# RULES FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE IOWA COUNTY BOARD

- Rule 1. The hour of meeting shall be 10:00 o'clock A.M. or 8:00 o'clock P.M., unless a different hour shall be prescribed.
- Rule 2. The Chairperson shall call the meeting to order at the hour fixed for the meeting. (1) The clerk shall call the roll of members and (2) a majority being present, the journal of the preceding meeting, if printed copies are not available, shall be read, that any errors may be corrected.
- Rule 3. The Chairperson shall preserve order and decorum, and may speak on points of order in preference to other members.
- Rule 4. The Board shall elect at the April meeting in even numbered years, a chairperson and also a vice-chairperson who shall serve for a two year term. The vice-chairperson shall act in the absence, disability, death or resignation of the chairperson or on a request to act and possess powers of the chairperson.
- Rule 5. The chairperson and vice-chairperson with the Committee on Committees shall appoint standing committees.
- Rule 6. All questions shall be stated by the chair. If the chairperson doubts as to the voice of the majority the chairperson or any members of the Board may call for a vote by either roll call or rising vote on the questions to be decided.
- Rule 7. The following committees shall be appointed: Committee on Claims, Printing, Audit and Property; Committee on Salary and Personnel: Committee on Finance, Bonds and Insurance: Committee on Agriculture, Soil and Water Conservation Supervisors; Committee on Health & Institutions: Committee on Courts: Justice & Law Enforcement; Committee on Civil Defense; Area Manpower Planning Board Delegate; Department of Social Services Board (elected); Committee on Tax Claims, Addressograph and Veterans Service Officer; Committee on Zoning and Planning, and Rural Planning Commission; Southwest Community Action Program Board; Committee on Highways (elected); 51.42 Board - Iowa County Representatives Unified Board - Grant and Iowa Counties; Advisory Members of Commission on Aging; Advisory Council - Commission on Aging; Hodan Center Board Members; Regional Planning Commission; Iowa County Housing Authority; Community Development Block Grant Committee; Hidden Valleys Committee; Committee on Resource Development; Legislative Committee; Southwest Wisconsin Library Board; County Traffic Safety Commission; Iowa County Board of Adjustment and Administrative Appeals Board; Joint County Transit Commission; Emergency Medical Services Council; Committee on Committees, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, and 3 elected members; Regional Policy Advisory Committee for S.W. Wisconsin (Iowa County Representatives); Mineral Point Airport Commission, Tri-County Airport (Iowa County Representative); Nutrition Board. The size of committees shall be limited to not less than three nor more than five members.
- Rule 8. After the journal shall have been read the order of business shall be as follows: 1. Letters, Petitions, Remonstrations, Communications and Accompanying Documents. 2. Resolutions. 3. Reports of Committees, first standing and afterward special committees. 4. Miscellaneous business. All individuals and groups requesting to appear before the County Board, first appear before a committee and be referred to the Board by said Committee.
- Rule 9. Every member present shall vote unless excused by the Chairperson.

- Rule 10. Every vote taken in regard to levying taxes, appropriating money, or dividing or altering the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be taken by Yeas and Nayes, and the same shall be entered on the journal.
- Rule 11. Roll Calls shall be taken by signed ballot. Ballot pads with names printed on pads will be furnished each supervisor.
- Rule 12. No petitions, resolutions or motions having for its object the division or alteration of the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be entered on or considered at the same session of the Board at which it was introduced, but the same shall lie over for consideration at the next regular adjourned or special session of the Board.
- Rule 13. Each member prior to speaking shall rise and address himself to and be recognized by the Chair. If two or more members arise at the same time the chairperson shall decide who shall speak first but in all other cases the member who arises and addresses the chair first shall have the preference.
- Rule 14. No report or resolution appropriating any money shall be acted upon until the next day after presentation without permission of two-thirds of the members present.
- Rule 15. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern in all cases where they are applicable.
- Rule 16. Any of the foregoing rules, except Rules 10 and 12 may be rescinded, changed or suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- Rule 17. Rules Nos. 10 and 12 may be rescinded, altered or suspended by a two-thirds vote of all the members entitled to seats on the County Board.
- Rule 18. No informal ballot cast by this Board shall be declared a formal ballot. In no case shall any official be elected by this Board by casting a unanimous vote in favor of any candidate or nominee.
- Rule 19. The Board shall meet monthly on the third Tuesday, in addition to the statutory meetings in April and November of each year. Special meetings shall be held subject to the call of the Chair.
- Rule 20. All officers elected by the County Board except those elected at the April session, shall be nominated and all nominations lay over to the following day before they are voted on.
- Rule 21. All resolutions or petitions to be presented to a session of the County Board shall be presented five days in advance of the scheduled session and a report or copy shall be mailed to each County Supervisor. An emergency situation may grant an exception provided approval is given by two-thirds of the membership.
- Rule 22. All purchases for the courthouse, courthouse annex and jail shall be channeled through the Purchasing Committee.
- Rule 23. No County Supervisor be permitted to sit on any one Committee for more than six consecutive years.
- Rule 24. No new business may be brought before the Board after 11:00 P.M.

