SESSIONS of 1982

RULES FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE IOWA COUNTY BOARD

- Rule 1. The hour of meeting shall be 10:00 o'clock A.M. or 8:00 o'clock P.M., unless a different hour shall be prescribed.
- Rule 2. The Chairperson shall call the meeting to order at the hour fixed for the meeting. (1) The clerk shall call the roll of members and (2) a majority being present, the journal of the preceding meeting, if printed copies are not available, shall be read, that any errors may be corrected.
- Rule 3. The Chairperson shall preserve order and decorum, and may speak on points of order in preference to other members.
- Rule 4. The Board shall elect at the April meeting in even numbered years, a chairperson and also a vice-chairperson who shall serve for a two year term. The vice-chairperson shall act in the absence, disability, death or resignation of the chairperson or on a request to act and possess powers of the chairperson.
- Rule 5. The chairperson and vice-chairperson with the Committee on Committees shall appoint standing committees.
- Rule 6. All questions shall be stated by the chair. If the chairperson doubts as to the voice of the majority the chairperson or any members of the Board may call for a vote by either roll call or rising vote on the questions to be decided.
- The following committees shall be appointed: Committee on Claims, Printing, Audit and Property; Committee on Salary and Personnel; Committee on Finance, Bonds and Insurance; Committee on Agriculture, Soil and Water Conservation Supervisors; Committee on Health & Institutions: Committee on Courts: Justice & Law Enforcement; Committee on Civil Defense; Area Manpower Planning Board Delegate; Department of Social Services Board (elected); Committee on Tax Claims, Addressograph and Veterans Service Officer; Committee on Zoning and Planning, and Rural Planning Commission; Southwest Community Action Program Board; Committee on Highways (elected); 51.42 Board - Iowa County Representatives Unified Board - Grant and Iowa Counties; Advisory Members of Commission on Aging; Advisory Council - Commission on Aging; Hodan Center Board Members; Regional Planning Commission; Iowa County Housing Authority; Community Development Block Grant Committee; Hidden Valleys Committee; Committee on Resource Development; Legislative Committee; Southwest Wisconsin Library Board; County Traffic Safety Commission; Iowa County Board of Adjustment and Administrative Appeals Board; Joint County Transit Commission; Emergency Medical Services Council; Committee on Committees, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, and 3 elected members; Regional Policy Advisory Committee for S.W. Wisconsin (Iowa County Representatives); Mineral Point Airport Commission, Tri-County Airport (Iowa County Representative); Nutrition Board. The size of committees shall be limited to not less than three nor more than five members.
- Rule 8. After the journal shall have been read the order of business shall be as follows: 1. Letters, Petitions, Remonstrations, Communications and Accompanying Documents. 2. Resolutions. 3. Reports of Committees, first standing and afterward special committees. 4. Miscellaneous business. All individuals and groups requesting to appear before the County Board, first appear before a committee and be referred to the Board by said Committee.
- Rule 9. Every member present shall vote unless excused by the Chairperson.

- Rule 10. Every vote taken in regard to levying taxes, appropriating money, or dividing or altering the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be taken by Yeas and Nayes, and the same shall be entered on the journal.
- Rule 11. Roll Calls shall be taken by signed ballot. Ballot pads with names printed on pads will be furnished each supervisor.
- Rule 12. No petitions, resolutions or motions having for its object the division or alteration of the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be entered on or considered at the same session of the Board at which it was introduced, but the same shall lie over for consideration at the next regular adjourned or special session of the Board.
- Rule 13. Each member prior to speaking shall rise and address himself to and be recognized by the Chair. If two or more members arise at the same time the chairperson shall decide who shall speak first but in all other cases the member who arises and addresses the chair first shall have the preference.
- Rule 14. No report or resolution appropriating any money shall be acted upon until the next day after presentation without permission of two-thirds of the members present.
- Rule 15. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern in all cases where they are applicable.
- Rule 16. Any of the foregoing rules, except Rules 10 and 12 may be rescinded, changed or suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- Rule 17. Rules Nos. 10 and 12 may be rescinded, altered or suspended by a two-thirds vote of all the members entitled to seats on the County Board.
- Rule 18. No informal ballot cast by this Board shall be declared a formal ballot. In no case shall any official be elected by this Board by casting a unanimous vote in favor of any candidate or nominee.
- Rule 19. The Board shall meet monthly on the third Tuesday, in addition to the statutory meetings in April and November of each year. Special meetings shall be held subject to the call of the Chair.
- Rule 20. All officers elected by the County Board except those elected at the April session, shall be nominated and all nominations lay over to the following day before they are voted on.
- Rule 21. All resolutions or petitions to be presented to a session of the County Board shall be presented five days in advance of the scheduled session and a report or copy shall be mailed to each County Supervisor. An emergency situation may grant an exception provided approval is given by two-thirds of the membership.
- Rule 22. All purchases for the courthouse, courthouse annex and jail shall be channeled through the Purchasing Committee.
- Rule 23. No County Supervisor be permitted to sit on any one Committee for more than six consecutive years.
- Rule 24. No new business may be brought before the Board after 11:00 P.M.

DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Committee on Claims - Audit - Printing and Property
It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

1. To audit, allow or disallow all claims filed in the office of the

county clerk or referred to the committee, and shall file a schedule of such claims allowed with the county clerk for payment and shall make a report to the County Board of all claims audited.

