#### RULES FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE IOWA CO. BOARD

Rule 1. The hour of meeting shall be 10:00 o'clock a. m. and 2 o'clock p. m., unless a different hour shall be prescribed.

Rule 2. The Chairman shall call the meeting to order at the hour fixed for the meeting. (1) The Clerk shall call the roll of members and (2) a majority being present, the journal of the preceeding meeting shall be read, that any mistakes may be corrected, (3) Motions may be offered.

Rule 3. The Chairman shall preserve order and decorum, and may speak to points of order in preference to other members.

Rule 4. The Board shall elect at their annual April meeting a chairman and also a vice-chairman who shall act in the absence, disability, death or resignation of the chairman or request to act and possess powers of the Chairman.

Rule 5. The Chairman, Vice-Chairman and a committee of three members of the board's selection be elected for the purpose of appointing committees and this committee of three will act as a committee on committees.

Rule 6. All questions shall be stated by the chair. If the Chairman doubts as to the voice of the majority he or any member of the Board may call for a vote by either roll call or rising vote on the question to be decided.

Rule 7. The following standing committees shall be appointed: Committee on Claims, Committee on Equalization, Committee on Treasurer's, Clerk's, and Highway Accounts, Committee on Finance, Taxation and Budget, Committee on Hospital and Home, Committee on Resolutions from without the County, Committee on Tax Claims, Committee on Bonds and Salaries, Committee on Register of Deeds, Clerk of Court and District Attorney Accounts, Committee on Public Property, Committee on Publishing and Printing, Committee on County Highway, Superintendent of Schools Committee, Committee on Agriculture, Committee on Personnel and Sheriff's Committee. The size of committees shall be limited to not less than three nor more than five members. No member of the Highway Committee may serve on any other committee of the County Board.

Rule 8. After the journal shall have been read the order of business shall be as follows: 1. Letters, Petitions, Remonstrations, Communications and Accompanying Documents. 2. Resolutions. 3. Reports of committee, first standing and afterwards, special committees. 4. Miscellaneous business.

Rule 9. Every member present shall vote unless excused by the Chairman.

Rule 10. Every vote taken in regard to levying taxes, appropriating money, or dividing or altering the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be taken by Yeas and Nays, and the same shall be entered on the journal.

- Rule 11. The Yeas and Nays on any question shall be entered on the journal at the request of one of the members present.
- Rule 12. No petitions, resolutions or motions having for its object the division or alteration of the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be entered on or considered at the same session of the Board at which it was introduced, but the same shall lie over for consideration at the next regular adjourned or special session of the Board.
- Rule 13. No mention, other than the receiving of petitions, remonstrations, communications, claims, and the reference of the same to appropriate Committees or to adjourn shall be acted upon in the absence of any committee in the regular discharge of their duty unless such motion had been made at a previous meeting and a special assignment had for its consideration.
- Rule 14. No report or resolution appropriating any money shall be acted upon until the next day after presentation without permission of a majority of the members elected.
- Rule 15. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern in all cases where they are applicable.
- Rule 16. Any of the foregoing rules, except Rules 10 and 12 may be rescinded, changed or suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- Rule 17. Rules Nos. 10 and 12 may be rescinded, altered or suspended by a two-thirds vote of all the members entitled to seats on the County Board.
- Rule 18. The Committee on Equalization shall render their report immediately after roll call on the first day of the session but said report shall not be acted upon on the day which it is presented.
- Rule 19. The Chairman shall appoint two or more members of the Board, who shall visit with the County Hospital and Home any time within one month after their appointment and file their written report as to the condition found after their visit. And for each succeeding month thereafter, a like committee shall be appointed whose duties shall be the same as the first committee, but no member shall be appointed on such committee oftener than once in twelve months, the compensation to be \$5.00 per visit in full for said trip.
- Rule 20. No informal ballot cast by this Board shall be declared a formal ballot. In no case shall any official be elected by this Board by casting a unanimous vote in favor of any candidate or nominee.
  - Rule 21. The Board shall meet in regular session on the third

Tuesday of January of each year.

Rule 22. All officers elected by the County Board except those elected at the April session, shall be nominated and all nominations lay over to the following day before they are voted on.

