SESSIONS OF 1987

RULES FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE IOWA COUNTY BOARD

- Rule 1. The hour of meeting shall be 10:00 o'clock A.M. or 8:00 o'clock P.M., unless a different hour shall be prescribed.
- Rule 2. The Chairperson shall call the meeting to order at the hour fixed for the meeting. (1) The clerk shall call the roll of members and (2) a majority being present, the journal of the preceding meeting, if printed copies are not available, shall be read, that any errors may be corrected.
- Rule 3. The Chairperson shall preserve order and decorum, may speak on points of order in preference to other members.
- Rule 4. The Board shall elect at the April meeting in even numbered years, a chairperson and also a vice-chairperson who shall serve for a two year term. The vice-chairperson shall act in the absence, disability, death or resignation of the chairperson or on a request to act and possess powers of the chairperson.
- Rule 5. The chairperson and vice-chairperson with the Committee on Committees shall appoint standing committees.
- Rule 6. All questions shall be stated by the chair. If the chairperson doubts as to the voice of the majority the chairperson or any members of the Board may call for a vote by either roll call or rising vote on the questions to be decided.
- The following committees shall be appointed: Committee on Claims, Printing, Audit and Property; Committee on Salary and Personnel; Committee on Finance, Bonds and Insurance; Committee on Agriculture, Soil and Water Conservation Supervisors; Committee on Health & Institutions; Committee on Courts; Justice & Law Enforcement: Committee on Civil Defense: Area Manpower Planning Board Delegate; Department of Social Services Board (elected); Committee on Tax Claims and Veterans Service Officer; Data Processing Committee; Committee on Zoning and Planning, and Rural Planning Commission; Southwest Community Action Program Board; Committee on Highways (elected); 51.42 Board - Iowa County Representatives Unified Board - Grant and Iowa Counties; Advisory Members of Commission on Aging; Advisory Council - Commission on Aging; Hodan Center Board Members; Regional Planning Commission; Community Development Block Grant Committee; Hidden Valleys Committee; Committee on Resource Development; Legislative Committee; Southwest Wisconsin Library Board; County Traffic Safety Commission; Iowa County Board of Adjustment and Administrative Appeals Board; Joint County Transit Commission; Emergency Medical Services Council; Committee on Committees, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, and 3 elected members; Regional Policy Advisory Committee for S.W. Wisconsin (Iowa County Representatives); Mineral Point Airport Commission, Tri-County Airport (Iowa County Representative); Nutrition Board. The size of committees shall be limited to not less than three nor more than five members.
- Rule 8. After the journal shall have been read the order of business shall be as follows: 1. Letters, Petitions, Remonstrations, Communications and Accompanying Documents. 2. Resolutions. 3. Reports of Committees, first standing and afterward special commit-

- tees. 4. Miscellaneous business. All Individuals and groups requesting to appear before the County Board, first appear before a committee and be referred to the Board by said Committee.
- Rule 9. Every member present shall vote unless excused by the Chairperson.
- Rule 10. Every vote taken in regard to levying taxes, appropriating money, or dividing or altering the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be taken by Yeas and Nayes, and the same shall be entered on the journal.
- Rule 11. Roll Calls shall be taken by signed ballot. Ballot pads with names printed on pads will be furnished each supervisor.
- Rule 12. No petitions, resolutions or motions having for its object the division or alteration of the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be entered on or considered at the same session of the Board at which it was introduced, but the same shall lie over for consideration at the next regular adjourned or special session of the Board.
- Rule 13. Each member prior to speaking shall rise and address himself to and be recognized by the Chair. If two or more members arise at the same time the chairperson shall decide who shall speak first, but in all other cases the member who arises and addresses the chair first shall have the preference.
- Rule 14. No report or resolution appropriating any money shall be acted upon until the next day after presentation without permission of two-thirds of the members present.
- Rule 15. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern in all cases where they are applicable.
- Rule 16. Any of the foregoing rules, except Rules 10 and 12 may be rescinded, changed or suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- Rule 17. Rules Nos. 10 and 12 may be rescinded, altered or suspended by a two-thirds vote of all the members entitled to seats on the County Board.
- Rule 18. No informal ballot cast by this Board shall be declared a formal ballot. In no case shall any official be elected by this Board by casting a unanimous vote in favor of any candidate or nominee.
- Rule 19. The Board shall meet monthly on the third Tuesday, in addition to the statutory meetings in April and November of each year. Special meetings shall be held subject to the call of the Chair.
- Rule 20. All officers elected by the County Board except those elected at the April session, shall be nominated and all nominations lay over to the following day before they are voted on.
- Rule 21. All resolutions or petitions to be presented to a session of the County Board shall be presented five days in advance of the scheduled session and a report or copy shall be mailed to each County Supervisor. An emergency situation may grant an exception provided approval is given by two-thirds of the membership.
- Rule 22. All purchases for the courthouse, courthouse annex and jail shall be channeled through the Purchasing Committee.

