SESSIONS of 1960

RULES FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE IOWA COUNTY BOARD

- Rule 1. The hour of meeting shall be 10:00 o'clock a.m. and 2 o'clock p.m., unless a different hour shall be prescribed.
- Rule 2. The Chairman shall call the meeting to order at the hour fixed for the meeting. (1) The Clerk shall call the roll of members and (2)) a majority being present, the journal of the preceding meeting shall be read, that any mistakes may be corrected, (3) Mojons may be offered.
- Rule 3. The Chairman shall preserve order and decorum, and may speak to points of order in preference to other members.
- Rule 4. The Board shall elect at their annual April meeting a chairman and also a vice-chairman who shall act in the absence, disability, death or resignation of the chairman or request to act and possess powers of the Chairman.
- Rule. 5. The Chairman, Vice-Chairman and a committee of three members of the board's selection be elected for the purpose of appointing committees and this committee of three will act as a committee on committees.
- Rule 6. All questions shall be stated by the chair. If the Chairman doubts as to the voice of the majority he or any member of the Board may call for a vote by either roll call or rising vote on the question to be decided.
- Rule 7. The following standing committees shall be appointed: Committee on Claims, Committee on Equalization, Committee on Treasurer's, Clerk's, and Highway Accounts, Committee on Finance, Taxation and Budget, Committee on Hospital and Home, Committee on Resolutions from without the County, Committee on Tax Claims, Committee on Bonds and Salaries, Committee on Register of Deeds, Clerk of Court and District Attorney Accounts, Committee on Public Property, Committee on Publishing and Printing, Committee on County Highway, Superintendent of Schools Committee, Committee on Agriculture, Committee on Personnel and Sheriff's Committee. The size of committees shall be limited to not less than three nor more than five members. No member of the Highway Committee may serve on any other committee of the County Board.
- Rule 8. After the journal shall have been read the order of business shall be as follows: 1. Letters, Petitions, Remonstrations, Communications and Accompanying Documents. 2. Resolutions. 3. Reports of committee, first standing and afterwards, special committees. 4. Miscellaneous business.
- Rule 9. Every member present shall vote unless excused by the Chairman.
- Rule 10. Every vote taken in regard to levying taxes, appropriating money, or dividing or altering the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be taken by Yeas and Nays, and the same shall be entered on the journal.
- Rule 11. The Yeas and Nays on any question shall be entered on the journal at the request of one of the members present.

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- 12. No petitions, resolutions or motions having for its object the division or alteration of the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be entered on or considered at the same session of the Board at which it was introduced, but the same shall lie over for consideration at the next regular adjourned or special session of the Board.
- Rule 13. No mention, other than the receiving of petitions, remonstrations, communications, claims, and the reference of the same to appropriate Committees or to adjourn shall be acted upon in the absence of any committee in the regular discharge of their duty unless such motion had been made at a previous meeting and a special assignment had for its consideration.
- Rule 14. No report or resolution appropriating any money shall be acted upon until the next day after presentation without permission of a majority of the members elected.
 - Rule 15. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern in all cases where they are applicable.
 - Rule 16. Any of the foregoing rules, except Rules 10 and 12 may be rescinded, changed or suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
 - Rule 17. Rules Nos. 10 and 12 may be rescinded, altered or suspended by a two-thirds vote of all the members entitled to seats on the County Board.
 - Rule 18. The Committee on Equalization shall render their report immediately after roll call on the first day of the session but said report shall not be acted upon on the day which it is presented.
 - Rule 19. The Chairman shall appoint two or more members of the Board, who shall visit the County Hospital and Home any time within one month after their appointment and file their written report as to the condition found after their visit. And for each succeeding month thereafter, a like committe shall be appointed whose duties shall be the same as the first committee, but no member shall be appointed on such committee oftener than once in twelve months, the compensation to be \$5.00 per visit in full for said trip.
- Rule 20. No informal ballot cast by this Board shall be declared a formal ballot. In no case shall any official be elected by this Board by casting a unanimous vote in favor of any candidate or nominee.
- Rule 21. The Board shall meet in regular session on the third Tuesday of January of each year.
- Rule 22. All officers elected by the County Board except those elected at the April session, shall be nominated and all nominations lay over to the following day before they are voted on.

DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Duties of the County Highway Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. The County Highway Committee shall have supervision over the maintenance and construction of all road and bridges as provided by the statutes and shall submit to the County Board an annual report including the report of the County Highway Committee of all receipts and expenditures in the County Highway Department and shall submit an annual budget and recommendations for the tax levy for road and bridge purposes to the County Board at the annual session and any other duties as outlined in the statutes or as directed by County Board Action.
- 2. The County Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the Iowa County Traffic Department.
- The Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the operation of the County Ambulance.

Duties of the Sheriff's Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. The Sheriff's Committee shall examine all accounts and claims filed against the County by the Sheriff and his deputies, and make report to the County Board at each regular meeting thereof.
- 2. The Sheriff's Committee shall also have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the county police radio system, and shall act upon such other matters as may be referred to it by the County Board.

Duties of the Resolution Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To receive and examine all resolutions from without the County and make report thereof to the County Board.

Duties of the General Claims Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

1. To audit, allow or disallow all claims filed in the office of the County Clerk or referred to the committee, and shall file a schedule of such claims allowed, with the County Clerk, for payment and shall make a report to the County Board of all claims audited.