#### **DUTIES OF COMMITTEES**

Committee on Claims - Audit - Printing and Property
It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 To audit, allow or disallow all claims filed in the office of the county clerk or referred to the committee, and shall file a schedule of such claims allowed with the county clerk for payment and shall make a report to the County Board of all claims audited.

- To meet with the State Auditors to study and examine the report on the accounts covered in their audit and make a report of the findings to the County Board.
- To accept bids on the printing of the County Board proceedings, stationery, envelopes and general printing for county officers and offices and court calendars.
- To act on all matters of printing referred to them by the County Board or any department of the county.
- To supervise and have charge of the courthouse, courthouse annex, county owned buildings (not including highway and county home), county jail and the grounds of these buildings and the Gov. Dodge home site.
  - 6. To keep in repair and good condition these properties.
- 7. In order to maintain uniformity of equipment, this committee shall purchase the equipment for all offices in the courthouse, courthouse annex and jail with the following exception no office equipment shall be purchased for the Highway Department, except when such purchases are made from the general fund or a mutual agreement on cost savings can be reached, through volume purchases of miscellaneous supplies.
- This committee shall function during the year and when the County Board is not in session.

#### Committee on Social Services

It Shall Be the Duty of this Board:

- At the first meeting of such board, elect from their numbers, a chairperson, a secretary, and such other officers as they deem necessary. Vacancies in such offices shall be filled for the unexpired terms. The chairperson shall preside at all meetings when present, and shall countersign all actions taken by the board. In case of the absence of a chairperson for any meeting the members present shall choose a temporary chairperson.
- Appoint a county director of public welfare subject to the provisions of s. 49.50 (2) to (5) and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.
- Supervise the working of the county department of social services and shall be the policy-making body determining the broad outlines and principles governing the administration of the functions, duties and powers assigned to said department under s. 46.22 (4) and (5).
- 4. Whenever it determines that there is a need therefor, appoint committees consisting of residents of the county, which committee shall advise with the board on any matter for which they are created, but members of such committees shall serve without compensation.
- Consult with the county director of the social services concerning the preparation of the annual budget, the annual report of the county department of social services and the appointment of necessary personnel.

#### Committee on Highway

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 The County Highway Committee shall have supervision over the maintenance and construction of all roads and bridges as provided by statutes and shall submit to the County Board an annual report including the report of the County Highway Committee of all receipts and expenditures in the County Highway Department and shall submit an annual budget and recommendations for the tax levy for road and bridge purposes to the County Board at the annual session and any other duties as outlined in the statutes or as directed by County Board action. The Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the operation of the county ambulance.

#### Committee on Salary and Personnel

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To set the policy of each department not in conflict with the Statutes or when called upon for this purpose, also to designate the duties and responsibilities of the different offices.
- To hear and consider the grievances reported by county departments, county officers and county employees and to make their recommendations to the County Board after sufficient consideration with the committee responsible.
- To meet at least annually not later than October 15th of each year.
- To recommend to the County Board the compensation of all county officers and employees.
- To receive from all other committees responsible for hiring employees, all matters pertaining to clerk hire, salary, working hours and conditions and departmental problems.

#### Committee on Finance - Bonds and Insurance

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To prepare and present to the County Board at the annual session the budget and tax levy; first in a temporary form, and finally in a complete form as changed during the County Board session.
- 2. To report upon all resolutions and petitions for appropriations presented to the Board.
- To report and make recommendations on the finances of the county from time to time when required.
- To meet annually with the supervisor of assessments and county assessors at their spring meeting.
- To determine the amounts of bonds to be furnished for the county officers to the county and to report on the sufficiency of such bonds.
- To designate and report to the county board the banks of lowa County that may apply as a depository for county funds.
  - 7. To have charge of all county insurance.

#### Committee on Agriculture and Extension Education

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To perform all duties prescribed by law as further instructed by the County Board.
- To work with the UW-Extension Office to set county policy and procedure for the operation of this office.
- To work with state and federal representatives to enter into, consummate and cancel contracts.
- To represent the UW-Extension Office on salaries and appropriations, and to examine and approve all claims filed by Extension Agents.
- Extension Agents are: Agricultural, 4-H and Youth, and Home Economist.
- To serve as Soil and Water Conservation District Supervisors.
   In this capacity, set local policy for the Soil Conservation Service office maintaining a good program of soil and water conservation.
- 7. To administer and carry out all Soil and Water Conservation responsibilities as required by Chapter 92, State Statutes.
- 8. To work with County Forestry service to promote reforestration and better management.

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#### Committee on Health and Institutions

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To act as an advisory committee with the Board of Trustees in the maintenance, repairs and construction of buildings.
- To report to the County Board but in no way interfere with the management of the Nursing Home by the Board of Trustees as established by law.
- To act in an advisory capacity with the county nurse on all types of health programs and may audit the personnel expenses.
- Annually plan and recommend the budget for the health program.