#### **DUTIES OF COMMITTEES**

#### Duties of the County Highway Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. The County Highway Committee shall have supervision over the maintenance and construction of all road and bridges as provided by the statutes and shall submit to the County Board an annual report including the report of the County Highway Committee of all receipts and expenditures in the County Highway Department and shall submit an annual budget and recommendations for the tax levy for road and bridge purposes to the County Board at the annual session and any other duties as outlined in the statutes or as directed by County Board Action.
- The County Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the Iowa County Traffic Department.
- The Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the operation of the County Ambulance.

#### Duties of the Sheriff's Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- The Sheriff's Committee shall examine all accounts and claims filed against the County by the Sheriff and his deputies, and make report to the County Board at each regular meeting thereof.
- The Sheriff's Committee shall also have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the county police radio system, and shall act upon such other matters as may be referred to it by the County Board.

#### Duties of the Resolution Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To receive and examine all resolutions from without the County and make report thereof to the County Board.

#### Duties of the General Claims Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To audit, allow or disallow all claims filed in the office of the County Clerk or referred to the committee, and shall file a schedule of such claims allowed, with the County Clerk, for payment and shall make a report to the County Board of all claims audited.

#### Duties of the Equalization Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To have supervision over and make an equalization of the assessments on all property in the county for taxes between the several towns, villages and cities of the county.
- It shall be the duty of this committee to make a detailed report thereof at the annual session of the board.
- This committee shall meet annualy with the Supervisor of Assessments and County Assessors at their spring meeting.

#### Duties of the Tax Claims Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To consider, examine and report to the county board, its findings in all matters of illegal assessments, tax titles and delinquent lands that may come before the board for action.
- 2. To supervise all delinquent taxes returned to the County, supervise the taking of tax deeds, supervise the sale of real estate taken on tax deed to the end that property is returned to the tax roll and aid in the collection of delinquent taxes. Where the value of the property involved warrants it the Committee shall have the power to appraise the property and in its discretion insure it for the benefit of the County.
- To make appraisals pursuant to Chapter 75.69 of the county owned tax deed lands.
- To sell and dispose to the best interests of the county those lands to which the county has taken tax deeds.
- To employ the services of the county surveyor to establish the location of county owned property when necessary.
- To authorize and recommend the county treasurer at their discretion to assign to heirs, mortgagees or adjacent property owners, tax certificates purchased by the county at the annual sale of tax certificates.

#### **Duties of the Finance Committee**

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To prepare and present to the County Board at the Annual Session the Budget and Tax Levy; first in a temporary form, and finally in a complete form as changed during the County Board Session.
- To report upon all resolutions and petitions for appropriations presented to the Board.
- To report and make recommendations on the finances of the County from time to time when required.

#### Duties of the Bonds and Salaries Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To recommend to the County Board the compensation of County officers and employees.
- To determine the amount of Bonds to be furnished by the County officers to the County and to report on the sufficiency of such heads.
- To designate and report to the County Board the Banks of Iowa County that may apply as a depository for county funds.

#### **Duties of Agricultural Committee**

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

 To perform all duties prescribed by law as further instructed by the County Board.

The reneral duty of the Committee is to protect and enhance the financial interest of the county in all things agricultural.

This committee, working in conjunction with state and federal authorities shall according to statute, enter into, consummate and cancel contracts with all extension workers and be the authority in the matter of policy of the extension office.

This committee shall bring before the proper committee requests for appropriations for fiscal years, listing the salaries and estimated expense of each department of extension work.

The Agricultural Committee shall examine and approve all claims filed against Iowa County by the Extension Department.

The Agricultural Committee has in the past requested the assistance of agricultural leaders of the county in the formation of an agricultural program for the year. This privilege is to continue.

When a county becomes a soil conservation district, the Agricultural Committee automatically becomes supervisor of said district and must sign all contracts with those who enter into soil conservation contracts.

The Agricultural Committee shall act in an advisory capacity on all agricultural appropriations unless otherwise instructed by the County Board.

#### Duties of Personnel Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To meet with the State Auditors to study and examine the with the Statutes or when called upon for this purpose, also to designate the duties and responsibilities of the different offices.
- To hear and consider grievances reported by county departments, county officers and county employees and to make their recommendations to the County Board.
  - 3. All matters pertaining to clerk hire, working hours and

conditions, departmental problems or questions shall be referred to this committee.