Duties of the Equalization Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To have supervision over and make an equalization of the assessments on all property in the county for taxes between the several towns, villages and cities of the county.
- It shall be the duty of this committee to make a detailed report thereof at the annual session of the board.
- 3. This committee shall meet annually with the Supervisor of Assessments and County Assessors at their spring meeting.

Duties of the Tax Claims Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To consider, examine and report to the county board, its findings in all matters of illegal assessments, tax titles and delinquent lands that may come before the board for action.
- To supervise all delinquent taxes returned to the County, supervise the taking of tax deeds, supervise the sale of real estate

taken on tax deed to the end that property is returned to the tax roll and aid in the collection of delinquent taxes. Where the value of the property involved warrants it the Committee shall have the power to appraise the property and in its descretion insure it for the benefit of the County.

- To make appraisals pursuant to Chapter 75.69 of the county owned tax deed lands.
- To sell and dispose to the best interests of the county those lands to which the county has taken tax deeds.
- 5. To employ the services of the county surveyor to establish the location of county owned property when necessary.
- To authorize and recommend the county treasurer at their descretion to assign to heirs, mortgagees or adjacent property owners, tax certificates purchased by the county at the annual sale of tax certificates.

Duties of the Welfare Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To have charge of all matters arising from the care of the poor, and incidental matters and claims for the support and care of the indigent and poor.
- To act in an advisory capacity with the Director of Pensions and Relief when necessary.
- (See Resolution (No. 38) combining two committees dated at Dodgeville, Wisconsin, November 14, 1935.

Also ordinance (No. 6) passed in the County Board Sessions of 1941).

Duties of the Finance Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To prepare and present to the County Board at the Annual Session the Budget and Tax Levy; first in a temporary form, and finally in a complete form as changed during the County Board Session
- To report upon all resolutions and petitions for appropriations presented to the Board.
- To report and make recommendations on the finances of the County from time to time when required.

Duties of the Bonds and Salaries Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To recommend to the County Board the compensation of County officers and employees.
- To determine the amount of Bonds to be furnished by the County officers to the County and to report on the sufficiency of such bonds.
- To designate and report to the County Board the Banks of Towa County that may apply as a depository for county funds.

Duties of Agricultural Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

 To perform all duties prescribed by law as further instructed by the County Board. The general duty of the Committee is to protect and enhance the financial interest of the county in all things agricultural.

This committee, working in conjunction with state and federal authorities shall according to statute, enter into, consumate and cancel contracts with all extension workers and be the authority in the matter of policy of the extension office.

This committee shall bring before the proper committee requests for appropriations for fiscal years, listing the salaries and estimated expense of each department of extension work.

The agricultural committee shall examine and approve all claims filed against Iowa County by the Extension Department.

The Agricultural Committee has in the past requested the assistance of agricultural leaders of the county in the formation of an agricultural program for the year. This privilege is to continue.

When a county becomes a soil conservation district, the agricultural committee automatically becomes supervisor of said district and must sign all contracts with those who enter into soil conservation contracts.

The Agricultural Committee shall act in an advisory capacity on all agricultural appropriations unless otherwise instructed by the County Board.

Duties of Personnel Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To set the policy of each department when not in conflict with the Statutes or when called upon for this purpose, also to designate the duties and responsibilities of the different offices.
- To hear and consider grievances reported by county departments, county officers and county employees and to make their recommendations to the County Board.
- All matters pertaining to clerk hire, working hours and conditions, departmental problems or questions shall be referred to this committee.
 - 4. To meet annually not later than October 15 of each year.

Duties of Committee on Clerk's, Treasurer's and Highway Accounts It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To meet with the State Auditors to study and examine the report on the accounts of the County Clerk, County Treasurer and Highway Department, and to make a report to the County Board.
- To audit the Accounts of the Justices of Iowa County as provided by the Wisconsin Statutes.
- To approve the reports of the County Clerk and County Treasurer before being presented to the County Board.

Duties of Committee on District Attorney, Register of Deeds and Clerk of Courts Accounts

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To approve the reports of the District Attorney, Register of Deeds and Clerk of Courts.

Duties of Public Property Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To supervise and have charge of the Court House, County Jail and the grounds of these buildings and the Gov. Dodge home site.
 - To keep in repair and good condition these properties.
- 2. In order to maintain uniformity of equipment, the Public Property Committee shall purchase the equipment for all the offices in the Court House with the following exceptions — no office equip-

ment shall be purchased for the County Agent's office, Welfare office or Highway Department, except when such purchases are made from the General Fund.

 This Committee shall function during the year and when the County Board is not in session.

Duties of County Superintendent of Schools Committee It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To act as an advisory committee on all matters pertaining to the office of the County Superintendent of Schools, excepting those duties governed by statute.
- To check the superintendent's accounts and make recommendations to the board in matters of expense and appropriation.

Duties of the Committee on County Hospital and Home It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To examine the accounts of the Hospital and Home.
- To compare the vouchers as filed with the County Clerk with the records of the institutions and to compare the revenues received at the Hospital and Home with the receipts issued by the County Treasurer.
- 3. To act as an advisory committee with the Board of Trustees in the maintenance, repairs and construction of buildings.
- To report to the County Board, but in no way interfere with the management of the Rospital and Home by the Board of Trustees as established by law.