Committee on Tax Claims - Addressograph and Veterans Office
It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- T. To consider, examine and report to the County Board, its findings in all matters of illegal assessments, tax titles and delinquent lands that may come before the board for action.
- 2. To supervise all delinquent taxes returned to the county, supervise the taking of tax deeds, supervise the sale of real estate taken on tax deed to the end that the property is returned to the tax roll and aid in the collection of delinquent taxes. Where the value of the property involved warrants it, the committee shall have the power to appraise the property and in its discretion insure it for the benefit of the county.
- To make appraisals pursuant to Chapter 75.69 of the county owned tax deed lands.
- To sell and dispose to the best interest of the county those lands to which the county has taken tax deeds.
- To employ the services of the county surveyor to establish the location of county owned property when necessary.
- To authorize and recommend the county treasurer at their discretion to assign to heirs, mortgages or adjacent property owners, tax certificates purchased by the county at the annual sale of tax certificates.
- To advise with and assist the service officer regarding his duties in compliance with Wisconsin Statutes.
  - To meet as necessary.
- To have charge of and supervise the operation and use of the addressograph system.

Committee on Courts, Justice and Law Enforcement It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- This Committee shall be responsible for the operation of the Sheriff's Department, including:
  - Hiring and firing of personnel, subject to county personnel policies, and general supervision of all non-elected personnel.
  - b. Setting salaries in consultation with personnel committee.
  - Initiating all requisitions for purchases within the department.
  - d. Upkeep and maintenance of the jail building and equipment; and major repairs, remodeling, or additions to be referred to the County Board, through the Public Property Committee.

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  - Initiating all requisitions for purchases within the department.
  - d. Upkeep and maintenance of the jail building and equipment; and major repairs, remodeling, or additions to be referred to the County Board, through the Public Property Committee.
  - e. Presentation of an annual budget to the County Board, for approval. This budget will anticipate all purchases of major equipment such as cars, radio, radar, office equipment, etc.

This committee shall have the same authority over Courts and Justice including the following offices:

Judge District Attorney Clerk of Circuit Court Child Support Investigator Juvenile Officer Register in Probate Family Court Commissioner

To consider the reports and information made available by the courts for presentation to the County Board.

#### Committee on Civil Defense

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 This committee, under the direction of the County Board chairperson, shall to the extent of its ability carry out the duties of the Civil Defense program as covered by Wisconsin Statutes.

#### Committee on Rural Planning and Zoning

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To function as governed by Wisconsin Statutes 27.015, 59.97, 236 and any other requirement of law relating to planning or zoning as affecting the county.
- To have jurisdiction (to the extent of Committee authority as a delegate of the County Board) over the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, the Shoreland-Floodplain Ordinance including Sanitary Code and the Subdivision Ordinance.
- To confer with local units of government, hold hearings, and make recommendations on matters relating to planning and zoning in the county.
- To prepare a plan and coordinate the implementation of Chapter 91 (Farmland Preservation Act) and review applications for inclusion in the program.

#### Committee on Resource Development

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To give assistance in an advisory capacity in so far as is possible for all resource development in Iowa County.
- To have charge of and advise with the County Board on all matters regarding airports.
- To audit the accounts of any money appropriated by the County Board for conservation work.
- To supervise the purchase of equipment and supplies used in association with the duties of this committee where the funds were appropriated by the County Board.
- 5. To have charge of and advise the Iowa County Board of all matters relative to conservation of the natural resources of the county and to cooperate with all county, state and federal organizations in the development of the same.
- 6. To receive all petitions referred to it by the County Board, by the Highway Committee and any citizen group relating to the construction, relocation, maintenance and repairs of any federal, state or county road in the county and report their recommendations to the next session of the County Board.
- To confer with the Highway Committee on all allocations and grants of federal and state funds and on any other highway matters of major importance.

# PROCEEDINGS OF THE ORGANIZATIONAL SESSION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY SUPERVISORS IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN

# April 21, 1981

The Board of Supervisors met in Organizational Session at the Courthouse in the City of Dodgeville on Tuesday, April 21, 1981 at 8:00 P.M. and was called to order by Honorable Richard Scullion, Chairman of the Board.

Roll Call taken. All members reported present as follows:

District No. 1 - John C. Hogan, William Michels; District No. 2 - Claire Greene; District No. 3 - Richard Scullion; District No. 4 - Jerome Laufenberg; District No. 5 - Curtis M. Peterson; District No. 6 - Beverly Bilkey; District No. 7 - David Grunow; District No. 8 - Wayne Martin; District No. 9 - Bernard L. Sersch; District No. 10 - Thomas Paull; District No. 11 - Glenn Thronson; District No. 12 - Marvin Klosterman, Frank E. Ryan; District No. 13 - Robert Regan; District No. 14 - Raymond J. Marr; District No. 15 - Max Demuth; District No. 16 - George Branger; District No. 17 - Robert Masters; District No. 18 - James Whitford; District No. 19 - Boyd Brown.

Certification (No. 1) of the County Clerk stating notice of this meeting had been posted, reported to the press and radio station as required by law was read.

Sup. Brown moved to accept the certification.

Sup. Peterson seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. Brown led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Minutes of the February and March, 1981 Sessions were presented to the Board.

Sup. Brown moved to approve the minutes as printed and mailed.

Sup. Michels seconded the motion. Carried.

Chairman Scullion advised the members of the items added to agenda since being mailed to the County Supervisors.

Sup. Laufenberg moved to approve the items added to the agenda and also approval for a change in the sequence of items.

Sup. Ryan seconded the motion. Carried.

Communication (No. 2) from Attorney Frank W. Berryman, Corporation Counsel providing a schedule of office hours was read.