- 4. To meet annually not later than October 15 of each year.
  Dutles of Committee on Clerk's, Treasurer's and Highway Accounts
  It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:
- To meet with the State Auditors to study and examine the report on the accounts of the County Clerk, County Treasurer and Highway Department, and to make a report to the County Board.
- To audit the Accounts of the Justices of Iowa County as provided by the Wisconsin Statutes.
- 3. To approve the reports of the County Clerk and County Treasurer before being presented to the County Board.

Duties of Committee on District Attorney, Register of Deeds

#### and Clerk of Courts Accounts

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To approve the reports of the District Attorney, Register of Deeds and Clerk of Courts.

#### Duties of Public Property Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To supervise and have charge of the Court House, County Jail and the grounds of these buildings and the Gov. Dodge home site.
  - 2. To keep in repair and good condition these properties.
- 3. In order to maintain uniformity of equipment, the Public Property Committee shall purchase the equipment for all the offices in the Court House with the following exceptions — no office equipment shall be purchased for the County Agent's office, Welfare office or Highway Department, except when such purchases are made from the General Fund.
- This Committee shall function during the year and when the County Board is not in session.

Duties of County Superintendent of Schools Committee It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To act as an advisory committee on all matters pertaining to the office of the County Superintendent of Schools, excepting those duties governed by statute.
- 2. To check the superintendent's accounts and make recommendations to the board in matters of expense and appropriation.

Duties of the Committee on County Hospital and Home
It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To examine the accounts of the Hospital and Home.
- 2. To compare the vouchers as filed with the County Clerk

with the records of the institutions and to compare the revenues received at the Hospital and Home with the receipts issued by the County Treasurer.

- To act as an advisory committee with the Board of Trustees in the maintenance, repairs and construction of buildings.
- 4. To report to the County Board, but in no way interfere with the management of the Hospital and Home by the Board of Trustees as established by law.

#### Duties of the Printing Committee

#### It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To accept bids on the printing of the County Board Proceedings, stationery envelopes for county officers and Court Calendars.
- 2. To act on all matters of printing referred to them by the County Board.

#### **Duties of Conservation Committee**

#### It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To audit the accounts of any money appropriated by the County Board for conservation work.
- To supervise the purchase of equipment and supplies in which the money appropriated by the County Board is used.
- To have charge of and advise the Iowa County Board of all
  matters relative to conservation of the natural resources of the
  county and to cooperate with all county, state and federal organizations in the development of the same.

#### **Duties of Highway Study Committee**

#### It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To receive all petitions referred to it by the County Board, by the regular highway committee and any citizen group relating to the construction, relocation, maintenance and repairs of any Federal, State or County road in the county and report their recommendations to the next meeting of the County Board.
- To confer with the regular Highway Committee on all allocations and grants of Federal and State funds and on any other highway matters of major importance.
  - 3. This committee is merely advisory.

#### Duties of the Health Committee

#### It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To act in an advisoy capacity with the County Nurse on all types of health programs.
- Annually plan and recommend the budget for the health program.

#### Duties of the Iowa County Board of Public Welfare

- 1. At the first meeting of such board, elect from their number, a chairman, a secretary, and such other officers as they deem necessary. Vacancies in such offices shall be filled for the unexpired terms. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings when present, and shall countersign all actions taken by the board. In case of the absence of a chairman for any meeting the members present shall choose a temporary chairman.
- Appoint a county director of public welfare subject to the provisions of s. 49.50 (2) to (5) and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder,
- 3. Supervise the working of the county department of public welfare and shall be a policy-making by determining the broad outlines and principles governing the administration of the functions, duties and powers assigned to said a parament under s. 46.22 (4) and (5).
- 4. Whenever it determines that there is a need therefor, appoint committees consisting of residents of the county, which committee shall advise with the board on any meters for which they are created, but members of such committees shall serve without compensation.
- 5. Consult with the county director of public welfare concerning the preparation of the annual budget, the annual report of the county department of public welfare and the appointment of necessary personnel.