Duties of the Printing Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To accept bids on the printing of the County Board Proceedings, stationery envelopes for county officers and Court Calendars.
- To act on all matters of printing referred to them by the County Board.

Duties of Conservation Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To audit the accounts of any money appropriated by the County Board for conservation work.
- 2. To supervise the purchase of equipment and supplies in which the money appropriated by the County Board is used.

Duties of Highway Study Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To receive all petitions referred to it by the County Board, by the regular highway committee and any citizen group relating to the construction, relocation, maintenance and repairs of any Federal State or County road in the county and report their recommendations to the next meeting of the County Board.
- To confer with the regular Highway Committee on all allocations and grants of Federal and State funds and on any other highway matters of major importance.
 - 3. This committee is merely advisory.

Duties of the Health Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To act in an advisory capacity with the County Nurse on all types of health programs.
- 2. Annually plan and recommend the budget for the health program,

PROCEEDINGS OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN

April 19, 1960

The Board of Supervisors met in Regular Session at the Courthouse in the City of Dodgeville, Iowa County, Wisconsin, April 19, 1960 and was called to order by Honorable Harry Reynolds, Chairman of the Board.

The Invocation was given by Rev. Wreford of Dodgeville.

The County Clerk was notified of the appointment (No. 1) of Mr. Ray Crook as Chairman from the Town of Wyoming and he was seated as a member of the County Board. Sup. James escorted Mr. Crook to his chair.

To the Iowa County Board of Supervisors:

The Wyoming Town Board acted and appointed Ray Crook as town chairman to replace Warren Hoyer.

The Chairman introduced two new members of the board, Mr. Kenneth Holt, member from the 2nd Ward of the City of Dodgeville and Mr. Kenneth Palzkill, member from the 3rd Ward of the City of Dodgeville.

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The next order of business was the election of a Chairman for the ensuing year.

Sup. Scullion and Sup. F. Ryan were appointed tellers.

As a result of the election Mr. Harry Reynolds was elected Chairman for the ensuing year.

Sup. Reynolds thanked the Board for the honor bestowed upon him.

The next order of business was the election of a Vice-Chairman for the ensuing year.

As a result of the election Mr. Malcolm Swenson was declared elected Vice-Chairman for the ensuing year and responded with a few remarks.

The Board then proceeded to the election of a Welfare Committee, one from the towns, one from the villages and one from the cities.

Sup. J. Ryan nominated Sup. Fessel as a candidate for election to the Welfare Committee from the towns.

Vice-Chairman Swenson took the Chair at the request of Chairman Reynolds who was called out of the meeting.

The Board then proceeded with the election of a Welfare Committee.

As a result of the election Sup. Fessel was declared elected member from the towns, Sup. J. Ryan member from the villages and Sup. Julian member from the cities. Each member responded with a few remarks.

Chairman Reynolds returned to the Chair.

The enclosed State Treasurer's check in the amount indicated in the right hand column below represents the prepayment of part of the 1960 supplemental highway aid for county trunk highways in your county pursuant to Section 20.420(83)(b)5, Wisconsin Statutes. It is computed as 50 percent of the supplemental aid paid to your county in July 1959. The exact amount of the 1960 supplemental highway aids for county trunk highways pursuant to Sections 20.420(83) and (84) will be determined after the close of the current fiscal year on June 30, 1960. The balance of your 1960 supplemental highway aid, after deducting the amount of this payment, will be remitted during the month of July.

The funds represented by this payment are supplemental to and are to be used for the same purposes as the county trunk allotment under Section 83.10(1), which will be paid in June.

Ballot vote taken. Total votes cast 31; Ayes 11, Noes 20.

Sup. Julian requested a ballot vote be taken for the election of members for the Committee on Committees.

Sup. James moved each member of the board vote for three members to the committee and the three receiving the most votes are to be declared members of the committee.

Sup. Brunker seconded the motion.

Carried

As a result of the election Sup. Grunow and Dunn were elected as two members. A tie resulted for the third member and on motion of Sup. Fessel a vote was taken to decide the tie. As a result of the election Sup. J. Ryan was declared elected third member of the committee on committees.

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Sup. James moved that the rules as amended be adopted for a full year, including the January 1961 session.

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Sup. James moved to adjourn until 10:00 a.m. tomorrow morning. Sup. Brunker seconded the motion.

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Resolution (No. 5) for a transfer of funds from the machinery fund to the county maintenance fund was read.

RESOLUTION NO. 5

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Iowa County: Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, the County Maintenance Fund may be insufficient to carry on the highway program adopted by the Board of Supervisors at the November session,

WHEREAS, the County advances money to carry on Federal Aid Projects from the highway maintenance fund it is extremely difficult to estimate the amount of funds which will be necessary to carry out the various highway maintenance projects each year, and the amount of money which it will be necessary to advance for Federal Highway Aid Projects and it is desired to take advantage of every opportunity to secure the expenditure of such fund in this county, and,

WHEREAS, emergencies frequently arise making it necessary or desirable the allocation or transfer of funds to or between other authorized construction projects or for additional needed improvements and maintenance before the regular meeting of the County Board,

NOW, THEREFORE, in order to provide for promptly making available the funds necessary for the purpose herein before mentioned, and to avoid delay and expense incident to calling a special meeting of this board as authorized by Section 65.90(5)(b) of the Wisconsin Statutes 1951 for such purpose,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Iowa County Finance Committee upon written request of the Iowa County Highway Committee is hereby authorized to transfer not to exceed \$50,000.00 from the Iowa County Machinery Fund to the Iowa County Maintenance Fund to carry on projects in this county. Said amount transferred to be included in the 1961 highway budget and credited to the account from which it was taken.