Sup. Brown moved to accept the communication.

Sup. Hogan seconded the motion. Carried.

Mr. Chuck Carter of 3M Company addressed the Board and presented Proposal (No. 3) for a Fiche System or a Aperature Card System for the Register of Deeds office to save space, create security and improve record handling. Either system could also be used by other departments of the county.

A decision on a system was referred to the Public Property Committee for their recommendation to the Board. Dr. James Hassler, Member of District No. 4, M.A.T.C. Board addressed the Board. Stated he serves Sauk, Juneau, Richland and Iowa Counties. Chairman Scullion will be casting a vote for a member of the M.A.T.C. Board and Dr. Hassler was requesting support.

Chairman Scullion stated it is necessary a decision be reached in regard to the salary of the HUD Coordinator. A Cash Position Report of the Community Development Block Grant Program Funds (No. 4) prepared by David Scott, State Auditor was presented to the members.

Corporation Counsel Frank Berryman addressed the Board regarding the November 12, 1980 County Board motion providing for an increase in the salary of the HUD Coordinator. Attorney Berryman stated the Board by motion should acknowledge the receipt of HUD funds and that the funds are now in place. He further stated the Board has already agreed to pay the salary.

Sup. Bilkey stated she would challenge Attorney Berryman on his opinion and stated the tapes of the November 12, 1980 meeting are in place. She requested that the members interested be permitted to listen to the tapes.

Tapes were played for members.

Discussion followed by members of the Board regarding the proper authorization for the payment of \$14,400.00 additional salary for one year from October 1, 1980 thru September 30, 1981.

Sup. Sersch moved to accept the cash Position Report of the Community Development Block Grant Program Funds stating the monies for administrative expenses are in place.

Sup. Brown seconded the motion.

Sup. Bilkey stated she wished the record to show that this Board voted twice not to pay the additional salary and in the end it is being paid on the recommendation of the Corporation Counsel.

Sup. Grunow moved to table the matter.

Sup. Bilkey seconded the motion.

Motion Lost.

Vote taken on motion of Sup. Sersch.

Motion Carried.

Petition (No. 5) for a land use change filed by Charles Halverson and denied by the Zoning and Planning Committee was read.

Sup. Branger moved to approve the action of the Zoning and Planning Committee in denying the petition.

Sup. Marr seconded the motion. Carried.

Petition (No. 6) for a land use change filed by Earl G. Oakes and approved by the Zoning and Planning Committee was read.

To the Honorable Iowa County Board of Supervisors:

Whereas a petition for a land use change from B-2 Highway Business to A-1 Agricultural for a parcel of land described as: Part of the SE¼ of the SE¼ of Section 23 Town 6 North Range 1 East beginning at the SE corner thereof; thence North 150 ft. to the point of beginning; thence West 220 ft.; thence North 200 ft.; thence East to the center of STH 80; thence South to the point of beginning in the Town of Eden has been filed by Earl G. Oakes, and

Whereas notice of such requested change has been properly advertised with proof of publication attached and notice has been given to the Clerk of the Town of Eden with proof also attached, and

Whereas a public hearing has been held in accord with said notice and as a result of sald hearing action has been taken to approve said change Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the land above described be changed from B-2 Highway Business to A-1 Agricultural and that this action be so recorded on the zoning map.

Whereas a petition for a land use from A-1 Agricultural to R-1 Single Family Residential for a parcel of land in the Town of Arena has been filed by John Halverson and

Whereas approval has, in Resolution #6 dated August 19, 1980 been granted for part of the petition and the owner has now requested a parcel description change within the original application and a correction is also required for part three of the same resolution.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that description number two of the above resolution is hereby repealed and the following description is to be substituted:

2) Commencing at a point which is 2612.95 feet south of and 180.79 feet west of the east ¼ corner of Section 18, Town 8 North, Range 5 East; thence North 0°19′ West 242.50 feet; thence North 89°41′ East 30 feet; thence North 0°19′ West 320.12 feet; thence North 89°41′ East 41.29 feet to the point of beginning; thence North 89°41′ East 208.71 feet; thence South 0°19′ East 208.71 feet; thence South 89°41′ West 208.71 feet; thence North 0°19′ West 208.71 feet to the point of beginning.

## June 23, 1981

The Board of Supervisors met in June Session at the Courthouse in the City of Dodgeville on Tuesday, June 23, 1981 at 8:00 P.M. and was called to order by Honorable Richard Scullion, Chairman of the Board.

Roll Call taken. All members reported present.

Certification (No. 1) of the County Clerk stating notice of this meeting had been posted, reported to the press and radio station as required by law was read.

Sup. Laufenberg moved to accept the certification.

Sup. Greene seconded the motion, Carried.

Sup. Regan led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Minutes of the May Session were presented.

Sup. Laufenberg moved the minutes be approved as presented.

Sup. Branger seconded the motion. Carried.

Communication (No. 2) from the Office of the Corporation Counsels of Sauk, Richland and Iowa Counties expressing their opinions as to the legality of the current make-up of the Sauk, Iowa and Richland Tri-County Airport Committee was read. They further stated it is their opinion that the make-up of the Tri-County Airport Commission may be contrary to the Wisconsin Statutes and that the Commission so constituted may have no legal powers or authority.