#### RESOLUTION NO. 17

## COUNTY AID CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1962

SECTION I. The County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the county for highway work in the year 1962 under the provisions of Section 20.420 and Chapter 83 of the Statutes, and the additional sums herein appropriated, shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

SECTION II. COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENT. WHEREAS the State Highway Commission has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be Two Hundred One Thousand Eight Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$201,800.00) will become available at the end of the fiscal year under the provisions of Sections 83.10 and 20.420 (83) and (84) of the Statutes, for the county trunk highway system in the county, but the actual amount will not be known until the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1962.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the said sum to the extent required to match and supplement Federal aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any Federal projects located on the county trunk highway system of said county, which are not recovered from Federal funds, and to expend any balance for constructing, repairing, and maintaining such county trunk highway system and the bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 83.10 (1) of the Statutes, and to reimburse the general fund for any expenditures that may be made therefrom pursuant to Section 83.01 (6) of the Statutes. The distribution to such purposes is estimated, but not specifically directed, to be as follows:

SECTION III. WHEREAS it appears that certain additional highway improvements in the county are necessary and warranted. BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby appropriate the following sums for the purpose hereinafter set forth:

(1) For the maintenance of the County Trunk Highway Sys-

tem and matching Federal Aid Secondary Funds, Snow Removal and Ice Removal the sum of Two Hundred Ten Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$210,000.00).

- (2) For emergency road or bridge repairs or construction, the necessity for which is determined by the County Highway Committee and for which other funds are not available, the sum of Thirty Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$30,000.00).
- (3) For the purchase of machinery and for machinery repairs not to exceed the sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand and No/100. Dollars. Received from Machinery Rental.
- (4) For the purchase of county gravel pits and stone quarries the sum of Received from Sale of Materials.
- (5) For administration, including salaries, per diem, officer and travel expense of the County Highway Committee, the County Highway Commissioner, his clerks and assistants not paid from construction or maintenance funds, the sum of Thirteen Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$13,000.00).
- (6) For Traffic Regulation the sum of Fifteen Thousand Five Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$15,500.00).

Total Authorized in this Section \$268,500.00

The County Clerk is directed to levy the special benefit assessments made herein as special charges against the respective municipalities as provided by law.

SECTION IV. WHEREAS the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefor,

BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the county budget, for which provision is herein made, and any balance remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year.

SECTION V. WHEREAS the exact amount of the funds that will become available from the state for highway purposes in the county under Section 20.420 of the Statutes will not be known until on or after June 30, 1962,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as herein-before authorized, from any funds in the county treasury that are not required for the purposes for which appropriated prior to August 1, 1962, and to reimburse such funds in the county treasury from the sums received under Section 20.420 of the Statutes.

  - (4) Whenever it determines that there is a need therefor, appoint committees consisting of residents of the county, which committee shall advise with the board on any matters for which they are created, but members of such committees shall serve without compensation.
- (5) Consult with the county director of public welfare concerning the preparation of the annual budget, the annual report of the operation of the county department of public welfare and the appointment of necessary personnel.

Gentlemen:

We are submitting the annual report of the Iowa County Public Welfare Department for the year 1961. In this report, we are presenting interpretative material for a better understanding of what this agency is attempting to do. We hope that this report will give those reading it a picture of the welfare agency and how it is operating, for the best interest of the people that it has been set up to serve.

This report includes all the expenditures for the categorical aids such as Old Age Assistance, Aid to Dependent Children, Aid to Dependent Children in Foster Homes, Blind Aid, Aid to the Totally and Permanently Disabled, as well as for General Relief and Administration.

The Iowa County Welfare Board and agency staff are very appreciative of the fine cooperation received from the Iowa County Board of Supervisors, county officials, the Iowa County Medical Society, the Dodgeville hospitals, Iowa County dentits, optometrists, Iowa County lawyers and other professional and lay people of Iowa County, with whom we have come in contact during the past year. It would have been difficult, if not impossible to have given Iowa County an efficient and business like welfare administration without this fine help and cooperation.

#### OLD AGE ASSISTANCE

This continues to be our largest and most expensive program. This is due, to a large part, for the need for regular and prolonged medical care by many of our Old Age Assistance recipients. While it is necessary, the fact remains that it is costly.