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Resolution (No. 7) regarding an increase in burial fee for indigent persons was read.

RESOLUTION NO. 7

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Iowa County: Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, The Iowa County Board has by action duly taken provided for the payment of the sum of not to exceed One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) for burial expense for indigent persons,

AND WHEREAS, it has been the policy of the Welfare Department that the funeral directors of Iowa County be authorized to ac-

cept contributions from the relatives or immediate friends of persons being buried at county expense in a total amount of not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), it being further understood that the total commitment for Iowa County shall not exceed the statutory limitation of One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00),

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the burial policy of Iowa County be changed to allow for Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) maximum for funeral expenses, which is the current stautory limitation and to allow the funeral directors of Iowa County to accept contributions from the relatives or immediate friends of persons being buried at county expense in a total amount of not to exceed One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00),

AND, to pay the actual cemetery charges, in accordance with the present Wisconsin State Statutes,

Your application and applications from 72 applicants for federal aids from the fiscal year 1960-61 were considered by the Board of Health at the regular monthly meeting on Friday, August 12, 1960.

Attached is a summary of the requests for federal funds received by the established deadline of June 27, 1960. Please observe that the estimated cost of all proposed projects totalled \$66,153,000 of which federal aid would amount to \$26,037,000 compared with the amount of \$3,342.000 available to Wisconsin. This means that only 13 per cent of the funds requested could be allocated. Therefore, most applicants will be disappointed and may have to wait one or more years, or go ahead with their own total financing.

Nineteen applications were received from sponsors ready to provide 912 nursing home beds at a cost of about \$9,000,000. This would

require over \$3,000,000 in federal aid compared with \$225,163 available. Your request for aid for nursing home beds did not receive approval because funds for this category did not permit going beyond the priority of A-9, whereas your priority of B-29 could not be reached. However, it is suggested that you keep the application on file for consideration during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1961.

WHEREAS, the Association petitioned the governing body of the Iowa County Soil Conservation District to cooperate with it in securing federal assistance for a PL 566 project, and

WHEREAS, the district and the association with agricultural agency assistance, have prepared a work plan for the watershed with estimated federal costs being \$650,000, and local and state cash outlays being about \$190,000 of which \$90,000 will be provided by the Wisconsin Conservation Department in the event Governor Dodge Park is enlarged and a multi-purpose flood control and fish and wild-life lake is installed, and

WHEREAS, in order to have this project materialize the local people will have to raise approximately \$100,000 over a five year period,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that in the interest of and benefit to ALL people in the Iowa County Soil Conservation District, their county board hereby commits itself to appropriating \$100,000 over a period of 5 years as their share of the cash contribution to this project, and

COUNTY AID CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1961

SECTION I. The County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the county for highway work in the year 1961 under the provisions of Section 20.420 and Chapter 83 of the Statutes and the additional sums herein appropriated shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

SECTION II. COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENTS. WHEREAS the State Highway Commission has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be One Hundred ninety-four thousand three hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$194,300.00) will become available at the end of the fiscal year under the provisions of Sections 83.10 and 20.420(83) and (84) of the Statutes, for the county trunk highway system in the county, but the actual amount will not be known until the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1961.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the said sum to the extent required to match and supplement Federal aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any Federal projects located on the county trunk highway system of said county, which are not recovered from Federal funds, and to expend any balance for constructing, repairing, and

maintaining such county trunk highway system and the bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 83.10(1) of the statutes, and to reimburse the general fund for any expenditures that may be made therefrom pursuant to Section 83.01(6) of the statutes. The distribution to such purposes is estimated, but not specifically directed, to be as follows:

SECTION III. WHEREAS it appears that certain additional highway improvements in the county are necessary and warranted,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby appropriate the following sums for the purpose hereinafter set forth:

- (1) For the maintenance of the County Trunk Highway System and matching Federal Aid Secondary Funds; Snow Removal and Ice Removal, the sum of Two Hundred Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$200,000.00).
- (2) For emergency road or bridge repairs or construction, the necessity for which is determined by the County Highway Committee and for which other funds are not available, the sum of Thirty thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$30,000.00).
- (3) For the purchase of machinery and for machinery repairs not to exceed the sum of One Hundred fifty thousand and No/100. Received from Machinery Rental.
- (4) For the purchase of county gravel pits and stone quarries the sum Received from Sale of Materials.
- (5) For administration, including salaries, per diem, officer and travel expense of the County Highway Committee, the County Highway Commissioner, his clerks and assistants not paid from construction or maintenance funds, the sum of Thirteen Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$13,000.00).
- (6) For County Traffic Regulation the sum of Fifteen thousand five hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$15,500.00).

Total Authorized in this Section - \$258,500.00.

The County Clerk is directed to levy the special benefit assessments made herein as special charges against the respective municipalities as provided by law.