Members of the Board discussed the Communication. No action was taken.

County Clerk, Claire Olson advised members of the Board that the County Boards Convention will be held at Stevens Point, September 20th thru the 22nd of September. Motel reservation forms are available at the Clerk's office.

Resolution (No. 3) of the Public Property Committee recommending approval of a five (5) year lease, including service in the amount of \$817.25 per month plus interest at the rate of 9½% for the lease agreement of a Microfilm System from 3 M Micrographic Products Division was read. The system will be installed in the Office of the Register of Deeds. If at a later date, if the County so desired, a portion of the rental contract payments could be applied toward the purchase of the System.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 3**

County Public Property Committee regarding the purchase of Microfilm System for the purpose of reducing the ever-growing paper we have throughout the county.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors:

A resolution to purchase a Microfilm System from 3 M Micrographic Products Division.

Whereas, the need exists for the equipment to reduce the paper in the offices of Iowa County as all the vaults are over-crowded.

Whereas, the cost of the 3 M total 1050RC System: \$29,978.68.

Whereas, it is the recommendation of the Property Committee to go with the 5 year Government Lease at \$817.25 per month at  $9\frac{1}{2}\%$  simple interest.

Chairman Scullion advised members of the Board of items added to the agenda.

Sup. Brown moved to approve the agenda as amended.

Sup. Whitford seconded the motion. Carried.

Chairman Scullion advised the Board he has appointed Beverly Bilkey of Dodgeville and Darlene Millard of Rewey to serve as members of the CDBG Committee to fill vacancies on the Committee. He stated the Corporation Counsel advised him it is his duty as Chairman to fill the vacancies.

Chairman Scullion stated discussion of the Memorial Hospital addition was the next order of business.

Mr. Gary Deml, Administrator of Memorial Hospital of Iowa County addressed the Board stating their purpose here tonite is to request support from the County Board of Supervisors. He stated the Health Planning Council has approved the proposed addition to the Hospital, a two story addition to the present facility. Memorial Hospital is one of the very few hospitals to receive a unanimous vote of approval from the Review Board and the Board of Directors of the Health Planning Council. Approval has also been received from the State of Wisconsin. The concern now is to build a financing vehicle to support the proposed addition. He stated the Hospital administration feels comfortable in that they can finance the project and also continue to pay off the debt presently owed lowa County. He also explained the growth the hospital has experienced.

Attorney John N. Kramer addressed the Board and stated his purpose in appearing was to review the legal involvement from the standpoint of the County. He stated that in order to issue the bonds that the hospital is now proposing they will need a consent from the County Board in the form of a resolution to change the lease and to then subordinate the payments on the note issue thru the new bond issue. The bond issue would be issued by the City of Dodgeville under a special Wisconsin law which permits the City to do this as a part of commercial development. The City would be lending the money to the hospital corporation and take security from the hospital corporation to pay off the bonds. The bond issue to be in the amount of 4 to 4½ million dollars. The City would not be assuming any liability or legal responsibility for the issue. In order to do this the present lease arrangement would have to be changed.

The Hospital Board and persons involved from the fiscal standpoint and the Issuing of the bonds, are requesting the County Board to show an intent that the County Board would in a sense backstop the payment of the bonds in the event the hospital was unable to do so. A resolution will be presented to the County Board stating in part "It is the present intention of the County Board to issue its general obligation bonds if and to the extent permitted by the laws then in effect to finance on an annual basis an amount equal to the cost of the Corporation debt service reserve fund requirement under the security agreement in the event and to the extent that the Corporation is unable to satisfy such requirement."

Mr. Kramer answered questions directed to him by members of the Board. He also explained at length the involvement the County would be assuming.

Mr. Jack Samuels of William G. Cease & Co., Bond Underwriters of Rolling Meadows, Illinois appeared before the Board stating this project is fully supported by the Health Planning Agency. He stated the Agency has developed a report in which they concluded Memorial Hospital of Iowa County must and should continue because it in fact has an identifiable service area which has to be served. He stated the activity and utilization of the hospital has increased dramatically and is a fiscally sound operation. He stated his firm through research came up with a complex vehicle of financing which they feel will accomplish the necessary goals. That is to keep rates as low as possible and insure the project fiscal integrity financing to be accomplished through the issuance of tax exempt bonds with the aid of the City of Dodgeville and Iowa County. The bond issue would be a revenue bond issue solely, not a general obligation bond issue and therefore the debt is to be paid from the revenues of the hospital.

With the passage of the proposed Intent Resolution taxpayers can enforce the need for a referendum or more importantly the County Board in and by itself, the County Board can insist that a referendum be undertaken before they agree to cooperate or participate in the financing program.

Mr. Samuels stated that it is his belief that the hospital will never come to the County to support the bond issue. He believes it will be fully supported by the revenue of the hospital. He also explained the "controlled rate program". In the State of Wisconsin the rates of hospitals are controlled by a rate review mechanism and that rate review mechanism recognizes that you have to have proper modern facilities to provide quality care to your community. They recognize that since the planning agencies have issued a certificate of need for this project that it is in fact a proper project, therefore under their regulations, imposed by the State they will allow you to have revenues sufficient to pay the debt.

