SESSIONS of 1979

RULES FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE IOWA COUNTY BOARD

Rule 1. The hour of meeting shall be 10:00 o'clock A.M. or 8:00 o'clock P.M., unless a different hour shall be prescribed.

Rule 2. The Chairperson shall call the meeting to order at the hour fixed for the meeting. (1) The clerk shall call the roll of members and (2) a majority being present, the journal of the preceding meeting, if printed copies are not available, shall be read, that any errors may be corrected.

Rule 3. The Chairperson shall preserve order and decorum, and may speak on points of order in preference to other members.

Rule 4. The Board shall elect at the April meeting in even numbered years, a chairperson and also a vice-chairperson who shall serve for a two year term. The vice-chairperson shall act in the absence, disability, death or resignation of the chairperson or on a request to act and possess powers of the chairperson.

Rule 5. The chairperson and vice-chairperson with the Committee on Committees shall appoint standing committees.

Rule 6. All questions shall be stated by the chair. If the chairperson doubts as to the voice of the majority the chairperson or any members of the Board may call for a vote by either roll call or rising vote on the questions to be decided.

Rule 7. The following committees shall be appointed: Committee on Claims, Printing, Audit and Property; Committee on Salary and Personnel; Committee on Finance, Equalization, Bonds and Insurance; Committee on Agriculture, Soil and Water Conservation Supervisors; Committee or Health & Institutions; Committee on Courts; Justice & Law Enforcement; Committee on Civil Defense; Area Manpower Planning Board Delegate; Department of Social Services Board: Committee on Tax Claims, Addressograph and Veterans Service Officer; Committee on Zoning and Planning, and Rural Planning Committee; Southwest Community Action Program Board; Memorial Hospital Board; Committee on Highways; Sheriff's Dept. Reorganization Committee; Landfill Committee; 51.42 Board -Iowa Co. Representatives Unified Board - Grant and Iowa Counties; Advisory Members of Commission on Aging; Advisory Council -Commission on Aging; Iowa County Commission on Aging Senior Citizens Service; Hodan Center Board Members; Regional Planning Commission; Iowa County Housing Authority; Hidden Valleys Committee; Committee on Resource Development; Legislative Committee; Southwest Wisconsin Library Board; County Traffic Safety Commission; Iowa County Board of Adjustment and Administrative Appeals Board; Joint County Transit Commission; Iowa County Recreation Board; Emergency Medical Services Council; Committee on Committees; Regional Policy Advisory Committee for S.W. Wisconsin (Iowa County Representatives); Mineral Point Airport Commission. The size of committees shall be limited to not less than three nor more than five members.

Rule 8. After the journal shall have been read the order of business shall be as follows: 1. Letters, Petitions, Remonstrations, Communications and Accompanying Documents. 2. Resolutions. 3. Reports of Committees, first standing and afterward special committees. 4. Miscellaneous business. All individuals and groups requesting to appear before the County Board, first appear before a committee and be referred to the Board by said Committee.

Rule 9. Every member present shall vote unless excused by the Chairperson.

Rule 10. Every vote taken in regard to levying taxes, appropriating money, or dividing or altering the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be taken by Yeas and Nayes, and the same shall be entered on the journal.

Rule 11. Roll Calls shall be taken by signed ballot. Ballot pads with names printed on pads will be furnished each supervisor.

Rule 12. No petitions, resolutions or motions having for its object the division or alteration of the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be entered on or considered at the same session of the Board at which it was introduced, but the same shall lie over for consideration at the next regular adjourned or special session of the Board.

Rule 13. Each member prior to speaking shall rise and address himself to and be recognized by the Chair. If two or more members arise at the same time the chairperson shall decide who shall speak first but in all other cases the member who arises and addresses the chair first shall have the preference.

Rule 14. No report or resolution appropriating any money shall be acted upon until the next day after presentation without permission of two-thirds of the members present.

Rule 15. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern in all cases where they are applicable.

Rule 16. Any of the foregoing rules, Except Rules 10 and 12 may be rescinded, changed or suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

Rule 17. Rules Nos. 10 and 12 may be rescinded, altered or suspended by a two-thirds vote of all the members entitled to seats on the County Board.

Rule 18. The Committee on Equalization shall render their report immediately after roll call on the first day of the session but said report shall not be acted upon the day it is presented.

Rule 19. No informal ballot cast by this Board shall be declared a formal ballot. In no case shall any official be elected by this Board by casting a unanimous vote in favor of any candidate or nominee.

Rule 20. The Board shall meet monthly on the third Tuesday, in addition to the statutory meetings in April and November of each year. Special meetings shall be held subject to the call of the Chair.

Rule 21. All officers elected by the County Board except those elected at the April session, shall be nominated and all nominations lay over to the following day before they are voted on.