SECTION IV. WHEREAS the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefor,

SECTION VI. WHEREAS the County Highway Committee and County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenances of high-

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Commissioner shall have authority to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate such personnel as he deems necessary for such purposes, provided, however, that the County Highway Committee may by action recorded in its minutes determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate any such person. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen, laborers, foremen, clerks, stenographers, or other employees necessary to carry on such activities.

That it shall be the condition of said bidding that no bid will be received unless accompanied by a certified check or a bid bond equal to at least 5% but not more than 10% of the bid payable to said County as a guarantee that if said proposal is accepted the bidder will execute and file the proper contract and performance bond within ten days of the award of the contract. That the certified checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned following direction of the Board of Supervisors for Iowa County on the award of the contracts, except that said Board may provide that checks in the second and third bids may be retained until the execution of the contract and performance bond by the successful bidder. It is a further condition that if the successful bidder files the proper contract and bond within the time limited by the County, that certified checks of said bidder will be returned upon the execution of said contract by the County. It is a further condition of such bidding that in case the successful bidder fails to file a proper contract and performance bond within the time limited by the County, the amount of the check or bid bond will be forfeited to the County as liquidated damages.
- 4. It is a further condition of said bidding that a performance bond shall be filed by the successful bidder in form satisfactory to the County and shall be for the amount of the contract, and that both bid bonds and performance bonds shall be by Surety Companies authorized to do business in the State of Wisconsin.
- 5. That the County shall provide that no bid shall be withdrawn after the opening of the bids without the consent of the County for a period of 30 days after the scheduled time of opening the bids and that said bids shall remain firm for that period, and that the County reserve the right to reject any or all bids and to waive any minor informality in the bidding or to waive any irregularities which may be to the advantage of the County and to make awards in such manner as such County may deem right and proper for the best interests of the County.

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Mr. D. M. Morgan, Civil Defense Director presented his annual report (No. 2) and reported to the Board on the past year's activities.

CIVIL DEFENSE REPORT

January 12, 1961

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Iowa County:

We, your Civil Defense Committee and Civil Defense Director report on the activities of Civil Defense for the period from November 1959 to December 31, 1960.

November 19, 1959—Chairman Reynolds and Julian of the Civil Defense Committee along with the Director Morgan attended an all day conference at Madison called by the State Civil Defense Director Olson.

November 24, 1959—Chairman Reynolds and Director Morgan accompanied the members of the Jail Committee to Camp Douglas to observe the operation of a 30 KW Caterpillar Diesel Electric Generator.

December 10 and 16, 1959—Attended meetings of the Joint Civil Defense and Jail Committees. It was voted that the Civil Defense Committe apply to the Federal Government for matching funds in the amount of \$2,400.00 to be used for payment toward the 30 KW Caterpillar Generator to be purchased and installed at the new Jail.

December 23, 1959—Director Morgan made a trip to the Civil Defense office at Madison where the necessary papers were made out for the matching funds in the amount of \$2,400,00.

January 18, 1960—Director Morgan was notified that the application for matching funds for generator was not approved by State Director Olson. Instructions were that the committee use one of the two 10 KW generators that the County Civil Defense Committee purchased early in 1959 from government surplus.

Early in February Chairman Reynolds obtained the services of Mr. Strahota to move one of the 10 KW generators from the county shop to the Jail. The generator was installed temporarily for a test to see if it was large enough to carry the load.

February 11, 1960—The Civil Defense Committee inspected the generator installation and found that it was working perfectly and was producing sufficient current to carry the load. Mr. Strahota was instructed to install the generator permanently. It is tested frequently each month and is giving satisfactory service.

February 24 and 25, 1960—Director Morgan and committee member Julian, also Art Fecht of Highland attended a state wide Civil Defense meeting at Madison called by State Director Olson.

March 11, 1960—Attended an all day district Civil Defense meeting held at Dodgeville. Nine county directors present as well as several committee members. Meeting was conducted by the officials from the State Office in Madison.

May 25, 1960—Had a meeting in Mineral Point with M. Remely State Director of Health for Civil Defense, Dr. Hohler, County Civil Defense Medical Officer, Chairman Reynolds and Julian to make plans for Exhibition of Emergency Hospital Unit.

June 20, 21 and 22, 1960—Three (3) day exhibition of Emergency Hospital Unit was held at Dodgeville High School Gym. Talks by Louis E. Remely of Civil Defense Health Department, and Dr. Hohler, County Civil Defense Health Director. Slides were shown at each session. A fair crowd of interested professional people, doctors, dentists, nurses, druggists, etc., attended as well as members of County Board and other interested citizens.

August 3, 1960—Billed the Civil Defense for matching funds in the amount of \$3,094.50, which was one-half of the amount paid to the Motorola Company for the new Radio System installed in the Jail.

October 19, 1960—Was notified that the Madison office had made the billings on obsolete forms and that the billing would have to be made again, using new forms.

September 23,1960—Spent a day with Mayor Ralph Balliette of Platteville, who had just been appointed Civil Defense Director of Grant County, helping him organize his County.

September 27, 1960—Mr. Russell James, Dodgeville, accepted appointment of County Director of Fire Protection. Due to hospitalization, Mr. James has not been able to serve up to this date.

October 8, 1960—The Director met with a group, the Iowa County Home Makers, at the courthouse, Dodgeville. Some 60 women were present. Sound slides were shown, Rural Defense literature distributed. This proved to be a very interesting meeting.