Members of the Board directed questions to Mr. Deml, Mr. Kramer and Mr. Samuels during their presentation. Some members expressed their opinions regarding their project.

Sup. Bilkey moved the Resolution of Intent be given further consideration and specific action be taken on the Resolution at the July meeting of the Board.

Sup. Brown seconded the motion.

Vote taken on motion of Sup. Bilkey. Carried.

Prior to the vote on the Resolution Sup. Regan stated he would like to see a show of hands by the members indicating their intent.

Chairman Scullion requested a show of hands and eleven members indicated support for the project.

## RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE HOSPITAL REVENUE BOND FINANCING FOR MEMORIAL HOSPITAL OF IOWA COUNTY, INC.

WHEREAS Iowa County, Wisconsin (the "County") and the City of Dodgeville, Wisconsin (the "City") propose jointly to facilitate the financing of the construction and equipping of an addition to Memorial Hospital of Iowa County, Dodgeville, Wisconsin (the "Hospital") (the "Project") for the purpose of improving hospital services available to

their citizens; and

WHEREAS the Hospital was created and is owned by the County Board of Iowa County, Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 45.05 Wisconsin Statutes and is being operated by Memorial Hospital of Iowa County, Inc., a Wisconsin nonprofit corporation (the "Corporation") pursuant to a contract pursuant to s. 45.055, Wis. Stats. (the County "Lease") dated February 1, 1974 by and between the County and the Corporation; and

WHEREAS the Corporation's rental payments required by the County Lease are used by the County to pay debt service on its outstanding notes previously issued to provide funds for its acquisition of the Hospital; and

WHEREAS the City is authorized by Section 66.521, Wisconsin Statutes to issue its limited obligation revenue bonds for the purpose of financing the Project (the "Bonds") by loaning the proceeds from the sale of such bonds to the Corporation; and

WHEREAS the City adopted a Resolution on June 16, 1981 initially authorizing the issuance of its limited obligation revenue bonds subject to the terms contained in such Resolution; and

WHEREAS It is determined that the marketability of the Bonds will be enhanced by the action taken hereby expressing the present intention of the County to finance on an annual basis an amount equal to the cost of the Corporation's debt service reserve fund requirement with respect to the Bonds pursuant to a Leasehold Mortgage, Loan and Security Agreement, dated July 1, 1981 from the Corporation to the City in the event and to the extent that the Corporation is unable to satisfy such requirement; and

WHEREAS it is also determined to be necessary to facilitate the financing of the Project to amend the County Lease (1) to enable the Corporation to grant a leasehold mortgage to the City of the Hospital property to secure the Bonds, (2) to extend the term of such County Lease and the date on which the option to purchase may be exercised to the date on which all the Bonds will have matured and none remain outstanding, (3) to subordinate the County's right to receive payments under the County Lease to the payment of debt service on the Bonds and (4) to provide for the reversion of the Corporation's interest in the property subject to the County Lease, whether such interest be leasehold or fee, if the Corporation fails at any time to maintain the Hospital as a suitable memorial pursuant to Section 45.05, Wisconsin Statutes:

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

 The County, pursuant to Sections 45.05 and 45.055, Wisconsin Statutes, subject to the Corporation's approval, shall amend the County Lease (1) to enable the Corporation to grant a leasehold mortgage to the City of the Hospital property to secure the Bonds, (2) to extend the term of such County Lease and the date on which the option to purchase may be exercised to the date on which all the Bonds will have matured and none remain outstanding, (3) to subordinate the County's right to receive payments under the County Lease to the payment of debt service on the Bonds, and (4) to provide for the reversion to the County of the Corporation's interest in the property subject to the County Lease, whether such interest be leasehold or fee, if the Corportion fails at any time to maintain the Hospital as a suitable memorial pursuant to Section 45.05, Wisconsin Statutes.

2. It is the present Intention of the County Board to issue its general obligation bonds, if and to the extent permitted by the laws then in effect, to finance on an annual basis an amount equal to the cost of the Corporation's debt service reserve fund requirement under the Security Agreement in the event and to the extent that the Corporation is unable to satisfy such requirement.

3. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

WHEREAS, the former highway will remain in place to serve local and county traffic; and

WHEREAS, this segment of highway is 4.84 miles in length and will be reconditioned in 1981 by the Department of Transportation under Project I.D. 1204-1-78; and

WHEREAS, other short segments of Highway 18 that will remain open to public travel will revert to Town of Dodgeville and City of Dodgeville jurisdiction;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the following be added to the County Trunk Highway System: That portion of an existing public highway described as follows: Beginning at the junction with Highway 23 in the City of Dodgeville near the southwest corner of Section 22, T6N, R3E, thence continuing easterly on the present roadway and alignment 1.78 miles to the junction with County Highway 'Z', a point approximately 1740 feet west and 2640 feet south of the northeast corner of Section 23, T6N, R3E.

The above described section of highway, when added to the system, will be an extension of County Trunk Highway 'Z'.

That portion of an existing public highway described as follows: Beginning at the junction with County Trunk Highway 'Y', located approximately 1320 feet west and 2640 feet south of the northeast corner of Section 24, T6N, R3E, thence continuing southeasterly on the present roadway and alignment 1.97 miles to the junction with USH 151, a point approximately 2640 feet east and 1580 feet south of the northwest corner of Section 29, T6N, R4E.