- To meet with the State Auditors to study and examine the report on the accounts covered in their audit and make a report of the findings to the County Board.
- To accept bids on the printing of the County Board proceedings, stationery, envelopes and general printing for county officers and offices and court calendars.
- 4. To act on all matters of printing referred to them by the County Board or any department of the county.
- To supervise and have charge of the courthouse, courthouse annex, county owned buildings (not including highway and county home), county jail and the grounds of these buildings and the Gov. Dodge home site.
 - To keep in repair and good condition these properties.
- 7. In order to maintain uniformity of equipment, this committee shall purchase the equipment for all offices in the courthouse, courthouse annex and jail with the following exception no office equipment shall be purchased for the Highway Department, except when such purchases are made from the general fund or a mutual agreement on cost savings can be reached, through volume purchases of miscellaneous supplies.
- This committee shall function during the year and when the County Board is not in session.

Committee on Social Services

It Shall Be the Duty of this Board:

- I. At the first meeting of such board, elect from their numbers, a chairperson, a secretary, and such other officers as they deem necessary. Vacancies in such offices shall be filled for the unexpired terms. The chairperson shall preside at all meetings when present, and shall countersign all actions taken by the board. In case of the absence of a chairperson for any meeting the members present shall choose a temporary chairperson.
- 2. Appoint a county director of public welfare subject to the provisions of s. 49.50 (2) to (5) and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.
- Supervise the working of the county department of social services and shall be the policy-making body determining the broad outlines and principles governing the administration of the functions, duties and powers assigned to said department under s. 46.22 (4) and (5).
- 4. Whenever it determines that there is a need therefor, appoint committees consisting of residents of the county, which committee shall advise with the board on any matter for which they are created, but members of such committees shall serve without compensation.
- Consult with the county director of the social services concerning the preparation of the annual budget, the annual report of the county department of social services and the appointment of necessary personnel.

Committee on Highway

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 The County Highway Committee shall have supervision over the maintenance and construction of all roads and bridges as provided by statutes and shall submit to the County Board an annual report including the report of the County Highway Committee of all receipts and expenditures in the County Highway Department and shall submit an annual budget and recommendations for the tax levy for road and bridge purposes to the County Board at the annual session and any other duties as outlined in the statutes or as directed by County Board action.

The Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the operation of the county ambulance.

Committee on Salary and Personnel

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To set the policy of each department not in conflict with the Statutes or when called upon for this purpose, also to designate the duties and responsibilities of the different offices.
- To hear and consider the grievances reported by county departments, county officers and county employees and to make their recommendations to the County Board after sufficient consideration with the committee responsible.
- To meet at least annually not later than October 15th of each year.
- To recommend to the County Board the compensation of all county officers and employees.
- To receive from all other committees responsible for hiring employees, all matters pertaining to clerk hire, salary, working hours and conditions and departmental problems.

Committee on Finance - Bonds and Insurance

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To prepare and present to the County Board at the annual session the budget and tax levy; first in a temporary form, and finally in a complete form as changed during the County Board session.
- To report upon all resolutions and petitions for appropriations presented to the Board.
- To report and make recommendations on the finances of the county from time to time when required.
- To meet annually with the supervisor of assessments and county assessors at their spring meeting.
- To determine the amounts of bonds to be furnished for the county officers to the county and to report on the sufficiency of such bonds.
- To designate and report to the county board the banks of lowa County that may apply as a depository for county funds.
 - 7. To have charge of all county insurance.

Committee on Agriculture and Extension Education

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To perform all duties prescribed by law as further instructed by the County Board.
- To work with the UW-Extension Office to set county policy and procedure for the operation of this office.
- To work with state and federal representatives to enter into, consummate and cancel contracts.
- To represent the UW-Extension Office on salaries and appropriations, and to examine and approve all claims filed by Extension Agents.
- 5. Extension Agents are: Agricultural, 4-H and Youth, and Home Economist.
- 6. To serve as Soil and Water Conservation District Supervisors. In this capacity, set local policy for the Soil Conservation Service office maintaining a good program of soil and water conservation.
- To administer and carry out all Soll and Water Conservation responsibilities as required by Chapter 92, State Statutes.

To work with County Forestry service to promote reforestration and better management.

Committee on Health and Institutions

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To act as an advisory committee with the Board of Trustees in the maintenance, repairs and construction of buildings.
- To report to the County Board but in no way interfere with the management of the Nursing Home by the Board of Trustees as established by law.
- To act in an advisory capacity with the county nurse on all types of health programs and may audit the personnel expenses.
- Annually plan and recommend the budget for the health program.

Committee on Tax Claims - Addressograph and Veterans Office It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To consider, examine and report to the County Board, its findings in all matters of illegal assessments, tax titles and delinquent lands that may come before the board for action.
- 2. To supervise all delinquent taxes returned to the county, supervise the taking of tax deeds, supervise the sale of real estate taken on tax deed to the end that the property is returned to the tax roll and aid in the collection of delinquent taxes. Where the value of the property involved warrants it, the committee shall have the power to appraise the property and in its discretion insure it for the benefit of the county.
- To make appraisals pursuant to Chapter 75.69 of the county owned tax deed lands.
- To sell and dispose to the best interest of the county those lands to which the county has taken tax deeds.
- To employ the services of the county surveyor to establish the location of county owned property when necessary.
- To authorize and recommend the county treasurer at their discretion to assign to heirs, mortgages or adjacent property owners, tax certificates purchased by the county at the annual sale of tax certificates.
- 7. To advise with and assist the service officer regarding his duties in compliance with Wisconsin Statutes.
 - To meet as necessary.
- To have charge of and supervise the operation and use of the addressograph system.