Rule 22. All resolutions or petitions to be presented to a session of the County Board shall be presented five days in advance of the scheduled session and a report or copy shall be mailed to each County Supervisor. An emergency situation may grant an exception provided approval is given by two-thirds of the membership.

Rule 23. All purchases for the courthouse, courthouse annex and jail shall be channeled through the Purchasing Committee.

Rule 24. No County Supervisor be permitted to sit on any one Committee for more than six consecutive years.

Rule 25. No new business may be brought before the Board after 11:00 P.M.

DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Committee on Claims - Audit - Printing and Property

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To audit, allow or disallow all claims filed in the office of the county clerk or referred to the committee, and shall file a schedule of such claims allowed with the county clerk for payment and shall make a report to the County Board of all claims audited.

To meet with the State Auditors to study and examine the report on the accounts covered in their audit and make a report of the findings to the County Board.

 To accept bids on the printing of the County Board proceedings, stationery, envelopes and general printing for county officers and offices and court calendars.

 To act on all matters of printing referred to them by the County board or any department of the county.

5. To supervise and have charge of the courthouse, courthouse annex, county jail and the grounds of these buildings and the Gov. Dodge home site.

6. To keep in repair and good condition these properties.

7. In order to maintain uniformity of equipment, this committee shall purchase the equipment for all offices in the courthouse, courthouse annex and jail with the following exception — no office equipment shall be purchased for the Highway Department, except when such purchases are made from the general fund or a mutual agreement on cost savings can be reached, through volume purchases of miscellaneous supplies.

 This committee shall function during the year and when the County Board is not in session.

Committee on Welfare

It Shall Be the Duty of This Board:

 At the first meeting of such board, elect from their numbers, a chairperson, a secretary, and such other officers as they deem necessary. Vacancies in such offices shall be filled for the unexpired terms. The chairperson shall preside at all meetings when present, and shall countersign all actions taken by the board. In case of the absence of a chairperson for any meeting the members present shall choose a temporary chairperson.

2. Appoint a county director of public welfare subject to the provisions of s. 49.50 (2) to (5) and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.

3. Supervise the working of the county department of public welfare and shall be the policy-making body determining the broad outlines and principles governing the administration of the functions, duties and powers assigned to said department under s. 46.22 (4) and (5).

4. Whenever it determines that there is a need therefor, appoint committees consisting of residents of the county, which committee shall advise with the board on any matter for which they are created, but members of such committees shall serve without compensation.

Consult with the county director of public welfare concerning the preparation of the annual budget, the annual report of the county department of public welfare and the appointment of necessary personnel.

Committee on Highway

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

1. The County Highway Committee shall have supervision over the maintenance and construction of all roads and bridges as provided by statutes and shall submit to the County Board an annual report including the report of the County Highway Committee of all receipts and expenditures in the County Highway Department and shall submit an annual budget and recommendations for the tax levy for road and bridge purposes to the County Board at the annual session and any other duties as outlined in the statutes or as directed by County Board action.

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The Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the operation of the county ambulance.

Committee on Salary and Personnel

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To set the policy of each department not in conflict with the Statutes or when called upon for this purpose, also to designate the duties and responsibilities of the different offices.

 To hear and consider the grievances reported by county departments, county officers and county employees and to make their recommendations to the County Board after sufficient consideration with the committee responsible.

To meet at least annually not later than October 15th of each year.

 To recommend to the County Board the compensation of all county officers and employees.

 To receive from all other committees responsible for hiring employees, all matters pertaining to clerk hire, salary, working hours and conditions and departmental problems.

Committee on Finance - Equalization - Bonds and Insurance It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To prepare and present to the County Board at the annual session the budget and tax levy; first in a temporary form, and finally in a complete form as changed during the County Board session.

To report upon all resolutions and petitions for appropriations presented to the Board.

To report and make recommendations on the finances of the county from time to time when required.

 To have supervision over and make an equalization of the assessments on all property in the county for taxes between the several towns, villages and cities of the county.

To report in detail on the equalization report at the annual session of the board.

To meet annually with the supervisor of assessments and county assessors at their spring meeting.

To determine the amounts of bonds to be furnished by the county officers to the county and to report on the sufficiency of such bonds.

 To designate and report to the county board the banks of Iowa county that may apply as a depository for county funds.

9. To have charge of all county insurance.

Committee on Agriculture and Extension Education

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To perform all duties prescribed by law as further instructed by the County Board.

To work with the UW-Extension Office to set county policy and procedure for the operation of this office.

To work with state and federal representatives to enter into, consummate and cancel contracts.

 To represent the UW-Extension Office on salaries and appropriations, and to examine and approve all claims filed by Extension Agents.

 Extension Agents are: Resource or Community Development, Agricultural, 4-H and Youth, and Home Economist.

