SESSIONS of 1962

RULES FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE IOWA CO. BOARD

- Rule 1. The hour of meeting shall be 10:00 o'clock a. m. and 2 o'clock p. m., unless a different hour shall be prescribed.
- Rule 2. The Chairman shall call the meeting to order at the hour fixed for the meeting. (1) The Clerk shall call the roll of members and (2) a majority being present, the journal of the preceeding meeting shall be read, that any mistakes may be corrected, (3) Motions may be offered.
- Rule 3. The Chairman shall preserve order and decorum, and may speak on points of order in preference to other members.
- Rule 4. The Board shall elect at their annual April meeting a chairman and also a vice-chairman who shall act in the absence, disability, death or resignation of the chairman or request to act and possess powers of the Chairman.
- Rule 5. The Chairman, Vice-Chairman and a committee of three members of the board's selection shall be elected for the purpose of appointing committees and this committee of three will act as a committee on committees.
- Rule 6. All questions shall be stated by the chair. If the Chairman doubts as to the voice of the majority he or any member of the Board may call for a vote by either roll call or rising vote on the question to be decided.
- Rule 7. The following standing committees shall be appointed: Committee on Claims, Committee on Equalization, Committee on Treasurer's, Clerk's, and Highway Accounts, Committee on Finance, Taxation and Budget, Committee on Hospital and Home, Committee on Resolutions from without the County, Committee on Tax Claims and Addressograph, Committee on Bonds and Salaries, Committee on Register of Deeds, Clerk of Court and District Attorney Accounts, Committee on Public Property, Committee on Publishing and Printing, Committee on County Highway Study, Superintendent of Schools Committee, Committee on Agriculture, Committee on Personnel and Sheriff's Committee, Committee on Public Health, Committee on Conservation, Committee on Civil Defense, Airport and Industrial Development Committee, Service Officer Committee, Library Committee. The size of committees shall be limited to not less than three nor more than five members. No member of the Highway Committee may serve on any other committee of the County Board.
- Rule 8. After the journal shall have been read the order of business shall be as follows: 1. Letters, Petitions, Remonstrations, Communications and Accompanying Documents. 2. Resolutions. 3. Reports of committee, first standing and afterwards, special committees. 4. Miscellaneous business.
- Rule 9. Every member present shall vote unless excused by the Chairman.

- Rule 10. Every vote taken in regard to levying taxes, appropriating money, or dividing or altering the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be taken by Yeas and Nays, and the same shall be entered on the journal.
- Rule 11. The Yeas and Nays on any question shall be entered on the journal at the request of one of the members present.
- Rule 12. No petitions, resolutions or motions having for its object the division or alteration of the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be entered on or considered at the same session of the Board at which it was introduced, but the same shall lie over for consideration at the next regular adjourned or special session of the Board.
- Rule 13. No mention, other than the receiving of petitions, remonstrations, communications, claims, and the reference of the same to appropriate Committees or to adjourn shall be acted upon in the absence of any committee in the regular discharge of their duty unless such motion had been made at a previous meeting and a special assignment had for its consideration.
- Rule 14. No report or resolution appropriating any money shall be acted upon until the next day after presentation without permission of a majority of the members elected.
- Rule 15. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern in all cases where they are applicable.
- Rule 16. Any of the foregoing rules, except Rules 10 and 12 may be rescinded, changed or suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- Rule 17. Rules Nos. 10 and 12 may be rescinded, altered or suspended by a two-thirds vote of all the members entitled to seats on the County Board.
- Rule 18. The Committee on Equalization shall render their report immediately after roll call on the first day of the session but said report shall not be acted upon on the day which it is presented.
- Rule 19. The Chairman shall appoint two or more members of the Board, who shall visit the County Hospital and Home any time within one month after their appointment and file their written report as to the condition found after their visit. And for each succeeding month thereafter, a like committee shall be appointed whose duties shall be the same as the first committee, but no member shall be appointed on such committee oftener than once in twelve months, the compensation to be \$5.00 per visit in full for said trip.

Rule 20. No informal ballot cast by this Board shall be declared a formal ballot. In no case shall any official be elected by this Board by casting a unanimous vote in favor of any candidate or nominee.

Rule 21. The Board shall meet in regular session on the third Tuesday of January of each year.

Rule 22. All officers elected by the County Board except those elected at the April session, shall be nominated and all nominations lay over to the following day before they are voted on.

DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Duties of the County Highway Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. The County Highway Committee shall have supervision over the maintenance and construction of all road and bridges as provided by the statutes and shall submit to the County Board an annual report including the report of the County Highway Committee of all receipts and expenditures in the County Highway Department and shall submit an annual budget and recommendations for the tax levy for road and bridge purposes to the County Board at the annual session and any other duties as outlined in the statutes or as directed by County Board Action.
- The County Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the Iowa County Traffic Department.
- 3. The Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the operation of the County Ambulance.

Duties of the Sheriff's Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- The Sheriff's Committee shall examine all accounts and claims filed against the County by the Sheriff and his deputies, and make report to the County Board at each regular meeting thereof.
- The Sheriff's Committee shall also have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the county police radio system, and shall act upon such other matters as may be referred to it by the County Board.

Duties of the Resolution Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To receive and examine all resolutions from without the County and make report thereof to the County Board.

Duties of the General Claims Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To audit, allow or disallow all claims filed in the office of the County Clerk or referred to the committee, and shall file a schedule of such claims allowed, with the County Clerk, for payment and shall make a report to the County Board of all claims audited.

Duties of the Equalization Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To have supervision over and make an equalization of the assessments on all property in the county for taxes between the several towns, villages and cities of the county.
- It shall be the duty of this committee to make a detailed report thereof at the annual session of the board.
- This committee shall meet annualy with the Supervisor of Assessments and County Assessors at their spring meeting.

Duties of the Tax Claims Committee

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. To consider, examine and report to the county board, its findings in all matters of illegal assessments, tax titles and delinquent lands that may come before the board for action.
- 2. To supervise all delinquent taxes returned to the County, supervise the taking of tax deeds, supervise the sale of real estate taken on tax deed to the end that property is returned to the tax roll and aid in the collection of delinquent taxes. Where the value of the property involved warrants it the Committee shall have the power to appraise the property and in its discretion insure it for the benefit of the County.
- 3. To make appraisals pursuant to Chapter 75.69 of the county owned tax deed lands.
- To sell and dispose to the best interests of the county those lands to which the county has taken tax deeds.
- 5. To employ the services of the county surveyor to establish the location of county owned property when necessary.
- 6. To authorize and recommend the county treasurer at their discretion to assign to heirs, mortgagees or adjacent property owners, tax certificates purchased by the county at the annual sale of tax certificates.

Duties of the Finance Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To prepare and present to the County Board at the Annual Session the Budget and Tax Levy; first in a temporary form, and finally in a complete form as changed during the County Board Session.
- To report upon all resolutions and petitions for appropriations presented to the Board.
- 3. To report and make recommendations on the finances of the County from time to time when required.

Duties of the Bonds and Salaries Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To recommend to the County Board the compensation of County officers and employees.
- To determine the amount of Bonds to be furnished by the County officers to the County and to report on the sufficiency of such bonds.
- To designate and report to the County Board the Banks of Iowa County that may apply as a depository for county funds.

Duties of Agricultural Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

 To perform all duties prescribed by law as further instructed by the County Board.

The general duty of the Committee is to protect and enhance the financial interest of the county in all things agricultural.

This committee, working in conjunction with state and federal authorities shall according to statute, enter into, consummate and cancel contracts with all extension workers and be the authority in the matter of policy of the extension office.

This committee shall bring before the proper committee requests for appropriations for fiscal years, listing the salaries and estimated expense of each department of extension work.

The Agricultural Committee shall examine and approve all claims filed against Iowa County by the Extension Department.

The Agricultural Committee has in the past requested the assistance of agricultural leaders of the county in the formation of an agricultural program for the year. This privilege is to continue.

When a county becomes a soil conservation district, the Agricultural Committee automatically becomes supervisor of said district and must sign all contracts with those who enter into soil conservation contracts.

The Agricultural Committee shall act in an advisory capacity on all agricultural appropriations unless otherwise instructed by the County Board.

Duties of Personnel Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To set the policy of each department when not in conflict with the Statutes or when called upon for this purpose, also to designate the duties and responsibilities of the different offices.
- To hear and consider grievances reported by county departments, county officers and county employees and to make their recommendations to the County Board.

- All matters pertaining to clerk hire, working hours and conditions, departmental problems or questions shall be referred to this committee.
- 4. To meet annually not later than October 15 of each year.