Committee on Courts, Justice and Law Enforcement It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- This Committee shall be responsible for the operation of the Sheriff's Department, including:
 - Hiring and firing of personnel, subject to county personnel policies, and general supervision of all non-elected personnel.
 - b. Setting salaries in consultation with personnel committee.
 - Initiating all requisitions for purchases within the department.
 - d. Upkeep and maintenance of the jail building and equipment; and major repairs, remodeling, or additions to be referred to the County Board, through the Public Property Committee.

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d. Upkeep and maintenance of the jail building and equipment; and major repairs, remodeling, or additions to be referred to the County Board, through the Public Property Committee.

 e. Presentation of an annual budget to the County Board, for approval. This budget will anticipate all purchases of major equipment such as cars, radio, radar, office equipment, etc. This committee shall have the same authority over Courts and Justice including the following offices:

Judge
District Attorney
Clerk of Circuit Court
Child Support Investigator

Juvenile Officer Register in Probate Family Court Commissioner

To consider the reports and information made available by the courts for presentation to the County Board.

Committee on Civil Defense

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 This committee, under the direction of the County Board chairperson, shall to the extent of its ability carry out the duties of the Civil Defense program as covered by Wisconsin Statutes.

Committee on Rural Planning and Zoning

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To function as governed by Wisconsin Statutes 27.015, 59.97, 236 and any other requirement of law relating to planning or zoning as affecting the county.
- To have jurisdiction (to the extent of Committee authority as a delegate of the County Board) over the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, the Shoreland-Floodplain Ordinance including Sanitary Code and the Subdivision Ordinance.
- To confer with local units of government, hold hearings, and make recommendations on matters relating to planning and zoning in the county.
- To prepare a plan and coordinate the implementation of Chapter 91 (Farmland Preservation Act) and review applications for inclusion in the program.

Committee on Resource Development

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To give assistance in an advisory capacity in so far as is possible for all resource development in Iowa County.
- To have charge of and advise with the County Board on all matters regarding airports.
- To audit the accounts of any money appropriated by the County Board for conservation work.
- To supervise the purchase of equipment and supplies used in association with the duties of this committee where the funds were appropriated by the County Board.
- To have charge of and advise the Iowa County Board of all matters relative to conservation of the natural resources of the county and to cooperate with all county, state and federal organizations in the development of the same.
- 6. To receive all petitions referred to it by the County Board, by the Highway Committee and any citizen group relating to the construction, relocation, maintenance and repairs of any federal, state or county road in the county and report their recommendations to the next session of the County Board.
- To confer with the Highway Committee on all allocations and grants of federal and state funds and on any other highway matters of major importance.

RESOLUTION NO. 16

Resolution Establishing Tri-County Airport Commission Bylaws

WHEREAS, the County Boards of Iowa, Richland and Sauk Counties have entered into an Agreement for the ownership, operation and control of the Tri-County Airport, located in the Township of Spring Green, Sauk County; and

WHEREAS, said County Boards have deemed it desirable to establish an Airport Commission pursuant to the provisions of s. 114.14 of the Wisconsin Statutes; and

WHEREAS, each County Board at its August, 1981 session did appoint its representatives for a term of six years on a three-member Commission for the operation of the Tri-County Airport, pursuant to s. 114.14(2), Wisconsin Statutes, subject to such bylaws or rules to be established by the members of the Commission and approved by the respective County Boards; and

WHEREAS, your Commission members have extensively reviewed this matter, in consultation with local interested persons and users of the Tri-County Airport and has made the following recommendations for its Bylaws;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE IOWA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, MET IN REGULAR SESSION, THAT:

- 1. The Tri-County Airport Commission, consisting of three members as created by actions of the Iowa, Richland and Sauk County Boards at their August. 1981 sessions, shall have complete and exclusive control and management of the Tri-County Airport, subject to the reserved powers of the respective County Boards, hereinafter enumerated or reserved to said County Boards by Chapter 114 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
- 2. All monies appropriated for the construction, improvement, equipment, maintenance or operation of said Airport or earned by such Airport or made available for its construction, improvement, equipment, maintenance or operation in any manner whatsoever shall be deposited with the Treasurer of lowa County, where such monies shall be kept in a special fund and paid out only on order of the Airport Commission, drawn and signed by the Secretary and countersigned by the Chairman of the Commission.
- 3. Such Airport Commission is expressly authorized to execute, in the name of the Tri County Airport, such contracts, leases or other agreements as they deem necessary for the construction, improvement, equipment, maintenance or operation of the Airport, subject to the normal budgetary procedures of the respective County Boards. Such Commission may contract with the United States, the State of

Wisconsin, or any agency thereof; may petition in the name of the governing body, for such state and federal aid as may be available for Airport purposes, and after resolution certifying the availability of local funds, or appropriation of such funds, may execute agency agreements, contracts and all other documents necessary to the project.