This section of highway, when added to the system, will be an extension of County Trunk Highway 'Y'.

WHEREAS, your Chairman, in consultation with the Chairmen of the other two Counties above named, has reviewed this matter and does believe that it is in the interest of Iowa County to establish an Airport Commission, pursuant to s. 114.14(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes, as hereinbelow set forth, and to appoint thereto as its representative, a person whom your chairman believes to be especially interested in aeronautics and the area served by this Airport;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Iowa County Board of Supervisors met in regular session that Iowa County does hereby join with the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Sauk and Richland Counties in establishing a three-member Commission for the operation of the Tri-County Airport located in the Township of Spring Green, Sauk County, Wisconsin, to consist of three members serving for terms of six years, in accordance with s. 114.14(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes, subject to the following:

- The Agreement, dated January 16, 1968, entered into by lowa, Richland and Sauk Counties shall determine all ownership rights and interests in all real estate and improvements previously acquired by said Counties pursuant to said Agreement;
- Such bylaws or rules, including the designation of the County treasury in which monies of the Commission shall be kept as well as procedures for accounting thereof, as shall be established by the members of the Commission as soon as possible following their appointment, and subsequently approved by the respective County Boards; and
- The members of the Commission shall be compensated and allowed expenses in the like manner as are members of the County Boards appointing them, until such time a different amount shall be designated in the bylaws of the Commission approved by the respective County Boards.

AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that William Michels be and hereby is appointed to a six-year term, commencing immediately,

as Iowa County's representative on the Tri-County Airport Commission hereinbefore established.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 17**

## COUNTY AID CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1982

SECTION I. The County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the county for highway work in the year 1982 under the provisions of Section 20.395 and Chapter 83 of the Statutes, and the additional sums herein appropriated, shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

SECTION II. COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENT. WHEREAS, the Division of Highways has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be Five hundred sixty-two thousand, six hundred ninety dollars (\$562,690.00) will become available at the end of the fiscal year under the provisions of Sections 83.10 and 20.395 (1) (qa) and (qb) of Statutes, for the county trunk highway system in the county, but the actual amount will not be known until the close of the fiscal year ending next June 30.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the said sum to the extent required to match and supplement Federal aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any Federal projects located on the county trunk highway system of said county, which are not recovered from Federal funds and to expend any balance for constructing, repairing, and maintaining such county trunk highway system and the bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 83.10 (1) of the Statutes, and to reimburse the general fund for any expenditures that may be made therefrom pursuant to Section 83.01(6) of the Statutes. The distribution to such purposes is estimated, but not specifically directed.

SECTION IV. WHEREAS it appears that certain additional highway improvements in the county are necessary and warranted.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby appropriate the following sums for the purpose hereinafter set forth:

- ( ) For the maintenance of the County Trunk Highway System the sum of General Maintenance: One million, four hundred fifty two thousand, two hundred sixty dollars (\$1,452,260.00); Winter Maintenance: Two hundred ten thousand dollars (\$210,000.00).
  - ( ) For emergency road or bridge repairs or construction, the

necessity for which is determined by the County Highway Committee and for which other funds are not available, the sum of One hundred forty seven thousand dollars (\$147,000.00).

- ( ) For the purchase of machinery and for machinery repairs the sum of Two hundred eighty eight thousand, seven hundred fifty dollars (\$288,750.00).
- ( ) For administration, including salaries, per diem, office and travel expense of the County Highway Committee, the County Highway Commissioner, his clerks and assistants not paid from construction or maintenance funds, the sum of Eighty nine thousand, seven hundred fifty dollars (\$89,750.00).

Total authorized in this Section \$2,187,760.00.

SECTION V. WHEREAS appropriations are made herein, in addition to the amounts to be received from the state and available for work in the county under Section 20.395 of the Statutes.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby levy a tax on all of the property in the county to meet such appropriations as follows:

 For County Aid under Section 83.14, as provided by Section III hereof, the sum of Ninety two thousand, nine hundred fifty nine and 87/100 Dollars (\$92,959.87).

WARNING: It is directed that provision for this levy shall be made in the county budget, but that this levy shall not be duplicated.

The County Clerk is directed to levy the special benefit assessments made herein as special charges against the respective municipalities as provided by law.

SECTION VII. WHEREAS the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefor.

BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the county budget, for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year.

SECTION VIII. WHEREAS the exact amount of the funds that will become available from the state for highway purposes in the county under Section 20.395 of the Statutes will not be known until on or after next June 30.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as hereinbefore authorized, from any funds in the County treasury that are not required for the purposes for which appropriated prior to next August 1 and to reimburse such funds in the County treasury from the sums received under Section 20.395 of the Statutes.

SECTION IX. WHEREAS the County Highway Committee and the County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenance of highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory and administrative duties,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Commissioner shall have authority to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate such personnel as he deems necessary for such purposes, provided however that the County Highway Committee may by action recorded in its minutes determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at

any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate any such person. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen, laborers, foremen, clerks, stenographers, or other employees necessary to carry on such activities.

THEREFORE, in order to provide for promptly making available the funds necessary for such improvements and to avoid the delay and expense incident to calling a special meeting of this board for such purpose.