 Duties of Committee on Clerk's, Treasurer's and Highway Accounts
 It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:
- To meet with the State Auditors to study and examine the report on the accounts of the County Clerk, County Treasurer and Highway Department, and to make a report to the County Board.
- To audit the Accounts of the Justices of Iowa County as provided by the Wisconsin Statutes.
- 3. To approve the reports of the County Clerk and County Treasurer before being presented to the County Board.

Duties of Committee on District Attorney, Register of Deeds

and Clerk of Courts Accounts

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To approve the reports of the District Attorney, Register of Deeds and Clerk of Courts.

Duties of Public Property Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To supervise and have charge of the Court House, County Jail and the grounds of these buildings and the Gov. Dodge home site.
 - 2. To keep in repair and good condition these properties.
- 3. In order to maintain uniformity of equipment, the Public Property Committee shall purchase the equipment for all the offices in the Court House with the following exceptions — no office equipment shall be purchased for the County Agent's office, Welfare office or Highway Department, except when such purchases are made from the General Fund.
- 4. This Committee shall function during the year and when the County Board is not in session.

Duties of County Superintendent of Schools Committee It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To act as an advisory committee on all matters pertaining to the office of the County Superintendent of Schools, excepting those duties governed by statute.
- To check the Superintendent's accounts and make recommendations to the board in matters of expense and appropriation.

Duties of the Committee on County Hospital and Home
If Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

1. To examine the accounts of the Hospital and Home.

- To compare the vouchers as filed with the County Clerk with the records of the institutions and to compare the revenues received at the Hospital and Home with the receipts issued by the County Treasurer.
- To act as an advisory committee with the Board of Trustees in the maintenance, repairs and construction of buildings.
- 4. To report to the County Board, but in no way interfere with the management of the Hospital and Home by the Board of Trustees as established by law.

Duties of the Printing Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To accept bids on the printing of the County Board Proceedings, stationery envelopes for county officers and Court Calendars.
- To act on all matters of printing referred to them by the County Board.

Duties of Conservation Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To audit the accounts of any money appropriated by the County Board for conservation work.
- 2. To supervise the purchase of equipment and supplies in which the money appropriated by the County Board is used.
- 3. To have charge of and advise the Iowa County Board of all matters relative to conservation of the natural resources of the county and to cooperate with all county, state and federal organizations in the development of the same.

Duties of Highway Study Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

- To receive all petitions referred to it by the County Board, by the regular highway committee and any citizen group relating to the construction, relocation, maintenance and repairs of any Federal, State or County road in the county and report their recommendations to the next meeting of the County Board.
- To confer with the regular Highway Committee on all allocations and grants of Federal and State funds and on any other highway matters of major importance.
 - 3. This committee is merely advisory.

Duties of the Health Committee

It Shall be the Duty of This Committee:

 To act in an advisoy capacity with the County Nurse on all types of health programs. 2. Annually plan and recommend the budget for the health program.

Duties of the Iowa County Board of Public Welfare

- 1. At the first meeting of such board, elect from their number, a chairman, a secretary, and such other officers as they deem necessary. Vacancies in such offices shall be filled for the unexpired terms. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings when present, and shall countersign all actions taken by the board. In case of the absence of a chairman for any meeting the members present shall choose a temporary chairman.
- 2. Appoint a county director of public welfare subject to the provisions of s. 49.50 (2) to (5) and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.
- 3. Supervise the working of the county department of public welfare and shall be a policy-making body determining the broad outlines and principles governing the administration of the functions, duties and powers assigned to said department under s. 46,22 (4) and (5).
- 4. Whenever it determines that there is a need therefor, appoint committees consisting of residents of the county, which committee shall advise with the board on any matter for which they are created, but members of such committees shall serve without compensation.
- Consult with the county director of public welfare concerning the preparation of the annual budget, the annual report of the county department of public welfare and the appointment of necessary personnel.