- 4. Such Airport Commission shall, in consultation with the chairpersons, legal and financial officers of the Iowa, Richland and Sauk County Boards, establish an Airport accounting system of sufficient detail to enable the Commission to accurately and equitably establish and maintain rates and charges, eliminate inefficient operation and maintenance practices, and to accomplish sound control and planning for the Tri-County Airport.
- 5. Such Airport Commission shall meet at least once each month to review Airport operations and financial matters, discuss proposed Airport development and conduct such other business as may properly concern it. The Commission shall hold, at least quarterly, its meetings at the Tri-County Airport, so that the members may physically inspect and review Airport facilities and operations.
- 6. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws, or any other resolution, ordinance or other official action of the Airport Commission or of the Iowa, Richland or Sauk County Boards, no fees, charges, or regulations shall become effective, nor shall any act, contract, lease or other activity of the Airport Commission become binding on any County, until the same shall be expressly authorized by the County Board of Supervisors of such County, and then only to the extent so expressly authorized.
- 7. Such Airport Commission shall prepare and submit for adoption by the respective County Boards, an ordinance establishing Airport operation policies, minimum requirements for the conduct of aeronautical services on the Airport, regulations pertaining to traffic on and use of Airport facilities, and such other matters as may be deemed necessary by the Commission. As part of, or in conjunction with said ordinance, the Commission shall prepare and submit for adoption standard leases and agreements for the various types of Airport activities and land uses authorized in said ordinance.
- 8. Such Airport Commission shall make studies and conduct surveys as appropriate to assist in improving the operation of the Airport. It shall cooperate with the Wisconsin Bureau of Aeronautics and the Federal Aviation Administration in Airport and system planning functions and other activities. It shall solicit and otherwise encourage users and interested members of the public in providing input to and making contributions toward the successful operation and development of the Airport.
- 9. Such Airport Commission shall prepare and submit to each of the respective County Boards a report, at least annually or upon request of one of the County Boards, which shall include current information on aircraft operations, based aircraft, Airport expenditures and revenues, along with comparative figures for the past year and projections for the foreseeable future, plus such other information deemed pertinent or specifically requested.

In accordance with the normal budgetary procedures of the respective County Boards, such Airport Commission shall prepare and submit an annual budget setting forth anticipated revenues and expenditures, including capital improvements.

3. Create Section 5.07:

- Article VIII. Add as a new sentence at the end of 8.01:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Iowa County does hereby limit its liability for all medical and dental care furnished as

general relief after June 15, 1982 to the amount payable by medical assistance for similar care.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the 10 cent per equalized thousand 1982 and after tax levy shall be collected from the municipalities named and shall be appropriated to accounts for the ambulance services listed as follows: Town and Village of Arena to Arena Ambulance; Town of Brigham, 1/4 the Town of Moscow, 1/4 the Town of Ridgeway, Villages of Barneveld and Ridgeway to Barneveld Ambulance; 1/4 the Town of Clyde, 57.504% Town of Pulaski and the Village of Avoca to the Avoca Ambulance; ¼ Town of Clyde, ¼ the Town of Eden, the Town of Highland, the Village of Highland and ¼ the Village of Cobb to Highland Ambulance; the Towns of Dodgeville, Linden, Mineral Point, Waldwick, ¼ the Town of Eden, ¾ the Towns of Moscow and Ridgeway, ¼ the Town of Wyoming, ¼ the Villages of Cobb and Hollandale, the Village of Linden, the Cities of Dodgeville and Mineral Point to Iowa County Ambulance; 1/4 the Town of Mifflin and 1/4 the Town of Moscow to the Ambulance Service Account; ¼ the Town of Eden, ¾ the Town of Mifflin, the Villages of Livingston, Montfort and Rewey to Montfort Ambulance: 42.496% the Town of Pulaski, the Village of Muscoda to Muscoda Ambulance; 1/4 the Town of Clyde to Lone Rock Ambulance; 1/4 the Town of Wyoming to Spring Green Ambulance; 1/4 the Town of Moscow, 1/2 the Village of Hollandale, the Village of Blanchardville to Blanchardville Ambulance.

Be It Further Resolved that an in-county service (Arena, Avoca, Barneveld, Highland, Iowa County) is eligible to borrow not more often than once in a five year period up to \$30,000.00 from funds as available and approved by the Finance Committee for the purchase of a vehicle and we recommend that each service continue or initiate a charge system for services rendered to partially recover operational costs especially where available from third party payers and services requesting borrowed funds shall be responsible to provide full coverage insurance protection.

- Direct service by bookmobile to people In communities where there is no library and where sufficient population and use would warrant such service. (Bookmobile service will be offered to smaller communities where there are libraries to the extent that bookmobile scheduling permits.)
- Enrichment of existing public libraries in the area through collections of books and other materials on a rotating basis.
- Professional advice and in-service training to be carried on in a continuous and progressive program.
- Centralized purchasing and processing service for public libraries in the area.
 - Reference and information services, and referral services from the System headquarters to any resident of the area through the bookmobile or any public library in the area, or directly by mail to individuals without reasonable access to a library or bookmobile stop.
 - Cooperation with academic, school and special libraries in the area for the improvement of overall library service to all residents.
 - Any other services, including but not limited to books-by-mail and programming for children, that are approved by the

System Board and for which funding is available that will improve overall library service in the area.

IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED:

That the annual budget for the Southwest Wisconsin Library System shall be established by the System Board, that the budget shall be funded by such portion of state aids available to the System and by appropriations from each participating county, and

That each county's appropriated share thereof shall be apportioned according to population, based on the federal census or the more current, latest certified population estimates of the Wisconsin Department of Administration, and

WHEREAS, the Commission contracted with the Southeastern Wisconsin Transportation Co., d/b/a Central Wisconsin Railroad Company (Central Wisconsin) to temporarily operate that line until a permanent replacement operator could be provided;

WHEREAS, the Commission proceeded to look for a permanent replacement short-line operator and has negotiated a permanent operating agreement with Central Wisconsin, subject, however, to approval by WisDOT and confirmation by the county boards of each of the counties creating the Commission;

WHEREAS, said Commission may only contract for a new permanent operator pursuant to vote of approval by the county boards of each of the counties creating the Commission;

WHEREAS, this leasing of the Pecatonica rail property and con-

tracting for the operation of said property by Central Wisconsin has been submitted to this Board and discussed by this Board;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN, AS FOLLOWS, TO-WIT:

In the Matter of THE IOWA COUNTY JAIL.