 To serve as Soil and Water Conservation District Supervisors. In this capacity, set local policy for the Soil Conservation Service office maintaining a good program of soil and water conservation. 7. To administer and carry out all Soil and Water Conservation responsibilities as required by Chapter 92, State Statutes.

 To work with County Forestry service to promote reforestation and better management.

Committee on Health and Institutions

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

1. To act as an advisory committee with the Board of Trustees in the maintenance, repairs and construction of buildings.

 To report to the County Board but in no way interfere with the management of the Nursing Home by the Board of Trustees as established by law.

To act in an advisory capacity with the county nurse on all types of health programs and may audit the personnel expenses.

 Annually plan and recommend the budget for the health program.

Committee on Tax Claims - Addressograph and Veterans Office It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To consider, examine and report to the County Board, its findings in all matters of illegal assessments, tax titles and delinquent lands that may come before the board for action.

2. To supervise all delinquent taxes returned to the county, supervise the taking of tax deeds, supervise the sale of real estate taken on tax deed to the end that the property is returned to the tax roll and aid in the collection of delinquent taxes. Where the value of the property involved warrants it, the committee shall have the power to appraise the property and in its discretion insure it for the benefit of the county.

To make appraisals pursuant to Chapter 75.69 of the county owned tax deed lands.

 To sell and dispose to the best interest of the county those lands to which the county has taken tax deeds.

To employ the services of the county surveyor to establish the location of county owned property when necessary.

 To authorize and recommend the county treasurer at their discretion to assign to heirs, mortgagees or adjacent property owners, tax certificates purchased by the county at the annual sale of tax certificates.

To advise with and assist the service officer regarding his duties in compliance with Wisconsin Statutes.

8. To meet as necessary.

To have charge of and supervise the operation and use of the addressograph system.

Committee on Courts, Justice and Law Enforcement

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 This committee shall be responsible for the operation of the Sheriff's Department, including:

- a. Hiring and firing of personnel, subject to county personnel policies, and general supervision of all non-elected personnel.
- b. Setting salaries in consultation with personnel committee.
- Initiating all requisitions for purchases within the department.
- d. Upkeep and maintenance of the jail building and equipment; any major repairs, remodeling, or additions to be referred to the County Board, through the Public Property Committee.

Presentation of an annual budget to the County Board, for P. approval. This budget will anticipate all purchases of major equipment such as cars, radio, radar, office equipment, etc.

2. This committee shall have the same authority over courts and justice including the following offices:

Judge District Attorney Clerk of Courts

Juvenile Officer Register in Probate Family Court Commissioner

Child Support Investigator

Committee on Civil Defense

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

1. This committee, under the direction of the County Board chairperson, shall to the extent of its ability carry out the duties of the Civil Defense program as covered by Wisconsin Statutes.

Committee on Rural Planning and Zoning

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To function as governed by Wisconsin Statutes 27.015, 59.97, 236 and any other requirement of law relating to planning or zoning as affecting the county.

2. To have jurisdiction (to the extent of Committee authority as a delegate of the County Board) over the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, the Shoreland-Floodplain Ordinance including Sanitary Code and the Subdivision Ordinance.

3. To confer with local units of government, hold hearings, and make recommendations on matters relating to planning and zoning in the county.

To prepare a plan and coordinate the implementation of Chapter 91 (Farmland Preservation Act) and review applications for inclusion in the program.

Committee on Resource Development

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

1. To give assistance in an advisory capacity in so far as is possible for all resource development in Iowa County.

2. To have charge of and advise with the County Board on all matters regarding airports.

3. To audit the accounts of any money appropriated by the County Board for conservation work.

To supervise the purchase of equipment and supplies used in association with the duties of this committee where the funds were appropriated by the County Board.

5. To have charge of and advise the Iowa County Board of all matters relative to conservation of the natural resources of the county and to cooperate with all county, state and federal organizations in the development of the same.

To receive all petitions referred to it by the County Board, by the Highway Committee and any citizen group relating to the construction, relocation, maintenance and repairs of any federal, state or county road in the county and report their recommendations to the next session of the County Board.

7. To confer with the Highway Committee on all allocations and grants of federal and state funds and on any other highway matters of major importance.

PRISONER MEALS - IOWA COUNTY JAIL

TO: Honorable Board of Iowa County Supervisors

WHEREAS, we believe there is a concern for the dietary needs on a daily basis of the inmates of the Iowa County Jail, and

WHEREAS, the budgetary limitations of \$4.50 per prisoner, per day is not realistic with todays inflationary spiral, and WHEREAS, rebidding has been received by the present caterer and Memorial Hospital of Iowa County, and

WHEREAS, the present caterer, Narvey's Restaurant, will provide a balanced diet of three meals per day, per inmate at \$5.50 per day with the personnel of the Iowa County Sheriff's Department going to the caterer to pick up the meals, Memorial Hospital of Iowa County will provide three balanced meals per day at a cost of \$5.00 per Inmate per day and will deliver the meals,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Iowa County Board of Supervisors authorize the Law Enforcement Committee and the Sheriff to enter into an agreement with Memorial Hospital of Iowa County to provide these services.