Rule 23. No new business may be brought before the Board after 11:00 p.m.

DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Committee on Claims - Audit - Printing and Property
It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To audit, allow or disallow all claims filed in the office of the county clerk or referred to the committee, and shall file a schedule of such claims allowed with the county clerk for payment and shall make a report to the County Board of all claims audited.
- To meet with the State Auditors to study and examine the report on the accounts covered in their audit and make a report of the findings to the County Board.
- To accept bids on the printing of the County Board proceedings, stationery, envelopes and general printing for county officers and offices and court calendars.
- 4. To act on all matters of printing referred to them by the County Board or any department of the county.
- To supervise and have charge of the courthouse, courthouse annex, county owned buildings (not including highway and county home), county jail and the grounds of these buildings and the Gov. Dodge home site.
 - To keep in repair and good condition these properties.
- 7. In order to maintain uniformity of equipment, this committee shall purchase the equipment for all offices in the courthouse, courthouse annex and jail with the following exception no office equipment shall be purchased for the Highway Department, except when such purchases are made from the general fund or a mutual agreement on cost savings can be reached, through volume purchases of miscellaneous supplies.
- This committee shall function during the year and when the County Board is not in session.

Committee on Social Services

It Shall Be the Duty of this Board:

- 1. At the first meeting of such board, elect from their numbers, a chairperson, a secretary, and such other officers as they deem necessary. Vacancies in such offices shall be filled for the unexpired terms. The chairperson shall preside at all meetings when present, and shall countersign all actions taken by the board. In case of the absence of a chairperson for any meeting the members present shall choose a temporary chairperson.
- Appoint a county director of public welfare subject to the provisions of s. 49.50 (2) to (5) and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.
- Supervise the working of the county department of social services and shall be the policy-making body determining the broad outlines and principles governing the administration of the functions, duties and powers assigned to said department under s. 46.22 (4) and (5).
- 4. Whenever it determines that there is a need therefor, appoint committees consisting of residents of the county, which committee shall advise with the board on any matter for which they are created, but members of such committees shall serve without compensation.

Consult with the county director of the social services concerning the preparation of the annual budget, the annual report of the county department of social services and the appointment of necessary personnel.

Committee on Highway

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. The County Highway Committee shall have supervision over the maintenance and construction of all roads and bridges as provided by statutes and shall submit to the County Board an annual report including the report of the County Highway Committee of all receipts and expenditures in the County Highway Department and shall submit an annual budget and recommendations for the tax levy for road and bridge purposes to the County Board at the annual session and any other duties as outlined in the statutes or as directed by County Board action.
- The Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the operation of the county ambulance.

Committee on Salary and Personnel

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To conduct collective bargaining, including mediation/arbitration, with recognized collective bargaining units of County employees.
- To submit the final negotiated agreement with each bargaining unit to the County Board for approval or rejection.
- 3. To hear and consider grievances, to administer the contracts, and to exercise all management functions, including hiring, laying-off and discharging, both represented and non-represented employees, except that the Committee on Highway shall exercise such authority relative to employees of the Highway Department, and the Committee on Courts, Justice and Law Enforcement shall exercise such authority relative to employees of the Sheriff's Department.
- To defend or institute legal proceedings relative to county rights under the collective bargaining contracts or 111.70 Wis. Stats.
- To review the wages, hours and conditions of employment of all employees not represented by recognized employee organizations and submit recommendations to the County Board each year for the following year.
- To be responsible for all other matters involving County employees arising under the collective bargaining contract or 111.70 Wis. Stats.

Committee on Finance - Bonds and Insurance

- To prepare and present to the County Board at the annual session the budget and tax levy; first in a temporary form, and finally in a complete form as changed during the County Board session.
- 2. To report upon all resolutions and petitions for appropriations presented to the Board.
- To report and make recommendations on the finances of the county from time to time when required.
- To meet annually with the supervisor of assessments and county assessors at their spring meeting.
 - 5. To determine the amounts of bonds to be furnished for the

county officers to the county and to report on the sufficiency of such bonds.

- To designate and report to the county board the banks of Iowa County that may apply as a depository for county funds.
 - 7. To have charge of all county insurance.

Committee on Agriculture and Extension Education It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To perform all duties prescribed by law as further instructed by the County Board.
- To work with the UW-Extension Office to set county policy and procedure for the operation of this office.
- To work with state and federal representatives to enter into, consummate and cancel contracts.
- To represent the UW-Extension Office on salaries and appropriations, and to examine and approve all claims filed by Extension Agents.
- Extension Agents are: Agricultural, 4-H and Youth, and Home Economist.
- To serve as Soil and Water Conservation District Supervisors.
 In this capacity, set local policy for the Soil Conservation Service office maintaining a good program of soil and water conservation.
- To administer and carry out all Soil and Water Conservation responsibilities as required by Chapter 92, State Statutes.
- 8. To work with County Forestry service to promote reforestration and better management.