ORDER

WHEREAS; the Iowa County Jail, located in Dodgeville, Wisconsin, has been periodically inspected for the last twenty-three years by a representative of the Department of Health and Social Services pursuant to the requirements of Section 46.17 (3) of the Wisconsin State Statutes, and

WHEREAS; in the past twenty-three years representatives of the Department of Health and Social Services have requested

improvements be made to the Iowa County Jail to comply with the requirements of the Wisconsin Jail Standards as established by the Department of Health and Social Services, and

WHEREAS; the Department of Health and Social Services placed limited use restrictions on the Iowa County Jail by letter dated May 1, 1978, and

WHEREAS; the Department of Health and Social Services listed all violations of established jail standards existing in the Iowa County

Jail by letter dated January 14, 1981, with orders that the necessary work be done to correct the deficiencies, and

WHEREAS; the Department of Health and Social Services deferred the order of January 14, 1981, pending outcome of the Iowa County Jail study committee formed to study the jail problems and bring a solution to the Iowa County Board, and

WHEREAS; as of May 21, 1982, the Iowa County authorities have not established a plan of action to correct the deficiencies in the Iowa County Jail, and

WHEREAS; the Iowa County Jail study committee has been inactive since February of 1982.

It is therefore ORDERED, pursuant to Section 46.17 (3) of the Wisconsin State Statutes, Iowa County construct a new jail building or correct the conditions in the present jail as reported below:

- Provide for the safety and welfare of all persons confined and pursuant to the requirements of Section 59.68 (1), Wis. Stats., provide a jail and other necessary buildings at the county seat and KEEP THEM IN GOOD REPAIR.
- Provide for suitable wards, buildings or cells to segregate prisoners pursuant to requirements of Section 53.36, Wis. Stats.
- Provide for suitable living arrangements for the confinement of Juveniles pursuant to the requirements of Section 48.209, Wis. Stats.
- Provide three complete sets of jail and fire escape keys to be used in the case of an emergency pursuant to PW-C 50.03 (2) (Wis. Adm. Code).
- Provide for the capability to release all prisoners in the case of an emergency pursuant to PW-C 50.03 (3) (Wis. Adm. Code).
- Provide for a security door with an observation opening at the jail confinement entrances to permit entrance of only authorized persons pursuant to PW-C 50.03 (6) (Wis. Adm. Code).
- Install modern locking devices on all security doors with the capability of selective operation of all doors, either individually or collectively pursuant to PW-C 50.03 (7) (Wis. Adm. Code).
- Provide for opaque or glazing of the windows to prevent persons from observing prisoners within the jail pursuant to PW-C 50.03 (9) (Wis. Adm. Code).
- Pursuant to the requirements of Section 53.37 (1), Wis, Stats., provide for sufficient hot water and light and heat for all prisoners. The present light fixtures are not sufficient and shall be replaced with a good security type fixture. Hot water shall be provided to each cell for comfortable light bathing.
- Provide each cell with several collapsible nonbreakable hooks for towels and clothing pursuant to PW-C 50.01 (3) (Wis. Adm. Code).
- Provide fire and smoke alarms throughout the detention area pursuant to requirements of PW-C 50.01 (7) (Wis. Adm. Code).
- Provide for sufficient air movement and temperature controls as mandated by the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations code requirements.
- Provide for security type mirrors to be installed in each living area.
- 14. Provide a secure area for receiving prisoners where the booking and orientation process can be accomplished, allowing for safety of staff, separation and privacy of prisoners from each other.

- Provide a secure, easy to supervise area where prisoners can communicate and visit with family and friends.
- Areas must be provided for conferences with attorneys or counsel, interrogation, medical exam, library, religious activities, education and physical exercise other than the immediate day room by each cell.
- Provide for sufficient secure storage of prisoners property as well as equipment necessary for administration of the jail.
- Provide for protection of all exposed mechanical equipment controls, light switches, lock mechanisms that prisoners have contact with.

AND, in case work to comply with this order to the satisfaction of the Department of Health and Social Services or construction of a new jail is not commenced within six months after receipt of this order, further use of said jail for the purpose of housing prisoners will be prohibited pursuant to Section 46.17 (3) of the Wisconsin State Statutes.

Any remodeling or new construction must be in accordance with the Wisconsin Building Code and plans must be approved by the Department of Health and Social Services.

Land Conservation Committee

- b. The remaining five members of the Committee shall be selected by the Committee on Committees for appointment by the County Board. At least two members must also be members of the Agriculture Committee, and there must be representation of the Zoning and Planning Committee and Resource Development Committee on the Land Conservation Committee.
- c. Performs the functions required by Chapter 92 of the Wisconsin Statutes as repealed and recreated by Chapter 346, Laws of 1981.
- Supervise the functions and activities of the Iowa County Department of Land Conservation.
- There is created the Iowa County Department of Land Conservation which shall consist of the present Iowa County employees who work with the Iowa County Soil and Water Conservation District.

