties 65%), and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That Iowa County in the interest of securing a more equitable share of the increased federal aid for the cost of care of the aged and in the interest of reducing the real estate taxes required to finance the county share of these programs respectfully solicit the support of the legislature to amend the state law so as to provide 50-50 sharing of the medical care costs of the aged "After" the application of federal aid instead of the present 35% state - 65% county basis, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be sent to the Honorable Senator Robert S. Travis, the Honorable Assemblyman, Walter B. Calvert and to A. J. Thelen, Secretary of the County Boards Association.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Iowa County Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, The Iowa County Public Welfare Department has for a number of years handled hospital equipment (wheel chairs, crutches, hospital beds) purchased through the sales of magazine subscriptions by Veterans Organizations of Iowa County, and

WHEREAS, The handling of this hospital equipment, by the Welfare Department, was considered to be a public health service, the Wisconsin State Department of Public Welfare, Division of Public Assistance, stated in the 1957 Administrative Review of the Welfare Department that the responsibility for this project might be more appropriately handled by the Veterans Service Officer, and since in the annual time study, the question of reimbursement of administrative time spent on handling these health appliances has raised, and

WHEREAS, It would appear that the handling of such hospital equipment is more of a health than a welfare matter, that perhaps the Iowa County Nurse might more appropriately handle it,

Pertaining to the amending of Ordinance No. 6 to bring the Ordinance of the Iowa County Public Welfare Department in line with services already being renderd but which are not now contained in the agency's Ordinance under the Wisconsin Statutes 46.22,

WHEREAS, The State Department of Public Welfare has recommended to the Iowa County Director of Public Welfare that it is necessary that the Iowa County Public Welfare Department add to the agency's present Ordinance, the following sections, subsections 5 (a), 5 (a) (2) (c), and 5 (a) (2) (e) of Section 46.22 of the Wisconsin Statutes of 1957,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That we, the Welfare Board of the Iowa County Public Welfare Department, recommend the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Iowa adopt the following Ordinance, to-wit:

#### ORDINANCE NO. 6

An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 6 of Iowa County, Wisconsin. The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Iowa do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Iowa County Ordinance No. 6 is amended to read:

WHEREAS, The Iowa County Public Welfare Department is now administering Aid to the Blind, Aid to Dependent Children, Old Age Assistance, Aid to Totally and Permanently Disabled Persons and General Relief in Iowa County, and

WHEREAS, Sections 46.22 Statutes, created by Chapter 513, Laws of 1953 (effective January 1, 1954) establishes a County Department of Public Welfare in such county consisting of a County Board of Public Welfare, a County Director of Public Welfare and necessary personnel in such county, and

WHEREAS, Such County Department of Public Welfare has the

mandatory functions, duties, and powers specified by Section 46.22(4) Statutes,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Iowa County Board of Supervisors that the County Board of Public Welfare shall consist of three residents of Iowa County. The members of such County Board of Public Welfare shall be elected, by the County Board of Supervisors from its own body, one from a Village, one from a Township, one from a City. The members of the County Board of Public Welfare shall hold office for a term of one year. The compensation of such members shall be pre diem plus mileage,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the County Department of Public Welfare shall have the following functions, duties and powers in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the State Department of Public Welfare and subject to the supervision of said State Department of Public Welfare:

- (1) To administer Aid to Needy Blind under S. 49.18.
- (2) To administer Aid to Dependent Children under S. 49.19.
- (3) To administer Old Age Assistance under SS 49.20 to 49.38.
- (4) To administer Aid to Totally and Permanently Disabled persons under S. 49.61.
- (5) To maintain administrative and reporting relationships with all pertinent state departments.
- (6) To make investigations which relate to welfare services upon request by the State Department of Public Welfare.
- (7) To administer relief to needy Indians under S. 49.046 when appointed by the department under such section. Also, under section 46.22 (5):
  - (1) Administer Relief under SS 49.02 and 49.03.
- (2) To make certification or referral of eligibles for state and federal works or other assistance programs, eligibility for which is based on need, when designated to perform such certification or referral services, and to certify eligibility for and distribute surplus commodities and foodstuffs. (Resolution No. 4 adopted by the County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County at their April 1958 session regarding surplus commodities.)
- (3) To perform the duties and functions of a juvenile probation department as defined in S. 48.08 when requested to do so by the juvenile judge of the county.
- (4) To administer Child Welfare services including services to children who are mentally defective, dependent, neglected, delinquent, or illegitimate, and to other children who are in need of such services.
- (5) To make investigations in co-operation with the Court, institution superintendent, district attorney, and other agencies and officials operating in the welfare field regarding admissions to and release (or conditional release) from the following county and state institutions:
  - (a) County institutions, County Hospital and Home.
- (b) State institutions, Mendota State Hospital, Winnebago State Hospital, Wisconsin Orthopedic Hospital for children, Southern Colony and Training School, Central Colony and Training School, Northern Colony and Training School, Central State Hospital, Wisconsin School for Boys, and Wisconsin School for Girls, Wisconsin General Hospital.
- (6) Make investigations which are provided for under S. 48.88(2) (a), if the court having jurisdiction so directs.
- (7) To furnish services to families or persons other than the granting of financial or material aid where such services may prevent such families or persons from becoming public charges or restore them to a condition of self-support.
  - (8) To participate in a Civil Defense program under Section