WHEREAS, s. 66.30, Wis. Stats., provides that any municipality and defining therein a County as being a municipality may contract with other municipalities to join together in the joint exercise of any power or duty required or authorized by state statutes;

WHEREAS, this Board heretofore appointed a committee of this Board to meet with similar committees from Richland, Grant and Crawford Counties relative to a joint handling of these matters by said Counties and whereas said committee has reported to this meeting;

Sup. Michels moved to approve the agenda as presented. Sup. Ryan seconded the motion. Carried.

Bureau of Aging Policy Statement No. 4, County Plan for Older People and Summary of the County Plan for Older People (No. 2 and 3) were presented to the Board in detail by Mr. James Quast, Coordinator of the Commission on Aging. The proposed Budget for 1980 was included in the plan.

Sup. Laufenberg moved to approve the Policy Statement and Summary to be submitted as the proposed Budget for 1980.

The Coordinator for the Commission on Aging explained to the Board an increase in salary was being requested. He stated the salary paid by Iowa County does not compare favorably with salaries paid other Coordinators throughout the State.

Resolution (No. 4) addressing the inadequacy of the current salary of the Coordinator for the Commission on Aging and requesting an increase in salary to \$975.00 per month was presented by Sup. Bilkey.

RESOLUTION ADDRESSING THE INADEQUACY OF THE CURRENT SALARY OF THE COORDINATOR FOR THE C.O.A.

WHEREAS, an lowa County Commission on Aging was created so that increased planning and services could be provided to meet the unique needs of the elderly of Iowa County who are now and have long been contributing members to this county's social and economical well being.

WHEREAS, Iowa County made and entered into a contract with the Area Agency on Aging, District I as a Provider and agreed to a commitment to identify participant's needs and establish linkages for delivery of needed service, and to demonstrate effective planning for progressive program maintenance as well as providing proper supervision for the purposed services.

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Board of Supervisors supported the reorganization of the Older American Act which required Congress to authorize a block grant approach to funding of services, multi-year funding cycles, and requires more direct involvement as local elected officials.

WHEREAS, the Coordinator has been required to initiate applications and administer programs under various categories including transportation, nutrition, home health care, Senior Citizen Centers, paralegal counseling, Out Reach and advocacy.

WHEREAS, the Coordinator's salary is not commensurate with the responsibilities assigned to the position, and does not compare with salaries paid in other counties with similar demographical backgrounds, the average being \$11,000.00 in Region I.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Coordinator's salary be increased from the current level of \$760.00 to \$975.00 per month effective October 1, 1979, the amount over \$760.00 per month to be taken from monies available in the administration portion of the budget.

WHEREAS, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by easement dated April 23, 1968 and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds for Iowa County, Wisconsin, on May 3, 1968 as Document No. 105435 in Volume 247 of Deeds on Page 1 transferred property described therein and located in the Towns of Eden and Highland, Iowa County, Wisconsin, granting an easement and right in perpetuity to construct, operate and maintain a multiple-use-dam, to flow the land, and to develop, operate and maintain a public recreation area;

WHEREAS, this area was developed by the Iowa County Soil and Water Conservation District in cooperation with the Cobb-Highland Recreation Commission and which said area is known as the Blackhawk Lake Recreation Area;

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Soil and Water Conservation District accepted said easement and made commitments as to the handling of said easement property;

WHEREAS, in constructing said dams and other improvements thereon certain obligations were incurred including loans secured by liens to the Farmers Home Administration;

WHEREAS, through negotiations with the Department of Natural Resources, the successor in interest to the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin, arrangements have been made to reconvey said easement to the Department of Natural Resources in return for the Department of Natural Resources making and granting a new easement on a portion of said property and assuming and paying the lien obligations;

WHEREAS, the Cobb-Highland Recreation Commission as a part of said arrangements and in consideration thereof have further conveyed other land owned by it to the Department of Natural Resources and agreed with the Iowa County Soil and Water Conservation District to operate the recreation area contained in the new easement as an assignee of the Iowa County Soil and Water Conservation District;

WHEREAS, said easement from the Department of Natural Resources likewise contains certain conditions and commitments to be made by Iowa County in connection therewith;

WHEREAS, said proposed easement including said conditions and commitments has been read and discussed by this Board;

WHEREAS, from time to time during said negotiations said matters were submitted to this Board and tentative approvals made;

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to adopt a resolution confirming said arrangements and formally authorizing the conditions and commitments;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

 By this resolution Iowa County, Wisconsin, hereby accepts said easement from the State of Wisconsin, Department of Natural Resources as Grantor to Iowa County and its Soil and Water Conservation District as Grantees and hereby consents to the conditions contained therein and hereby commits Iowa County to the commitments by the County made therein.