BE IT RESOLVED that the State Highway Commission be and is hereby petitioned to advance pursuant to Section 84.03(5), Wisconsin Statutes, upon the filing of a request therefor by the County Highway Committee of this county, which said Committee is hereby authorized to file, such sums as may be required and are not otherwise available for any such previously authorized or additionally needed construction improvements in this county, with the understanding that the amounts thus advanced will be deducted from future state allotments for state trunk highway construction in this county under Section 84.03(3) of the Statutes, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Highway Commission be and is hereby petitioned, upon the filling of a request therefor by the County Highway Committee of this county, which said Committee is hereby authorized to file, to transfer to or between any such previously authorized or additionally needed construction improvements in this county, any funds allotted by the State under the provisions of Section 84.03(3), Wisconsin Statutes, and previously allocated to any other improvement or remaining unallocated in reserve.

WHEREAS, Section 85.21 of the Wisconsin Statutes authorizes the Wisconsin Department of Transportation to make grants to the counties of Wisconsin for the purpose of assisting them in providing specialized transportation services to the elderly and the handicapped; and

WHEREAS, each grant must be matched with a local share of not less than 10% of each county's allocation of state aids; and

WHEREAS, this body considers that the provision of specialized transportation services would improve and promote the maintenance of human dignity and self-sufficiency of the elderly and the handicapped.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of Iowa County on this 10th day of November 1981, authorizes the Iowa County Commission on Aging to prepare and submit to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation an application for assistance

during 1982 under Section 85.21 of the Wisconsin Statutes, in conformance with the requirements issued by the Department and also authorizes the obligation of county funds in the amount of \$1,400.00 in order to provide the required local match.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of lowa County authorizes the Iowa County Commission on Aging to execute a state aid contract with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation under Section 85.21 of the Wisconsin Statutes on behalf of Iowa County.

#### AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE TRAFFIC UPON THE STREETS AND HIGHWAYS OF IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN

The Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

STATE TRAFFIC LAWS ADOPTED. Except as otherwise specifically provided, the statutory provisions in Chapters 340 to 348 of the Wisconsin Statutes, describing and defining regulations with respect to vehicles and traffic, exclusive of any regulations therein for which the statutory penalty is a fine or term of imprisonment, are hereby adopted and by reference made a part hereof as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by an statute incorporated herein by reference is required or prohibited in the same manner by this ordinance. Any future amendments, revisions or modifications of the statutes incorporated herein are intended to be made part of this ordinance in order to secure uniform statewide regulation of traffic on the highways and streets of the State of Wisconsin. All previously enacted ordinances governing activities regulated by the provisions of Chapters 340 to 348 of the Wisconsin Statutes are hereby repealed.

Sup. Brown moved to adopt the Ordinance.

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Ordinance Amendment (No. 7 - February 16, 1982) recommending lowa County Zoning Ordinance be amended to add Section 3.35 to the Zoning Ordinance was read.

Whereas the tests of time and experience have shown that there is a need for a new district classification in the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance, and

Whereas the creation of a district to define a parcel other than residential which may be carved out of non-productive rural land would enhance the intent of the ordinance and allow an improvement in the overall use of the resources available, and

Whereas proper notice has been given, a public hearing has been held and support has been shown for the proposal and no opposition has been registered

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to add Section 3.35 to the Zoning Ordinance as follows:

AR 1 Agricultural Residential District

Permitted Principal Uses

Single Family Residence

The keeping of not more than two roomers or boarders by a resident family. Only one residence shall be allowed per lot and within this district the lot boundary shall be the same as the parcel or tract boundary as established or divided in a description for zoning approval. One animal unit over six months of age and two animal units under six months of age shall be allowed for each five acres of land in the lot. An animal unit is defined as one cow or one horse or two pigs or two sheep or two goats or twenty five fowl. Other animal, fowl or fish types shall be considered on an individual basis on specific applica-

tion. Accessory buildings including animal enclosures shall be allowed as provided for in Section 7.2 of this ordinance. The residence shall be considered the principal building. Building construction will not be allowed on land that is determined by the Zoning Committee to be productive agricultural land and the building site location will be considered as part of a land use change. Applicant is therefore required to file a plan showing building(s) location, roads, septic systems and any other change to the parcel with an application for an AR-1 District. The intention of this district is not to provide a residential area in the prime agricultural area or land but rather to allow an agricultural related use and a residence on a parcel that is not considered adequate to meet farm size or land type requirements.

Each application and hearing shall consider the lot(s) as at that time shown by the applicant. Any alteration of the parcel boundaries (as established in this district by zoning approval) which creates new lots less than 40 acres in size will cause a non-conforming condition within the initially approved parcel boundaries and building additions or new buildings will not be allowed unless approval is granted to consider the new lots created as individual lots. The required approval shall be sought in the same manner as a conditional use (Section 4) or a land use change (Section 11).

#### Conditional Uses

Two family dwellings providing the lot size is at least twice the lot area required in the dimensions of an R 2 District. Animal units exceeding those allowed as principal uses in this district or not covered by definition may be considered as a conditional use and be reviewed as a commercial feeding or breeding business as provided for in the A 1 District.