21.02 (3) (e) Wisconsin Statutes. (Ordinance No. 8 adopted by the Iowa County Board of Supervisors at their April 1957 session to provide authorization for the Iowa County Public Welfare Department to participate in a Civil Defense program.)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT:

- (1) The official name of the County Department of Public Welfare shall be "Iowa County Public Welfare Department."
- (2) Any provision of any prior ordinance, resolution or action of this County Board of Supervisors in conflict with any provision of this ordinance is to the extent of such conflict superseded by the provisions of this ordinance.
- (3) Such merit system status as the County Director or any employees of the Iowa County Public Welfare Department may have on the effective date of this ordinance shall not be deemed changed or interrupted by the provisions thereof.
- (4) The County Clerk is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this ordinance to the State Department of Public Welfare.

SECTION 2. Effective date.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after January 1, 1960.

To the Honorable Chairman and Members of the Iowa County Board

of Supervisors:

We, the undersigned members of the Iowa County Board of Public Welfare, hereby request the Iowa County Board of Supervisors to adopt at their regular November, 1959, session the following resolution, to-wit:

## RESOLUTION NO. 46

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Board of Supervisors at its regular November, 1958, session adopted Resolution No. 65 of said session pertaining to the creation of the position of Assistant District Attorney and assigning said office to the Iowa County Public Welfare Department effective January 1, 1959, and

WHEREAS, said position has been approved by the State Department of Public Welfare and reimbursement is now being received from the Federal and State Government toward the salary of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars paid as salary for said position, pursuant to Resolution No. 65 above described, said reimbursement being the same as for other members of Public Welfare staff, and

WHEREAS, it now appears that it is feasible to put said position on a permanent status under the control of and subject only to termination by the County Board of Supervisors, and,

WHEREAS, the position of Assistant District Attorney created

by the aforementioned resolution and subject to Section 59.45 of the Wisconsin Statutes cannot be made permanent, said position under said statute being subject in part to the control of the District Attorney, and also subject to change with the election of a new District Attorney, and

WHEREAS, it appears that pursuant to Section 59.07(44) of the Wisconsin Statutes that the Iowa County Board of Supervisors may appoint a corporation counsel and that said position is solely under the control of the County Board of Supervisors, and that said office under said Section of the Statutes can be permanent subject to termination by the County Board, and

WHEREAS, it appears that the position of corporation counsel can fill the duties presently assigned to the position of Assistant District Attorney, and others if so desired by the County Board, and it further appearing that the State Department has no preference or objection as to which section of the Statutes is followed by the County Board of Supervisors,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the position of Corporation Counsel be and the same is hereby created pursuant to Section 59.07(44) of the Wisconsin Statutes, effective January 6, 1960.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That said office of Corporation Counsel be and the same is hereby assigned to the Iowa County Public Welfare Department; that the hiring of the person to fill said position be under the direction of the Iowa County Board of Public Welfare and the Director of the Iowa County Public Welfare Department and subject to the approval of the Iowa County Board of Supervisors.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the person hired be under the direction and supervision of the Director of Public Welfare to render services as a staff member; that in said capacity he be required to serve a minimum of two days per weeks or its equivalent; and that the salary for said position be fixed at a minimum of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars per annum to be paid from the administration account of the Iowa County Public Welfare Department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the duties of the Corporation Counsel shall be as follows: (The duties will include but not be limited by this designation)

Act as legal adviser and do legal work for the Public Welfare Agency.

Enforce and collect old age assistance liens.

Process and collect general relief claims, including actions and claims against other counties.

Assist agency in follow-up on relative responsibility cases and do preliminary work on cases to be referred to the District Attorney.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the position of Assistant District Attorney created by Resolution No. 65 of the regular November, 1958 session of the Iowa County Board of Supervisors be and the same is hereby abolished effective January 6, 1960."

Report (No. 14) of the Iowa County Sheriff giving a summary of Jail and Sheriff's department activities for 1959 was read.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors for Iowa County, Wisconsin: I, Ray M. Reese, hereby respectfully submit the following summary of Jail and Sheriff's Department activities during 1959.