In 1961 cash payments were made to an average of 255 persons per month. These Old Age Assistance recipients are now older and are living longer. This means that they are in need of a considerable amount of medical care, such as physician's services, hospitalization, nursing home care, drugs, dental care, optometrical services, etc. As the cost of these services increases the assistance payments increase proportionately.

To offset these increased medical costs, to some extent, as of July 1, 1961 the Federal percentage of reimbursement per Old Age Assistance case increased from \$49,662 to \$50.55. Then, effective October 1, 1961, the Federal reimbursement per Old Age Assistance case was increased from \$50.55 to \$51.35 per month. The State reimbursement was also changed, effective July 1, 1961. This reimbursement is now 50 per cent of such expenditures for vendor medical payments, after deduction of Federal aid received for such expenditures.

#### AID TO DEPENDENT CHILDREN

This agency's second largest program in the number of cases and cost is the Aid to Dependent Children Program. Iowa County provided care for a monthly average of 37 individual cases involving an average of 105 children in 1961. Included in this program, are the foster home cases. There were a monthly average of 10 children in foster home care during 1961.

The amount of Federal reimbursement for each Aid to De-

pendent Children case went from \$21.098 prior to July 1, 1961 to \$20.903 effective July 1, 1961. There has been no current change in State reimbursement and it remains at 35 per cent.

#### AID TO THE TOTALLY AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED

Due to the more liberal interpretation of a disabled person, by the 1959 Wisconsin State Legislature, the number of persons receiving this form of aid has continued to be on the increase. The definition of a disabled person was even more broadly interpreted by the 1961 Wisconsin State Legislature. At the present rate of increase, the agency's Disabled Aid Program will soon be the second largest program, next only to the Old Age Assistance Program. A large number of General Relief cases have qualified for and are currently receiving an Aid to Disabled grant, due to a permanent physical or mental disability or a combination of both. It is anticipated that even more cases will qualify for a Disabled Aid grant in 1962. The average caseload in 1961 was 19 cases per month, an increase of 7 cases per month over 1960.

The amount of Federal reimbursement for each Disabled Aid case went from \$42.585 to \$43.385 effective October 1, 1961. The State reimbusement for Aid to Disabled remained unchanged at 35 per cent.

#### AID TO THE BLIND

The Blind Aid program has continued to be a relatively small

program, in the number of cases carried. However, following the general pattern of the other programs, the medical costs have been on the increase. Due to the cost of medical care, for one Blind Ald recipient, it was found necessary during 1961 to have \$750.00 transferred from the "Isabled Aid Account to the Blind Aid Account. The average number of cases during the year was six.

The Federal reimbursement for each Blind Aid case increased from \$42.585 to \$43.385 effective October 1, 1961. The State reimbursement for Blind Aid remained unchanged at 35 per cent.

#### GENERAL RELIEF

9,186,49

The costs for General Relief in Iowa County during 1961 were higher than they were in 1960. This was due, to a large extent, to higher medical costs. The relief cost from January through December 1961 amounted to \$28,547.96. The refunds received during this period amounted to \$4,294.97. The relief costs from January through December 1960 amounted to \$23,612.10. The refunds received during this period amounted to \$6,263.14. Thus, when not taking into consideration the refunds, the relief costs for 1961 were \$4,935.86 higher than they were in 1960. However, this is less than the amount spent in 1959, which was \$32,074.19. The average monthly costs during this twelve months period amounted to \$2,378.97 in 1961, as compared to \$1,967.68 in 1960.

This agency has continued to make every effort to get able-bodied men on jobs. The Iowa County Work Relief Project, whereby able-bodied men on relief are referred to the Iowa County Highway Department for employment, is continued to be used. The men work for ten hours a day, five days a week, at an hourly rate of 80c. The relief earned is given in the form of food orders and general purchase orders for other needs, such as fuel, rent, clothing and utilities. Due to the lack of able-bodied men, the Work Relief Project is not currently functioning. However, when and if the need arises, it will be reactivated.

While the food allowance for General Relief recipients is reduced by 25% from the allowance made for Social Security Aids recipients, especially in the large General Relief families, for those able-bodies men employed on the County Work Relief Project, a full food allowance is made for him and his family. This is an incentive, for those able to work and needing relief.