During Novmber and December met with the Traffic Officer Dick Jones concerning training of Auxiliary Police for the County. Mr. Jones being the only qualified officer in the county to carry out the instruction. Due to the fact that Mr. Jones was very busy with his regular traffic work, he was unable to start training the police until the winter months. He is planning to carry out this training this winter.

County First Aid Officer, Harold Maynard, has started a series of First Aid Classes throughout the county. At present classes are being instructed at Highland, Mineral Point, and other centers in the county.

The final meeting of the Civil Defense committee was held at the County Highway Office in mid-December at which time settlement was arrived at on an outstanding bill of 1959 for the repair and overhauling of three (3) generators. None of the present committee members or Director knew anything about the bill. Mechanic Halverson was called in and explained just what work was done on the generators. The committee voted to pay the Highway Department in payment of this bill, the amount being \$392.50.

During the fourteen month period the committee has approved and made the following payments:

I hereby respectfully submit a short summary of jail activities during the year, 1960.

During the past year we have arrested and held in our jail 221 adult prisoners, plus 15 juvenile prisoners. These prisoners have been held from a sentence of two days to one year. A number of prisoners are hired out under the Huber Act wherever and whenever it is worth while and transportation can be arranged.

We have a day radio operator and jailer and a night radio operator and jailer. The day man arrives at 9 a.m. each day except Sunday and works until 6 p.m. My wife and myself handle things until 10 p.m. when the night man arrives. He stays until 6 a.m. when my wife and myself again take over until 9 a.m. On Sunday my wife and myself handle the jail from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. as we have no help on this day.

Visitors are allowed on Monday, Wednesday and Friday nights from 7 until 9 p.m.; relatives only.

We get many calls for the county ambulance; a good number of these calls are late at night.

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Resolution (No. 5) relative to Eminent Domain including a change in the statute regarding the filing of county relocation orders was read.

RESOLUTION NO. 5

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, Chapter 639 of the laws of 1959 which completely rewrote all statutes relating to Eminent Domain included a change in the statutes relative to the filing of county highway relocation orders, stipulating that only the County Board of Supervisors have the authority to file such orders,

WHEREAS, prior to the enactment of Chapter 639 the County Highway Committees had authority to file such orders,

Gentlemen:

We are submitting the annual report of the Iowa County Public Welfare Department for the year 1960. In this report we are presenting interpretative material for a better understanding of what this agency is attempting to do. We hope that this report will give those reading it a picture of the welfare agency and how it is operating, for the best interests of the people that it has been set up to serve.

This report includes all the expenditures for the categorical aids such as Old Age Assistance, Aid to Dependent Children, Aid to Dependent Children in Foster Homes, Blind Aid, Aid to the Totally and Permanently Disabled, as well as for General Relief and Administration.

If, as a result of reading this report, you desire further factual information, please feel free at any time to visit your county welfare agency.

The Iowa County Welfare Board and agency staff are very appreciative of the fine cooperation received from the Iowa County Board of Supervisors, county officials, the Iowa County Medical Society, the Dodgeville hospitals, Iowa County dentists, optometrists, Iowa County lawyers and other professional and lay people of Iowa County, with whom we have come in contact during the past year. It would have been difficult, if not imposible to have given Iowa Coun-

ty an efficient and business like welfare administration without this fine help and cooperation.

OLD AGE ASSISTANCE

This continues to be our largest program and the most expensive. This is due, to a large part, for the need for regular and prolonged medical care by many of our Old Age Assistance recipients. While it is necessary, the fact remains that it is costly.

In 1960 cash payments were made to an average of 277 persons per month. These Old Age Assistance recipients are now older and are living longer. This means that they are in need of a considerable amount of medical care, such as physician's services, hospitalization, drugs, nursing home care, dental care, optometrical services, etc. As the costs of these services increase, the assistance payments increase proportionately.

There will be a change in the federal reimbursement percentage, effective July 1, 1961 from 54.6% to 53.1%. The amount received per Old Age Assistance case was \$43.11. This was changed to \$49.662 on October 1, 1960 and then \$48.957 on July 1, 1961.

The other Social Security Aids, such as Blind Aid, Disabled Aid and Aid to Dependent Children, will also be affected. The amounts received from the federal government, based on a per eligible recipient count for these programs will be reducd, however, not too greatly, as of July 1, 1961.

AID TO THE TOTALLY AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED

Due to the more liberal interpretation of a disabled person, by the 1959 Wisconsin State Legislature, the number of recipients receiving this form of aid has continued to be on the increase. A large number of General Relief cases have qualified for and are currently receiving an Aid to Disabled grant, due to a permanent physical or mental disability. It is anticipated that even more cases will be found eligible in 1961.

Since the Disabled Aid caseload has increased and because of the cost for medical care of one case being cared for in the Wisconsin Neurological Foundation it was found necessary during 1960, to transfer \$2,000 from the Old Age Assistance account to the Disabled Aid account.

The average caseload in 1960 was 12 cases per month, an increase of 9 cases per month over 1959.

AID TO THE BLIND

The Blind Aid program has continued to be stable in the number of cases carried. However, the general pattern, as with the other programs, the cost has been on the increase, especially the medical costs. Due to the cost of medical care, for one Blind Aid recipient, it was found necessary during 1960 to request a \$1300.00 deficiency appropriation. The average number of cases during the year was six.