On January 5, 1959, we took office in the old jail quarters, adjacent to the Court House. We have been busy ever since. On December

3, 1959, we moved into the new jail building on North Bequette street, where we have been adjusting to new situations up until the present time. The new jail is so much different from the old jail in every way.

The prisoners are locked in separate cells at 10 p.m. each night until they are released for breakfast the following morning. The prisoners in the main cell block are fed from the kitchen where the food is passed through a small door. The Juvenile section and female areas are not adjacent to the kitchen. As soon as the meal is over the dishes are returned to the kitchen where they are washed and stored away. It is deemed best to wash the jail dishes in the kitchen as the prisoners do not clean them thoroughly.

We have had 198 prisoners at the Jail during 1959 to whom we have furnished 2,750 meals. This figure does not include Juveniles nor female prisoners or Juvenile prisoners kept at other Jails pending completion of the new jail.

We have had several prisoners working out under the Huber law, wherein, men go to their jobs each morning and return to the jail each night. In most cases this has worked out with a good measure of success.

We have new two way radio equipment at the new location which is working very well. We are in contact with all communities within a radius of 75 miles.

The county emergency vehicle is kept at the Dodgeville fire station and is manned by volunteers of the fire department, who have been trained in the administration of first aid, has had a busy year.

I commend these men who drop whatever they are doing to take the vehicle out anytime, twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. I think it should be pointed out that this is an emergency service only. The crew should not be called out to perform work which should be turned over to private ambulance owners. If, however, an emergency does exist, this service is quickly available by calling the Sheriff's department at Dodgeville, Telephone No. 5561.

#### OLD AGE ASSISTANCE

This continues to be our largest program and the most expensive. This is due, to a large part, for the need for regular and prolonged medical care. While it is necessary, the fact remans that it is expensive.

In 1959 cash payments were made to an average of 291 persons per month. The average age of Old Age recipients is becoming higher. This means that they are in need of a considerable amount of medical care; such as hospitalization, nursing home care, physicians services, drugs, dental care, etc. As the cost of this care increased, the assistance payments are bound to rise.

#### AID TO TOTALLY AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED

According to the now more liberalized definition of a disabled person, as acted upon by the 1959 Wisconsin State Legislature. "a totally and permanently disabled person, is a person who has a medically demonstrable impairment, which is permanent and which prevents such person from engaging in a useful occupation within his competence."

Thus, due to this more liberal interpretation of a disabled person, the number of recipients receiving this form of aid is on the increase. Several General Relief cases have qualified, due to physical disability, for an Aid to Disabled grant. The number of cases added, while small in number, is on the increase. It is anticipated that even more cases will be added to this program in 1960. The agency is continuing to screen the General Relief caseload for possible cases to be referred to this form of aid.

Th average caseload in 1959 was 3 cases per month, an increase of 1 case per month, over 1958. There were two cases added in January 1960, thus, the Disabled Aid caseload is now five.

#### GENERAL RELIEF

The costs for General Relief in Iowa County have continued to be high. The lack of employment opportunities, seasonal farm layoffs and the weather, has caused an influx of relief recipients. The agency has continued to make every effort to get the able-bodied men on jobs.

At the November 1959 session of the Iowa County Board of Supervisors, a County Work Relief Project was approved. It is hoped by the able-bodied recipients having to work for the relief orders grant-

ed, that the number of such needy individuals will decrease. With the increase in employment, and having to work for relief, the possibilities are good, that this agency will have less such cases in the future.

The County Welfare Board at their January 1959 monthly meeting approved reducing the food allowances for General Relief recipients by 25%, from the allowances made for social security aids recipients. In adult only cases, this was not done, however. This usually only affected the larger General Relief families.

Due to the high medical costs, in a few General Relief cases, and the cost of care for those with legal settlement in Iowa County, who live in other counties, the relief costs have been higher in 1959 than in 1958. The increased cost for General Relief has been the trend state-wide.

The General Relief caseload of Iowa County is not large. Thus, a few cases added or a few cases less will cause the figures to show a considerable percentage change. As one can see, the percentage change from 1958 to 1959 would seem greater than they actually are in terms of the number of cases involved and in the expenditure of money.

# AGENCY ADMINISTRATION

The cost of administration is the expense of operating the Lowa County Public Welfare Department. This includes the salaries paid to the eight employees, per diem and travel of the three County Welfare Board members, expense of necessary travel by staff members, to carry out the functions of the agency and the office maintenance expenses.

Since the reports on administration from the State Department are always two months in arrears, we are reporting the amount of expenditures for the entire year of 1959. However, we are estimating the reimbursement from the State and Federal Government for November and December, 1959.