2. The County Clerk of Iowa County, Wisconsin, Claire O. Olson be and he is hereby directed and authorized on behalf of Iowa County, Wisconsin, to execute and deliver said easement accepting said easement, consenting to the conditions therein and making the commitments contained therein.

3. The Iowa County Soil and Water Conservation District is hereby authorized to make and deliver to the State of Wisconsin, Department of Natural Resources the quit claim deed reconveying the property set forth in the easement from the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin aforesaid dated April 23, 1968.

4. The Iowa County Soil and Water Conservation District is further authorized to accept possession of the property contained in said new easement from the State of Wisconsin, Dept. of Natural Resources and to handle arrangements for the operation of said facilities and to perform the conditions and commitments in behalf of said County. This authority includes the power and authority to negotiate with the Cobb-Highland Recreation Commission as to operation and commitments by the Cobb-Highland Recreation Commission and to execute and deliver assignments and other instruments and agreements to and with the Cobb-Highland Recreation Commission to effectuate and accomplish such purpose.

5. Said easement from the State of Wisconsin, Department of Natural Resources is hereby incorporated herein by reference and the County Clerk is hereby directed to properly identify and file and/or record said easement so as to make a permanent record. The County Clerk as a part of the certification of this resolution to the State of Wisconsin, Department of Natural Resources may attach a copy of said easement as set forth in said records as a part of certifying to this resolution.

RESOLUTION NO. 14

COUNTY AID CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTAINENCE DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1980

SECTION I. The County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the county for highway work in the year 1980 under the provisions of Section 20.395 and Chapter 83 of the Statutes, and the additional sums herein appropriated, shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

SECTION II. COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENT. WHEREAS the Division of Highways has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be Five Hundred Twenty Two Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty Eight and 79/Cents (\$522,858.79) will become available at the end of the fiscal year under the provisions of Sections 83.10 and 20.395 (1) (qa) & (qb) of the Statutes, for the county trunk highway system in the county, but the actual amount will not be known until the close of the fiscal year ending next June 30.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the said sum to the extent required to match and supplement Federal aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any Federal projects located on the county trunk highway system of said county, which are not recovered from Federal funds, and to expend any balance for construction, repairing, and maintaining such county trunk highway system and the bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 83.10 (1) of the Statutes, and to reimburse the general fund for any expenditures that may be made therefrom pursuant to Section 83.01(6) of the Statutes. The distribution to such purposes is estimated, but not specifically directed.

SECTION IV. WHEREAS it appears that certain additional highway improvements in the county are necessary and warranted.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby appropriate the following sums for the purpose hereinafter set forth:

() For the maintenance of the County Trunk Highway System the sum of General Maintenance: One Million Seven Hundred Forty Four Thousand Nine Hundred and No/Cents (\$1,744,900.00). Winter Maintenance: Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00).

() For emergency road or bridge repairs or construction, the necessity for which is determined by the County Highway Committee and for which other funds are not available, the sum of One Hundred Thirty Eight Thousand Five Hundred & No/Cents (\$138,500.00).

()For the purchase of machinery and for machinery repairs the sum of Two Hundred Seventy Five Thousand & No/Cents (\$275,000.00).

() For administration, including salaries, per diem, office and travel expense of the County Highway Committee, the County Highway Commissioner, his clerks and assistants not paid from construction or maintenance funds, the sum of Eighty Six Thousand and No/Cents (\$86,000.00).

SECTION V. WHEREAS appropriations are made herein, in addition to the amounts to be received from the state and available for work in the county under Section 20.395 of the Statutes.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby levy a tax on all of the property in the county to meet such appropriations as follows:

() For County Aid under Section 83.14, as provided by Section III hereof, the sum of Thirty One Thousand Four Hundred Sixty Five and 17/Cents (\$31,465.17).

WARNING: It is directed that provision for this levy shall be made in the county budget, but that this levy shall not be duplicated.

The County Clerk is directed to levy the special benefit assessments made herein as special charges against the respective municipalities as provided by law.

SECTION VII. WHEREAS the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefor.

BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the county budget, for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year.

SECTION VIII. WHEREAS the exact amount of the fund, that will become available from the state for highway purposes in the county under Section 20.395 of the Statutes will not be known until on or after next June 30.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as hereinbefore authorized, from any funds in the County treasury that are not required for the purposes for which appropriated prior to next August 1 and to reimburse such funds in the County treasury from the sums received under Section 20.395 of the Statutes.