WHEREAS, two members of the Iowa County Sheriff's Department have filed a complaint with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission for an equal work, equal pay condition that does not now exist in that department alleging that these members perform duties as jailors and patrol officers on an occasional basis but are paid on a secretarial scale, and,

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Law Enforcement Committee has reviewed this working condition and found that these two members do in fact occasionally perform services as jailors and/or patrol officers while receiving wages on a secretarial scale, which scale is lower than corresponding scales for jailors and patrol officers, and,

WHEREAS, during the July 8, 1982 and August 3, 1982 meetings of the lowa County Law Enforcement Committee the members of that committee agreed that these two persons should be paid the same rate of pay for the type of work they are doing as the regular persons in that classification receive.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Iowa County Law Enforcement Committee recommends that while officers or employees of the Iowa County Sheriff's Department are performing duties as patrol and/or dispatcher-jailors, their wages for those hours should be based upon the established departmental rate for those duties.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this order shall become effective as of January 1, 1982 and wages paid under the provisions of this resolution shall be paid retroactively to that date.

RESOLUTION NO. 7 COUNTY AID CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1983

James Whitford

Iowa County Tax Claims Committee

SECTION I. The County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the county for highway work in the year 1983 under the provisions of Section 20.395 and Chapter 83 of the Statutes, and the additional sums herein appropriated, shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

SECTION II. COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENT. WHEREAS the Division of Highways has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be Six hundred twenty-four thousand seven hundred Dollars (\$624,700.00) will become available at the end of the fiscal year under the provisions of Sections 83.10 and 20.395 (1) (qa) & (qb) of the Statutes, for the county trunk highway system in the county, but the actual amount will not be known until the close of the fiscal year ending next June 30.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the said sum to the extent required to match and supplement Federal aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any Federal projects located on the county trunk highway system of said county, which are not recovered from Federal funds, and to expend any balance for constructing, repairing, and maintaining such county trunk highway system and the bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 83.10 (1) of the Statutes, and to reimburse the general fund for any expenditures that may be made therefrom pursuant to Section

83.01(6) of the Statutes. The distribution to such purposes is estimated, but not specifically directed.

SECTION IV. WHEREAS it appears that certain additional highway improvements in the county are necessary and warranted.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby appropriate the following sums for the purpose hereinafter set forth:

- () For the maintenance of the County Trunk Highway System the sum of General Maintenance: One million two hundred seventy three thousand two hundred Dollars (\$1,273,250.00); Winter Maintenance: Two hundred ten thousand Dollars (\$210,000.00).
- () For emergency road or bridge repairs or construction, the necessity for which is determined by the County Highway Committee and for which other funds are not available, the sum of One hundred forty-seven thousand Dollars (\$147,000.00).
- () For the purchase of machinery and for machinery repairs the sum of Two hundred twenty-eight thousand seven hundred fifty Dollars (\$228,750.00).
- () For administration, including salaries, per diem, office and travel expense of the County Highway Committee, the County Highway Commissioner, his clerks and assistants not paid from construction or maintenance funds, the sum of Eighty-nine thousand seven hundred fifty Dollars (\$89,750.00).

SECTION V. WHEREAS appropriations are made herein, in addition to the amounts to be received from the state and available for work in the county under Section 20.395 of the Statutes,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby levy a tax on all of the property in the county to meet such appropriations as follows:

() For County Aid under Section 83.14, as provided by Section III hereof, the sum of Forty-eight thousand eight hundred fifteen dollars and twenty-eight cents (\$48,815.28)

WARNING: It is directed that provision for this levy shall be made in the county budget, but that this levy shall not be duplicated.

SECTION VII. WHEREAS the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefore.

BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the county budget, for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year.

SECTION VIII. WHEREAS the exact amount of the funds that will become available from the state for highway purposes in the county under Section 20.395 of the Statutes will not be known until on or after next June 30.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as hereinbefore authorized, from any funds in the County treasurer that are not required for the purposes for which appropriated prior to next August 1 and to reimburse such funds in the County treasury from the sums received under Section 20.395 of the Statutes.

SECTION IX. WHEREAS the County Highway Committee and the County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenance of highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory and administrative duties.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Commissioner shall have authority to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate such personnel as he deems necessary for such purposes, provided however that the County Highway Committee may by action recorded in its minutes determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate any such person. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen, laborers, foremen, clerks, stenographers, or other employees necessary to carry on such activities.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Committee is hereby authorized, pursuant to Section 83.015(2) of the Statutes, to purchase without further authority, and to the extent that revolving funds accumulated for such purpose or appropriations made for such purpose are available, such highway equipment as they deem necessary to properly carry on the work, and to trade or sell such old equipment as may be considered to be for the best interests of the county;

PROVIDED that no one complete unit of equipment of a value exceeding One hundred thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be purchased without further authority of the County Board.

BE IT RESOLVED that the State Highway Commission be and is hereby petitioned to advance pursuant to Section 84.03(5), Wisconsin Statutes, upon the filing of a request therefor by the County Highway Committee of this county, which said Committee is hereby authorized to file, such sums as may be required and are not otherwise available for any such previously authorized or additionally needed construction improvements in this county, with the understanding that the amounts thus advanced will be deducted from future state allotments for state trunk highway construction in this county under Section 84.03(3) of the Statutes, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Highway Commission be and is hereby petitioned, upon the filing of a request therefor by the County Highway Committee of this county, which said Committee is hereby authorized to file, to transfer to or between any such previously authorized or additionally needed construction improvements in this county, any funds allotted by the State under the provisions of Section 84.03(3), Wisconsin Statutes, and previously allocated to any other improvement or remaining unallocated in reserve.