COUNTY AID CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1963

SECTION I. The County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the county for highway work in the year 1963 under the provisions of Section 20.420 and Chapter 83 of the Statutes, and the additional sums herein appropriated, shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

SECTION II. COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENT. WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be One Hundred ninety-four thousand seven hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$194,700.00) will become available at the end of the fiscal year under the provisions of Sections \$3.10 and 20.420(83) and (84) of the Statutes, for the county trunk highway system in the county, but the actual amount will not be known until the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1963.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the said sum to the extent required to match and supplement Federal aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any Federal projects located on the county trunk highway system of said county, which are not recovered from Federal funds, and to expend any balance for constructing, repairing, and maintaining such county trunk highway system and the bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 83.10(1) of the Statutes, and to reimburse the general fund for any expenditures that may be made therefrom pursuant to Section 83.01(6) of the Statutes. The distribution to such purposes is estimated, but not specifically directed, to be as follows:

SECTION III. WHEREAS, various towns and villages hereinafter named have filed petitions for county aid for roads under the provisions of Section 83.14 of the Statutes,

BE IT RESOLVED, that said petitions are hereby granted and county appropriations made as follows:

- (1) For the maintenance of the County Trunk Highway System the sum of Two Hundred twenty thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$220,000.00).
- (2) For emergency road or bridge repairs or construction, the necessity for which is determined by the County Highway Committee and for which other funds are not available, the sum of Thirty-thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$30,000.00).
- (3) For the purchase of machinery and for machinery repairs not to exceed the sum of \$150,000.00. Received from Machinery Rental.
- (4) For the purchase of county gravel pits and stone quarries the sum of Received from the Sale of Materials
- (5) For administration, including salaries, per diem, officer and travel expense of the County Highway Committee, the County Highway Commissioner, his clerks and assistants not paid from construction or maintenance funds, the sum of Fifteen thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$15,000.00).
- (6) For Traffic Regulation the sum of Fifteen thousand five hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$(15,500.00).

Total Authorized in this Section\$280,500.00

The County Clerk is directed to levy the special benefit assessments made herein as special charges against the respective municipalities as provided by law.

SECTION IV. WHEREAS, the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefor,

BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the county budget, for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year.

SECTION V. WHEREAS, the exact amount of the funds that will become available from the state for highway purposes in the county under Section 20.420 of the Statutes will not be known until on or after June 30, 1963.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as herein-before authorized, from any funds in the county treasury that are not required for the purposes for which appropriated prior to August 1, 1963, and to reimburse such funds in the county treasury from the sums received under Section 20.420 of the Statutes.

SECTION VI. WHEREAS, the County Highway Committee and the County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenance of highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory and administrative duties,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Highway Commissioner shall have authority to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate such personnel as he deems necessary for such purposes, provided however that the County Highway Committee may by action recorded in its minutes determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate any such person. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen, laborers, foremen, clerks, stenographers, or other employees necessary to carry on such activities.

Mr. Robert Hoskins, Corporation Counsel for the Welfare Department addressed the Board regarding an ordinance to provide authorization for the Iowa County Public Welfare Department to participate in a Civil Defense Program under Sec. 22.01 (4) (J) Wisconsin Statutes.

Mr. Hoskins also addressed the Board regarding Resolution No. 27 in connection with the duties of the Corporation Counsel and the District Attorney.

Sup. Miller moved Resolution (No. 27) be referred to the Personnel Committee and it be returned at the January Session.

Seconded and carried.

Ordinance (No. 44) authorizing the Iowa County Public Welfare Dept. to participate in a Civil Defense Program was read.

To the Honorable Chairman and Members of the Iowa County Board of Supervisors:

We, the undersigned members of the County Board of Public Welfare, hereby petition the Iowa County Board of Supervisors to adopt the Ordinance, to-wit:

ORDINANCE NO. 44

An Ordinance to provide authorization for the Iowa County Public Welfare Department to participate in a Civil Defense Program under Section 22.01 (4) (j). Wisconsin Statutes.

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Iowa does ordain as follows:

- Any prior ordinance delegating duties to the Iowa County Public Welfare Department to perform welfare services in relation to civilian defense is hereby repealed.
- 2. (a) That the Iowa County Public Welfare Department is hereby designated to participate in the civil defense plan as organized by the county civil defense director in accordance with policies, procedures and standards of the State Department of Public Welfare and shall for such purpose have the authority to participate in any civil defense activity, whether it be a case of enemy attack, national disaster, Federal alert or practice or test runs.
 - (b) Shall establish an approved plan for a line of succession to key agency positions for preservation and protection of essential documentsand records and the protection of duplicate records; personal services and other costs related to the continuity of operations of the Public Assistance programs in an emergency, including disaster preparedness training and the development and establishment of offices essential for the resumption of operations after the emergency.
 - (c) That these duties shall include without limitation by reason of enumeration:

"Feeding, clothing; housing or lodging in private and congregate facilities; registration; locating and reuniting families, care of unaccompanied children, the aged, the handicapped, and other groups needing specialized care or service; necessary financial or other assistance; counseling and referral services to families and individuals; aid to welfare institutions under national emergency or post-attack conditions; and all other feasible welfare aid and services to people in need during a civil defense emergency. Such measures include organization, direction and provision of services to be instituted before attack, in the event of strategic or tactical evacuation, and after attack in the event of evacuation or of refuge in shelters.