SECTION IX. WHEREAS the County Highway Committee and the County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenance of highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory and administrative duties,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Commissioner shall have authority to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate such personnel as he deems necessary for such purposes, provided however that the County Highway Committee may by action recorded in its minutes determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate any such person. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen, laborers, foremen, clerks, stenographers, or other employees necessary to carry on such activities.

January 12, 1980

The Board of Supervisors met in January Session at the Courthouse in the City of Dodgeville on Tuesday, January 15, 1980 at 8:00 P.M. and was called to order by Honorable Richard Scullion, Chairman of the Board.

Roll Call taken. All members reported present with the exception of Sup. Grunow.

Certification (No. 1) of the County Clerk stating notice of this meeting had been posted, reported to the press and radio station as required by law was read.

Sup. Brown moved to approve the certification.

Sup. Greene seconded the motion. Carried.

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Sup. Regan led the Board in the pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Chairman Scullion advised the members of the additional agenda items added to the agenda since copies had been mailed to members.

Sup. Michels moved to approve the items added to the agenda.

Sup. Whitford seconded the motion. Carried.

Communication (No. 2) from MelvIn Rose, Chairman-Coordinator, Sauk County Board of Supervisors requesting the Iowa County Board recommend legislation be changed to drop the requirement that the MATC site needs State Board approval was presented by Chairman Scullion.

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Resolution (No. 3) of the Sauk County Board declaring support for the efforts of the Madison Area Technical College Board to build and locate a facility accessable and convenient to residents of the District by recommending Section 38.04(10) of the Wisconsin Statutes be amended so as not to require State Board review and approval of the campus site selection and development process was read.

Sup. Hogan moved the Iowa County Board adopt a similar Resolution (No. 3-A) and copies be forwarded to our representatives.

RESOLUTION NO. 3-A

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Board of Supervisors has declared its support for the efforts of the Madison Area Technical College Board to build and locate a facility which will be accessable and convenient to all residents of the District; and

WHEREAS, for more than five (5) years, the efforts of the Madison Area Technical College Area Board and the Wisconsin Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education to commence building said facility have been stymied by various groups utilizing environmental review procedures made applicable by Wisconsin Statute to any decision of the State Board approving a location proposed by the Area Board; and

WHEREAS, the M.A.T.C. Board members do believe that if s. 38.04(10) of the Wisconsin Statutes were amended so as not to require State Board review and approval of the campus site selection and development process, that the legal obstacles which have been used by a few to frustrate the realization of a goal supported by a majority of the District's residents would, in large part, be eliminated;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the lowa County Board of Supervisors hereby declares its support for an amendment to s. 38.04(10) of the Wisconsin Statutes, and any other legislative relief, which might eliminate the procedural roadblocks which have been able to be used by a few to frustrate the development of a new M.A.T.C. campus, as prosposed by the Area Board;

AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be sent to Senator Richard Kreul and Member of the Assembly, Joan M. Duren for their review and support;

Communication (No. 7), copy of a letter addressed to County Board members from the Law Offices of Angel & Winz of Dodgeville as attorneys retained by Mr. Roy Strickfaden present renter of the Iowa County Farm was presented to the Board. (See copy on file in Office of County Clerk)

District Attorney Frank Berryman addressed the Board indicating holding the land is unconstitutional.

Mr. Strickfaden, the present renter addressed the Board defending his farming practices as they concern the nursing home and stating the improvements made during the past few years.

Sup. Peterson and Sup. Thronson spoke in favor of continuing the practice of renting the farm.

Sup. Bilkey questioned the Board of Supervisors making the decision regarding the County Farm for the 20,000 persons in Iowa County.

Attorney Paul Angel stated it is not as clear as Attorney Berryman indicated that holding the Farm is illegal.

Sup. Peterson requested a Ballot Vote be taken on Resolution No. 5 recommending the Iowa County Farm be sold.

Sup. Toay and Thronson were appointed tellers.

Ballot Vote (No. 8) taken.

Total votes cast 20; Ayes - 3, Bilkey, Masters, Whitford. Noes - 17, Hogan, Michels, Greene, Scullion, Laufenberg, Peterson, Martin, Sersch, Toay, Thronson, Ryan, Klosterman, Regan, Marr, Demuth, Branger, Brown.

Resolution lost.

Mr. Tim Cretney, a land owner in the area stated the land should be rented by open bidding.

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Report (No. 9) of the Law Enforcement Committee explaining the comments and recommendations proposed by the State Auditors in the interest of improving financial policies and procedures in the Office of the Clerk of Court was presented by Sup. Sersch.

It was stated that Judge, Clerk of Court and State Auditors recommended additional staff be added to the office of Clerk of Court.