Whereas, Nicholas Basting was sworn into the Office of Sheriff of Iowa County on January 3, 1983, and,

Whereas, Sheriff Nicholas Basting has appointed to the position of Chief Deputy Sheriff, William R. Whitford.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the Iowa County Committee on Courts, Justice and Law Enforcement would recommend that the full Board of Iowa County Supervisors approve the appointment of William R. Whitford to the position of Chief Deputy Sheriff for the Iowa County Sheriff's Department.

Bernard Sersch, Chairman Robert Masters Thomas Paull David Sears

Sup. Sersch moved to approve the resolution.

Sup. Martin seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. Sersch moved to express gratitude to former Chief Deputy Sheriff, Robert Hille for his services to Iowa County.

Sup. Sears seconded the motion. Carried.

Mr. Scott Nelson appeared before the Board to discuss the Day

Care Program as it is related to the Community Options Program (COP).

Mr. Nelson stated that there is a problem with funding for disabled people, the mentally retarded, and elderly people in that the State will not reimburse people who are classified as ICF 3's and ICF 4's in nursing homes and need twenty-four hour care.

The State feels that these two classifications of people need supervision, not nursing care and would get supervision in a group home. The problem is that Iowa County does not have a group home.

Mr. Nelson stated that an option for Iowa County is to fund some of these people as a subsidy to Social Security.

Loren Hoffmann, Social Worker Supervisor, explained what the COP program involves. He stated that the program is designed to keep people of any age out of institutional settings where medical assistance funds would be used to pay for their care. He said that the average maximum amount received by each person would be \$400.00 a month from the COP program.

Mr. Hoffmann explained the guidelines which must be followed to be eligible for the COP program in 1984. He asked that the County Board facilitate in the process and decide who will serve on the Committee. There are some required agencies who must serve on the Committee and other recommended ones.

He stated that a leading agency must be designated, and that the Department of Social Services is usually this agency but is not required to lead.

Sup. Masters moved to refer the COP Program to the 51.42 Board, Commission on Aging Board, Social Services Board, and Scott Nelson for the discussion of a steering committee and a leading agency for the COP Program.

Sup. Grover seconded the motion. Carried.

The Board proceeded to the election of a Trustee for Bloomfield Manor to succeed Victor Jonas.

Chairman Scullion stated that Sup. Sersch, Robert Regan, and Bob Campbell have shown interest in the position.

As a result of the election Mr. Robert Regan was elected Trustee for Bloomfield Manor for a term of three years.

Joan Larson, District Director for Southern District Employment and Training Services, appeared before the Board explaining the changes in the Job Partnership Act.

She explained that most of the changes take place in the delivery of the money throughout the State.

Discussion was held on the possibility of Iowa County being a service delivery area and the advantages of being one.

Mrs. Karen Bogenschneider, Home Economist, addressed the Board and presented the Iowa County Extension Office Quarterly Report (No. 9). Mrs. Bogenschneider explained the reports of the 4H and Youth Agent, Iowa County Agricultural Agent, and Home Economist.

Banners were displayed from the banner pageant presented at the state homemaker meeting in October, Extension Homemakers, Zella Olsen, Grace Schwartz, Lois Clifton, Fern Leix, and Becky Stauffer spoke on the advantages of the County Homemakers organization.

Discussion was held on the county farm. Sup. Masters stated that he thought the property could be sold and be put to a better use.

Communication (No. 10) from the Department of Health and Social Services ordering that as of December 21, 1982, the Iowa County Jail should not be used for the secure detention of persons was read by Sup. Sersch.

In the matter of the Iowa County Jail, on June 17, 1982, orders were drafted by the State Department of Health and Social Services and delivered to you and other county government officials on June 21, 1982, to commence work within six months to construct a new jail building or correct the conditions in the present jail as stated in that order, pursuant to Section 46.17(3) of the Wisconsin State Statutes. It has been determined that work has not commenced to the satisfaction of this Department.

Department of Health and Social Services approval for housing of persons in the Iowa County Jail is rescinded and it is hereby ordered that as of December 21, 1982, the Iowa County Jail shall not be used for the secure detention of persons. Pursuant to Section 46.16(7), any further communications in this matter from your office be brought to the attention of the Iowa County District Attorney, Paul McLimans.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE FEBRUARY SESSION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY SUPERVISORS OF IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN

February 15, 1983

The Board of Supervisors met in February Session at the Courthouse in the City of Dodgeville on Tuesday, February 15, 1983 at 8:00 P.M. and was called to order by Honorable Richard Scullion, Chairman of the Board.

Roll Call taken. All members reported present with the exception of Sup. Paull who had been excused.

Certification (No. 1) of the County Clerk stating notice of this meeting had been posted, reported to the press and radio station as required by law was read.

Sup. Laufenberg moved the certification be accepted.

Sup, Hogan seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. Whitford led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Minutes of the January Session were presented.

Sup. Swedlund moved to approve the minutes as printed.

Sup. Hogan seconded the motion. Carried.

Agenda for the February Session was presented.

Chairman Scullion advised the Board of the additions to the agenda since being mailed to the members.

Sup. Grover moved to approve the agenda with the additions.

Sup. Whitford seconded the motion. Carried.

Communication (No. 2) from the family of Boyd Brown expressing gratitude to the lowa County Board of Supervisors for all their acts of kindness was read.