GENERAL RELIEF

The costs for General Relief in Iowa County during 1960 was considerably less than was spent in 1959. The relief costs from January through December 1960 amounted to \$23,612.10. The refunds received during this period amounted to \$6,263.14. The relief costs from January through December 1959 amounted to \$32,074.19. The refunds received during this period amounted to \$15,498.69. Thus, when not taking into consideration the refunds, the relief costs for 1960 were \$8,462.09 less than they were in 1959. The average monthly costs during this twelve month period amounted to \$1,967.68 per month in 1960 as compared to \$2,672.85 per month in 1959.

This agency has continued to make every effort to get able-bodied men on jobs. The Iowa County Work Relief Project, whereby able-bodied men on relief are referred to the Iowa County Highway Department for employment, is continued to be used. The men work for ten hours a day, five days a week, at an hourly rate of 80c. The relief earned is given in the form of food orders and general purchase orders for other needs, such as fuel, rental, clothing and utilities.

While the food allowance for General Relief recipients is reduced by 25% from the allowance made for Social Security Aids recipients, especially in the large General Relief families, for those able-bodied men employed on the County Work Relief Project, a full food allowance is made for him and his family. This is an incentive for those able to work and needing relief, to work off the relief received.

Due to the high medical costs, in several General Relief cases,

and the cost of care for those with legal settlement in Iowa County, who live in other counties, the relief costs have continued to be high.

AGENCY ADMINISTRATION

The cost of Administration is the expense of operating the Iowa County Public Welfare Department. This includes the salaries paid to the eight employees, per diem and travel of the three County Welfare Board members, expense of necessary travel by staff members to carry out the functions of the agency and the office maintenance expenses.

Since the reports on Administration from the State Department of Public Welfare, Division of Public Assistance, are always two months in arrears, we are reporting the amounts of expenditures for the entire year of 1960. However, we are estimating the reimbursement rom the State and Federal Governments for the months of November and December 1960.

MEDICAL CARE

The medical costs for 1960 are considerably higher than for 1959. It has been averaging well over \$1,000 a month more than in 1959, when the cost averaged \$8,000 monthly. One month in 1960, the medical cost was in excess of \$13,000. The reasons for the increased costs are due to higher nursing home rates, hospital rates, optometrical rates, physician's services, dental rates and the use of medicines and drugs that are expensive. The continued demand for an increased use of medical care by public welfare recipients, causes the cost for such care to be on the rise in Iowa County. As previously stated, our recipients are older and live longer, thus, have more need of medical care. This is a state-wide trend and this county is no exception. When medical care is recommended and needed, the recipient receives it. This has always been the policy of Iowa County.

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Resolution (No. 15) creating a reforestration fund for the purchase of a tree planting machine and a tree planting machine rental agreement was read.

RESOLUTION NO. 15

WHEREAS, much of the future economic welfare of Iowa County is inseparably tied to its forestry development;

AND WHEREAS, the recently completed Forest Inventory of Iowa County shows the need for some 2,500,000 trees to be planted on some 2,200 acres of hillsides best suited to a permanent tree cover;

AND WHEREAS, in spite of the progress that has been made in the county, continued effort is necessary so the county can make the most of its forest producing potential;

AND WHEREAS, the efficiency, case and speed of planting trees on hillsides with a tree planting machine far exceeds that which can be planted by hand, for example, 10 to 15 trees can be machine planted in the time it takes to plant 1 tree by hand;

AND WHEREAS, the planting of trees is known to quickly check soil and water losses it is believed a tree planting machine would greatly benefit the entire county;

AND WHEREAS, the cost of said planter is \$970.00, a rental fee be charged users of said machine to reimburse the county;

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that this Board go on record as favorable to the continued development of the forest resources countywide as quickly as possible;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Iowa County Board of Supervisors go on record in favor of appropriating \$970.00 to purchase and make available to residents of Iowa County said tree planting machine to hasten the job of planting trees for soil and water conservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the fees for use of said tree planter be returned to Iowa County until full payment is received.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the sum of \$970.00 be transferred from the General Fund to a new fund to be set up as "Reforestration Fund."

Therefore, in order to implement the foregoing statement, the

following policy will guide the county in the operation of the tree planting machine:

- 1. The machine will be owned by Iowa County.
- 2. The machine will be operated by Iowa County or persons designated by them.
- 3. The machine will be self-supporting as a planting fee will be assessed each user. This fee will be determined by the county.
- 4. All funds collected from use of the machine will be returned to the county until the full cost is reimbursed. Any funds collected after this will be used to repair and maintain the planter and to cover depreciation.
- The county will assume no responsibility for the machine as to injury and damage incurred by any landowner using said machine.