Sup. Laufenberg stated the present staff are unable to handle the work load and advised the Board a request would be presented to the Board to increase the number of hours of the part-time Deputy from 15 to 20 days per month until the work is brought up to date.

RESOLUTION FOR THE CREATION OF AN IOWA COUNTY SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT, COUNTY COST-SHARING PROGRAM FOR SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION PROJECTS.

WHEREAS, Soil erosion and degradation of Water Quality is a problem in Iowa County;

WHEREAS, The Iowa County Soil and Water Conservation District is concerned about Water Quality and Soil Conservation;

WHEREAS, Interest has been shown by Iowa County landowners, in Soil and Water Conservation programs, if more cost-sharing assistance were available, to install these practices;

WHEREAS, At the present time the only cost-sharing assistance, incentive program, available to Iowa County landowners is through the Agricultural Conservation Program of the USDA Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service;

WHEREAS, The funds available through ASCS are not near enough to meet the demand for cost-sharing, and an increase in these funds, to meet the entire demand, are not likely;

WHEREAS, A County Cost-sharing Program could initially be started and operate as follows:

- 1. A \$20,000 cost-sharing program.
- \$2,000 would be the maximum amount any one landowner could receive of County Funds.
- 75% of the cost of the conservation project, not to exceed \$2,000 would be the maximum one landowner could receive.
- Three basic conservation practices would be cost-shared;
 - (a) Erosion and Flood Control Structures (Basically dams, drop spillways and gully plugs)
 - (b) Barnyard Runoff Control (Problem areas near streams and not to include Manure Storage)

- (c) Grass Waterways (Approved on a case by case basis if ASCS has not approved the waterway)
- The landowner must sign for the conservation practice at ASCS first. Persons will not be eligible for the County Program until all ASCS funds have been used for that particular practice. The exception is if the conservation practice under ASCS cost-sharing is expected to exceed \$4,666 (ASCS maximum costsharing of \$3,500 and 75% cost sharing), and it is a high cost yet highly beneficial practice. Then the District would cost-share on the remainder, to bring the entire cost-sharing to 75%, while not exceeding \$2,000.
- 6. The five Iowa County Soil and Water Conservation District Supervisors would control all approvals of cost-sharing applications

WHEREAS, The initial funds for starting the cost-sharing program could come from the Watershed Fund without appropriating new monies:

WHEREAS, The Soil and Water Conservation District already has sufficient staff to handle such a cost-sharing program;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That a Soil and Water Conservation District County Cost-sharing Program be implemented and made available to lowa county landowners;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the program would operate as before mentioned;

BE IT STILL FURTHER RESOLVED, That authorization be given to use \$20,000 of Watershed Fund monies to initiate the program. RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED,

Administrative Code, will be used only to rehabilitate or replace failing private sewage systems of one or more principal residences occupied at least 51% of the year or small commercial establishments with an average flow of less than 2100 gallons per day constructed prior to and inhabited on July 1, 1978.
 - b. Each system included in all applications is under enforcement orders under s. 144.24(10(e), Wis. Stats.
 - c. Each system has not received a previous grant under s. 144.24(10), Wis. Stats.
 - d. That allowable costs will not exceed the cost of rehabilitation or replacing a private sewage system by the least costly methods necessary to allow the rehabilitated system or new system to meet the minimum requirements of the State plumbing code under s, 145.13, Wis. Stats,
- (2) State grants provided to the County under ss. 144.24(10) will be disbursed to the owners of eligible private sewage systems to be applied to the rehabilitation or replacement of the private sewage systems.
- (3) The eligible projects will be completed as planned and that the non-state costs will be paid by the individual, and the principal residences and owners of small commercial establishments share of the cost shall be at least 25% of the eligible costs.
- (4) The State grants received under s, 144.24(10), Wis. Stats., will be used for private sewage systems that will be properly installed and maintained.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CREATION OF JOINT

COMMISSION RELATIVE TO AREA RAILROAD TRANSPORTATION WHEREAS, the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific

Railroad Company is presently providing rail service to portions of Dane, Sauk, Richland, Iowa, Grant and Crawford Counties, Wisconsin, on a line running westerly from Madison through said counties with segments terminating in southern Sauk County, Richland Center, and Prairie du Chien;

WHEREAS, there was pending before the Interstate Commerce Commission and is now before the Federal Bankruptcy Court an application of said Railroad Company to abandon that portion of said line proceeding west from Lone Rock to Prairie du Chien and whereas it appears that this abandonment is forthcoming;

WHEREAS, presently the State of Wisconsin through Wisconsin Department of Transportation is presently attempting to make arrangements for the continuation of the balance of the above referred to line which will require negotiation, position taking and other input from the above counties;

WHEREAS, it appears to be the interest of this county as well as the other counties to establish a body with authority to investigate, negotiate and act in relation to all and/or portions of the above rail line for the purpose of maintaining, providing or perserving service including preservation of all or portions of the corridor for possible future public use;