Due to the continued high medical costs, in several coveral Relief cases, and the cost of care for those with legal settlement in Iowa County, who live in other counties, the relief costs have continued to be high.

#### AGENCY ADMINISTRATION

The cost of Administration is the expense of operating the Iowa County Public Welfare Department. This includes the salaries of the eight employees, per diem and travel of the three County Welfare Board members and the expense of necessary travel by staff members to carry out the function of the agency and the office maintenance expenses.

Since the reports on Administration from the State Department of Public Welfare, Division of Public Assistance, are always two mouths in arrears, we are reporting the amounts of expenditures for the entire year of 1961. However, we are estimating the reimbursement from the State and Federal Governments for the months of November and December 1961.

#### MEDICAL CARE

The medical costs for 1961 are higher than they were in 1960. There were three months in which the medical payments exceeded the money payments. The reasons for the increased costs are due to higher nursing home rates, hospital rates, physician's services and the need for optometrical services, dental care and the use of medicine and drugs that are expensive. The continued use of medical care by our public welfare recipients, causes the cost for such care to remain high. As previously stated, our recipients are older and live longer, thus, have more need for medical care. This is a state-wide trend and this county is no exception. In accordance with the policy of Iowa County, if medical care is recommended and needed, the recipient receives it.

During the past year our crusher produced 120,941 cubic yards of crushed stone and our Hot Mix Plant produced 24,129 cubic yards of bituminous mix materials.

Your Highway Committee in 1961 has again followed their policy to give Iowa County the best in construction and maintenance.

In our new construction we are widening and raising roads to lessen the problem of snow removal. We are using a heavier base to withstand the increased traffic loads. All our black top is the hot mix type which costs no more and is longer lasting, paver-laid blacktop is evener and smoother.

Our employees are very proficient in operating our costly ma-

chinery and are willing to be called out at all hours for snow removal and ice control which benefits all who use our state and county roads.

We purchased two more 10-yard tandem trucks in 1961; two Tournapulls for construction; one Adams 660 Motor Grader to be used for construction and snow removal; a Truck Scales so a more accurate record may be had of our paving material; a Sun Regulator to test Generators and electrical equipment; an Electric Welder; a Shouldering Machine and much other necessary equipment; Patrol Trucks and a new Commissioner Car.

We wish to express our appreciation to the Honorable Board of Supervisors for their consideration in all requests by the Committee.

We also wish to thank the Commissioner; Patrol Superintendent; Highway Clerk; Deputy Clerk; Foremen; Mechanics; Traffic Patrolmen and all other Department Employees as well as the personnel from the State Division Office. All have helped the Committee to maintain a highly efficient Department.

#### OFFICE OF DISTRICT ATTORNEY

**Iowa County** 

Dodgeville, Wisconsin January 18, 1962

Hon. Iowa County Board c/o Kenneth Palzkill, Clerk Dodgeville, Wisconsin Gentlemen:

On November 16, 1961, I issued an opinion answering your question as to when a raise voted by the present members of the County Board of their own compensation can take effect. My opinion then was that under Section 66.195 of the statutes that the Board could increase is own compensation to take effect immediately.

However, on the date this opinion was rendered the latest session laws had not yet been published by the Wisconsin Legislative Service to which we subscribe covering October, 1961, acts of the Legislature. I now find that Section 66.195 of the statutes was amended to become effective October 21, 1961, and that this section, as amended, contains the additional wording set forth below, which it had never previously contained:

"The power granted by this section shall not extend to elected officials who by virtue of their office are entitled to participate in the establishment of compensation attending their office."

Threfore I now inform you that it is my opinion that any resolution adopted subsequent to October 21, 1961, by the Iowa County Board, increasing their own compensation would not come within the special provisions of Section 66.195 of the statutes.

Therefore, it is my opinion that the compensation to County Board members can only be altered by complying with Section 59.03 (2) (f) of the statutes, which recites that "any board may, at its annual meeting, by a two-thirds vote of all members, fix the compensation of the board members to be next elected. Any board may also provide additional compensation for the chairman."

Regarding compensation I also refer you to the provision of 59.03 (2) (h) and 59.06 as to compensation for committees.