- (d) Such other welfare services as may be delegated by the State Department of Public Welfare.
- 3. (a) The agency in performance of civil defense activitie, may employ additional administrative staff, either full time or part time. Such staff shall be employed under the merit system classification and salary range, pursuant to Sec. 49.50 (2) to (5), and Rule PW-PA 10.
 - (b) The County Agency in the performance of civil defense activities may also make use of voluntary workers who shall receive no salary, but who may be paid necessary and usual out-of-pocket expense incurred in performing this work; such payment to be made from the administration account of said agency.

The following is a list of activities accomplished by your Highway Department in 1962:

- C. T. H. "A" Jct. U. S. 151 westerly 3.667 Miles. Bituminous surface course with F. A. S. and county funds by county forces.
- C. T. H. "S" Jct. S. T. H. 23 to Waldwick Mineral Point town line, 3.76 miles. Bituminous surface course with county funds by county forces.
- C. T. H. "N" Jct. S. T. H. 137 to C. T. H. "NN", 2.894 miles. Grade and base course with F. A. S. and county funds. Let by contract. Purchased right of way with county funds.
- C. T. H. "G" Jct. C. T. H. "X" to C. T. H. "E", 3.36 miles. Purchased right of way, grade and base with county funds by county forces.

C. T. H. "DD" — Jct. S. T. H. 39 — East, 1.2 miles. Purchased right of way, grade and base with county funds by county forces.

C. T. H. "W" — Jct. S. T. H. 39 to S. T. H. 191, approximately 4.4 miles. Plans and survey with county funds.

Cox Hollow Park: Bituminous surface course. Parking area done by county forces with state funds.

Blue Mounds State Park: Clearing, grubbing, grading, base course and bituminous surface by county forces with state funds.

Wisconsin River Boat Landing: Survey, purchase of right of way, clearing, leveling and shaping. Also shale fill, base course, rip rapping, constructing ramp, demarkation posts and bumper blocks with state and county funds by county forces.

Constructed and repaired county aid bridges with Town and county funds by county and town forces.

General maintenance, A. F. E.'s — Snow and ice removal on state roads.

During the past year our crusher produced 131,931 cubic yards of crushed stone and our hot plant produced 14,957 cubic yards of bituminous materials.

Your Highway Committee is making every effort to improve the operation of the department by adding more necessary equipment and replacing some outmoded, expensive-to-operate machinery.

We purchased with approval of the County Board a new emergency ambulance which can handle four patients and with the efficient service from the operating crew it is the ultimate in emergency ambulance service.

All our one-way snow plows are the quick hitch type. We purchased a very good used Tournadozer plow and wing for snow removal and this can be used for construction in summer. Also the following machinery and equipment:

Two Ford tandem trucks.

Five tractors with mowers, four with loaders - front end.

One small roller and trailer.

Two motor graders with snow plows and wings.

One Go-Devil crane to be used for heavy lifting, and is designed for road use and can be taken to job site if necessary.

One P. & H. crane to be used for boulder busting in quarry.

Two salt sheds — one erected in Highland and one in Hollandale.

Purchased other tools and machinery necessary for the efficient operation of the department. Also purchased a new car for the Patrol Superintendent.

We wish to express our appreciation to the Honorable Board of Supervisors for their considerations of requests made by the Committee.

We also wish to thank the Commissioner, Patrol Superintendent, Highway Clerk, Deputy Clerks, Foremen, Mechanics, Ambulance Crew, Traffic Patrolmen, Snow Plowing, Salting and Sanding Crews because of their efficiency and availability to be called at any hour so that our highways are kept open and in good condition except in cases when the storms continue to make the operation of equipment dangerous and impractical. Also all our maintenance and construction employees who are very proficient on any job they may be called on to do. Also the personnel from the State Division Office who have been very helpful in all requests by the Committee.