WHEREAS, representatives of this county have been meeting with representatives of the other counties in an ad hoc manner for the purpose of investigating and taking positions and which has been done and to advise their respective county boards;

WHEREAS, Section 59.968, Wis. Stats., grants authority to a county board to acquire a transportation system and to operate and maintain it, or lease it to any operator, or contract for its use by any operator, or maintain and improve it, including the right-of-way and improvements thereon for future use and otherwise to act in transportation matters;

WHEREAS, Section 66.30, Wis. Stats., provides that any municipality and defining therein a county as being a municipality may contract with other municipalities to join together in the joint exercise of any power or duty required or authorized by state statute;

WHEREAS, the representatives of this county have recommended to the county board the creation of a joint transit commission pursuant to Section 66.30, Wis. Stats.; WHEREAS, the provisions of a proposed contract have been reviewed;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

- This board hereby determines that it is to the best interest of lowa County to join with any or all of the above counties pursuant to Section 66.30, Wis. Stats., to create a joint commission for the joint exercise of power relative to retaining the services of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad line described and referred to in the preamble hereto including the acquisition of said line or portions thereof for operation through a short line operation or otherwise and including the preservation of said railroad corridor and facilities or portions thereof for possible future use.
- Said commission shall be created by a contract pursuant to Section 66.30, Wis. Stats., incorporating the provisions as negotiated by the representatives of this county with the representatives of the other counties as referred to above. A copy of said contract either before or after execution shall be attached to this resolution or otherwise shall be identified as to filing by the county clerk.
- 3. The making and entering of said contract is hereby approved and authorized by this board and the county board chairman and the county clerk of this county be and they are hereby authorized to make, sign and deliver such a contract in behalf of this county in substantially the manner and details as reported to this board.
- 4. The authority hereby given is to join with any or all of the above named counties. The contract may be entered into and activated by less than all of the counties with the right of the other counties to join later.
- 5. It is understood as provided in said proposed contract that the Rail Transit Commission may upon authorization from an individual county or counties act in its or their behalf in connection with the above railroad line or any portion thereof.
- 6. This board shall forthwith appoint three commissioners said joint commission with one commissioner being appointed for each term expiring as follows: April 30, 1981; April 30, 1982; and April 30, 1983. A fourth substitute member may be appointed to act as a substitute or alternate at any meeting upon request of any commissioner from this county.
- 7. The sum of \$1,500 is hereby appropriated and shall be paid to the joint commission upon its creation to be used in connection with the expenses of said commission including the ad hoc committee and the creation of said commission.
- The acts of the representatives of this county in acting in conjunction with representatives from the other counties to negotiate this proposed contract and jointly acting to resist said abandonment are hereby approved and confirmed.
- The previous resolution of this board to join in the creation of a Transit Commission is hereby amended and superseded by this resolution.

1) All new nurses start at entry level.

 Entry level will be raised each year at the percentage or dollar amount determined by the County Board. Each successful category will be increased by the same dollar amount as the base salary.

- Raises for a given year will include the approved yearly increase in addition to the advancement amount to the next longevity category.
- 4) For 1980 each nurse will receive the raise indicated in this schedule for her present classification level and will remain there for the rest of the year. Thereafter, all raises will be effective the first of the year instead of anniversary date.

5) Progression through each staff nurse level will be automatic with the advancement to the next level beginning at the first of each new year. When the highest level of each classification is reached, the next step will be to the beginning level of the next classification.

This holds true only for progression through classifications CHN I, CHN II, CHN III. Progression to the Supervisor and Director positions will be through official promotion only.

- Nursing staff will be paid on an hourly basis rather than on a flat monthly basis. Based on 35 hour week, 8.75 hour day.
- This salary schedule is effective as of January 1, 1980 and will be revised as of January 1, 1981 in accordance with item #2. Increases will be retroactive to January 1, 1980.
- 8) The following are the levels for nursing staff for 1980.

RATIONALE FOR SALARY SCHEDULE

- With a base salary of \$6.00/hour we are more in line with other counties around Iowa County (Richland \$6.15; Green \$6.31; Grant \$6.02; Columbia \$5.98). This will allow for greater incentive when recruiting.
 - 2) The average increase is 9.2%. This is within County limitations.
 - The schedule is in compliance with Personnel Committee suggestions to use dollar amounts rather than percentages for increases in each category.
 - 4) The upper level remains the same as a previously presented

schedule which was prepared by a member of the Personnel Committee.

- 5) It will provide for more uniformity and simplicity in raises if all nurses are increased at the beginning of the year rather than throughout the year at anniversary date.
- 6) In future years it will eliminate the need for additional time in dealing with raises. The raises will already be established.