Sup. Eichorst moved to accept the communication.

Sup. Whitford seconded the motion. Carried.

Communication (No. 3) listing persons selected to serve as Emergency Fire Wardens for that part of lowa County which is in the Dodgeville Fire Control Area was read.

Sup. Swedlund moved to approve the Emergency Fire Wardens.

Sup. McCarville seconded the motion. Carried.

Discussion was held on the recommendations for a Supervisor in District #19 of the County Board of Supervisors. Chairman Scullion advised the Board that he could not make a fair recommendation because the Village of Rewey had not been contacted. He added that everyone in the District should have a chance to recommend someone.

Sup. Hogan moved to table the appointment of a Supervisor for District #19 until the March Session.

Sup. Swedlund seconded the motion. Carried.

Discussion was held on a possible Rehabilitation Center at Bloomfield Manor. Sup. Bilkey explained that the program would involve brain injured adults who would receive medical assistance. She added that Bloomfield Manor has a decreasing number of patients and the rehabilitation program would add up to ten more patients. This would require little preparation and the staff would not need special training for the care of these people, according to Sup. Bilkey.

Sup. Eichorst moved to show that the County Board supports the implementation of the Rehabilitation Program.

Sup. Bilkey seconded the motion, Carried.

Discussion on the County Jail was held. Sup. Sersch read a letter from Corporation Counsel, Frank Berryman, stating that his petition to re-open the jail was denied but the petition for a hearing was granted. A preliminary hearing is set for March 4, 1983.

Sheriff Nicholas Basting appeared before the Board and stated that all the improvements that have been done to the jail are condemned by the State and added that all improvements have been stopped because of this.

Personnel Policies were discussed by Sup. Bilkey. She explained that every month Personnel Policies will appear on the agenda and a different chapter will be available in the County Clerk's office if anyone has any questions on it before the County Board Session that month.

Affirmative Action and Classification of Positions (Chapter 2) was available before the February Session.

Sup. Laufenberg moved to approve Chapter 2 of the Personnel Policies.

Sup. Eichorst seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. Laufenberg stated that the Job Descriptions for the Union Employees are available in the County Clerk's office if anyone would like to look at them before they go to the Union.

Sup. Eichorst expressed gratitude to Sup. Bilkey for writing the Job Descriptions and for the tremendous job she has done on them.

Chairman Scullion recommended Sup. Masters and Sup. McCarville be appointed to serve on the Chairperson, Administrator or Manager Committee.

Sup. Eichorst moved to approve the appointment of Sup. Masters and Sup. McCarville to the Chairperson, Administrator or Manager Committee.

Sup. Retrum seconded the motion. Carried.

Discussion was held on the lease of the County Farm. Sup. Masters stated that the lease expires March 1, 1983 and his concern that it has not been put up for bids.

Sup. John Hogan, Chairman of the Public Property Committee, said that the rental land was promised to the present renter, Mr. Roy Strickfaden in September but Mr. Frank Berryman hasn't written up the new lease yet.

Mr. John Brokish appeared before the Board and stated he felt the County should sell a part or all of the farm and possibly use the money toward a new jail.

Mr. Elliott Brown appeared stating that almost all the farm had been plowed and if we get any heavy rains this spring it will wash away.

Sup. Sersch moved to table the discussion until Mr. Frank Berryman can be present so he can explain some things.

Sup. Bilkey seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. Masters moved to not sell or lease the County farm property until March 21, 1983.

Sup. Sears seconded the motion.

Ballot Vote (No. 4) was taken.

Total Votes Cast 19; Ayes - 4, Bilkey, Masters, Sears, Finkelmeyer. Noes - 15, Sersch, Martin, Eichorst, Michels, Laufenberg, Grover, Hogan, Scullion, Whitford, Watters, Swedlund, McCarville, Retrum, Palzkill, Murn.

Motion lost.

Resolution (No. 5) for the sale of the County farm was discussed. Sup. McCarville moved to table the Resolution.

Sup. Laufenberg seconded. Carried.

Discussion on the publication of delinquent faxes was held. Sup. Masters stated that he does not favor this because it is not fair to those who can not pay their taxes. Chairman Scullion said the County can not do anything about the newspapers publishing the delinquent taxes because it is public knowledge.

Discussion on the sale of the house west of the Commission on Aging building was held.

Sup. Michels moved to have the Public Property Committee proceed with negotiations and bring a final recommendation to the County Board.

Sup. Martin seconded the motion. Carried.

Resolution (No. 6) of the Tax Claims Committee relative to taking tax deeds was read.

Mr. Mueller stated that under Wisconsin Statutes 59.07 (1) the county farm must be used for public uses or purposes of any nature and he questioned whether renting the farm for a farming operation is a public purpose.

Mr. Mueller also questioned the legality of the Public Property Committee amending the terms of the March 1, 1980 lease to grant the lessee until August of 1983 to pay the balance due on the 1982 rent of \$34,000.

Mr. Doug Knox explained that he would like to see a long-term conservation program implemented on the county farm.

Sup. Murn moved to rent the county farm to Mr. Strickfaden for this crop year (1983) only, and that:

- The County put a secured assignment on the Payment in Kind Corn Program;
- an assignment on the 1983 Conservation Program, and an agreement to follow conservation practices set up by the Conservation Department;
- and the balance of the 1982 rent plus interest due- be paid on or before August 1, 1982;
- 4. with all 1983 rent payments paid by December 31, 1983.