She further reported that the Chairman of the County Board and the County Clerk had executed a contract for Iowa County for the sale of said bonds in accordance with the award, as was set forth in the minutes. The Chairman instructed the County Clerk to attach a copy of the minutes of the Committee on Finance at the foot of the minutes of this meeting. The Chairman then asked the Board if they were ready to proceed to adopt the necessary resolution to carry into effect the comp'etion of the sale of said bonds the execution and delivery of said bonds, After discussion the following resolution was read to the Board by the Clerk, to-wit:

WHEREAS, pursuant to authority and direction from this Board and to advertised notice of sale, bids were received for the sale of said bonds on the 29th day of March, 1961;

WHEREAS, pursuant to directions from this Board, the Committee on Finance of the County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, together with the Chairman of the County Board and the County Clerk, held a meeting commencing at 2:00 o'clock p.m. on March 29, 1961, for the purpose of opening, hearing and considering said bids, and at said meeting all of the bids received were opened, heard and considered;

WHEREAS, the bid of Goodbody & Co.; Baxter & Co.; and The White-Phillips Company, Inc. at the price of \$650,331.50 for the en tire issue of said bonds at an interest rate of 3% on bonds numbered 1 to 335, both inclusive, being the bonds maturing in each of the years 1962 through 1972, both inclusive, and at an interest rate of 3¼% on bonds numbered 336 to 545, both inclusive, being the bonds maturing in each of the years 1973 through 1978, both inclusive, and at an interest rate of 3-3/8% on bonds numbered 546 through 650, both inclusive, being the bonds maturing in each of the years 1979 through 1981, both inclusive, plus accrued interest from the date of said bonds to the date of delivery, was the best bid submitted upon the basis of the lowest net interest cost to the County by computing the total interest on all of the bonds from the date thereof to the stated maturity date, less the premium offered;

2. That the sale of said Iowa County, Wisconsin, County Build-

ing Bonds to Goodbody & Co.; Baxter & Co.; and The White-Phillips Company, Inc. at the price of \$650,331.50 plus accrued interest from the date of said bonds to the date of delivery of said bonds, is hereby confirmed, said price being the bid submitted by said purchasers and being the best bid submitted.

3. That each of the bonds hereby authorized and each of the interest coupons to be thereto attached shall be in substantially the following form, to-wit:

A meeting of the Committee on Finance of the County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, was called to order at the Circuit Court Room in the Court House in the City of Dodgeville, Iowa County, Wisconsin, at 2:00 o'clock p.m. on Wednesday, March 29, 1961. The following members of the Committee were present: Chairman Malcolm Swenson, Fred Grunow, A. E. Anding, I. Dalven Julian and Russell Stenseth.

The Chairman of the Committee stated that this meeting was a joint meeting with the Chairman of the County Board and the County Clerk for the purpose of receiving, opening, reading and considering bids for the purchase of Six Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$650,000.00) Dollars general obligation bonds of the County to be called "Iowa County, Wisconsin County Building Bonds." He stated that since the County Clerk was a part of this meeting and was present, he would request her to keep the official minutes of the meeting, and that since the Chairman of the County Board was present, he would ask him to act as chairman of this meeting.

The Chairman of the County Board then took the chair and announced the purpose of this meeting was to open sealed bids for the purchase of Six Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$650,000.00) Dollars general obligation bonds of said County, to be called "Towa County, Wisconsin County Building Bonds." WHEREAS, the bid of Goodbody & Co.; Baxter & Co., and The White-Phillips Company, Inc. at the price of \$650,331.50 for the entire issue of said bonds at an interest rate of 3% on bonds numbered 1 to 335, both inclusive, being the bonds maturing in each of the years 1962 through 1972, both inclusive and at an interest rate of 34% on bonds numbered 336 through 545, both inclusive, being the bonds maturing in each of the years 1973 through 1978, both inclusive, and at an interest rate of 3-3/8% on bonds numbered 546 through 650, both inclusive, being the bonds maturing in each of the years 1979 through 1981, both inclusive, plus accrued interest from the date of said bonds to the date of delivery of said bonds, was the best bid submitted upon the basis of the lowest net interest cost to the County by computing the total interest on all of the bonds from the date thereof to the stated maturity dates, less the premium offered:

WHEREAS, this Committee was empowered by the resolution of the County Board of Supervisors to determine the best bid sub mitted on the basis of the lowest net interest cost to the County by computing the total interest on all of the bonds from the date there-of to the stated maturity date and deducting therefrom the premium bid, if any, and to award the bid on the basis of the best bid, and by said resolution the Chairman of the County Board and the County Clerk were authorized, upon such an award to the successful bidder, to execute a contract for the County for the sale of said bonds in accordance with the award;

WHEREAS, this Committee is desirous of awarding said bid on the basis of the best bid received at this time;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Committee on Finance of the County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, does resolve as follows:

- 1. That the sale of Six Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$650,000.00) Dollars issue of general obligation bonds of said County, to be called "Iowa County, Wisconsin County Building Bonds," is hereby awarded to Goodbody & Co.; Baxter & Co.; and The White-Phillips Company, Inc. at the price recited in the preamble hereto.
- 2. That the Chairman of the County Board and the County Clerk be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to sign a contract with Goodbody & Co.; Baxter & Co.; and The White-Phillips Co., Inc. on behalf of said County in accordance with this resolution.
- 3. That the County Clerk be, and she is hereby directed to make a report of this meeting to the meeting of the County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, to be held on March 30, 1961, by presenting to said Board a copy of this resolution and a copy of the minutes of this meeting, including the tabulation of bids.

Sup. Stenseth moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution and Sup. Grunow seconded the motion and upon roll call vote the following voted Aye: Sups. Swenson, Grunow, Anding, Julian and Stenseth.

The following voted No: None.

The Chairman of the Committee declared the resolution adopted.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the meeting adjourned.