Committee on Health and Institutions

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To protect and promote the public health of citizens of Iowa County as set forth by State statute, through direct employment of qualified personnel.
- To act as governing body for the Iowa County Community Health Nursing Agency, and to oversee all policies and programs of that agency.
- To meet annually at Bloomfield Manor to review the State Survey and the Annual Budget.

Committee on Tax Claims and Veterans Office

- To consider, examine and report to the County Board, its findings in all matters of illegal assessments, tax titles and delinquent lands that may come before the board for action.
- 2. To supervise all delinquent taxes returned to the county, supervise the taking of tax deeds, supervise the sale of real estate taken on tax deed to the end that the property is returned to the tax roll and aid in the collection of delinquent taxes. Where the value of the property involved warrants it, the committee shall have the power to appraise the property and in its discretion insure it for the benefit of the county.
- To make appraisals pursuant to Chapter 75.69 of the county owned tax deed lands.
- To sell and dispose to the best Interest of the county those lands to which the county has taken tax deeds.

- To employ the services of the county surveyor to establish the location of county owned property when necessary.
- To authorize and recommend the county treasurer at their discretion to assign to heirs, mortgages or adjacent property owners, tax certificates purchased by the county at the annual sale of tax certificates.
- 7. To advise with and assist the service officer regarding his duties in compliance with Wisconsin Statutes.
 - 8. To meet as necessary.
- To have charge of and supervise the operation and use of the addressograph system.

Committee on Courts, Justice and Law Enforcement It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- This Committee shall be responsible for the operation of the Sherlff's Department, including:
 - Hiring and firing of personnel, subject to county personnel policies, and general supervision of all non-elected personnel.
 - b. Setting salaries in consultation with personnel committee.
 - Initiating all requisitions for purchases within the department.
 - d. Upkeep and maintenance of the jall building and equipment; and major repairs, remodeling, or additions to be referred to the County Board, through the Public Property Committee.
 - Presentation of an annual budget to the County Board, for approval. This budget will anticipate all purchases of major equipment such as cars, radio, radar, office equipment, etc.
- 2. This committee shall have the same authority over Courts and Justice including the following offices:

Judge

District Attorney

Clerk of Circuit Court
Child Support Investigator

Juvenile Officer Register in Probate

Family Court Commissioner

To consider the reports and information made available by the courts for presentation to the County Board.

Committee on Civil Defense

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 This committee, under the direction of the County Board chairperson, shall to the extent of its ability carry out the duties of the CIVII Defense program as covered by Wisconsin Statutes.

Committee on Rural Planning and Zoning

- To function as governed by Wisconsin Statutes 27.015, 59.97, 236 and any other requirement of law relating to planning or zoning as affecting the county.
- To have jurisdiction (to the extent of Committee authority as a delegate of the County Board) over the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, the Shoreland-Floodplain Ordinance including Sanitary Code and the Subdivision Ordinance.

- To confer with local units of government, hold hearings, and make recommendations on matters relating to planning and zoning in the county.
- To prepare a plan and coordinate the implementation of Chapter 91 (Farmland Preservation Act) and review applications for Inclusion in the program.

Committee on Resource Development

- To give assistance in an advisory capacity in so far as is possible for all resource development in Iowa County.
- To have charge of and advise with the County Board on all matters regarding airports.
- To audit the accounts of any money appropriated by the County Board for conservation work.
- To supervise the purchase of equipment and supplies used in association with the duties of this committee where the funds were appropriated by the County Board.
- To have charge of and advise the lowa County Board of all matters relative to conservation of the natural resources of the county and to cooperate with all county, state and federal organizations in the development of the same.
- 6. To receive all petitions referred to it by the County Board, by the Highway Committee and any citizen group relating to the construction, relocation, maintenance and repairs of any federal, state or county road in the county and report their recommendations to the next session of the County Board.
- To confer with the Highway Committee on all allocations and grants of federal and state funds and on any other highway matters of major importance.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE ORGANIZATIONAL SESSION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY SUPERVISORS OF IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN

April 21, 1987

The Board of Supervisors met in April Session at the Courthouse in the City of Dodgeville on Tuesday, April 21, 1987, at 7:30 p.m., and was called to order by Honorable Richard Scullion, Chairman of the Board.

Roll call taken. All members reported present with the exception of Sup. Eichorst, who had been excused.

Certification (No. 1) of the County Clerk stating notice of this meeting had been posted, reported to the press and radio station as required by law was read.

Sup. Bentzler moved to approve the certification.

Sup. Palzkill seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. Draves led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The Minutes of the March 17, 1987, Session of the Board were presented.

Sup. Lee moved to approve the minutes as printed and mailed,

Sup. Whitford seconded the motion. Carried.

The Agenda for the April 21, 1987, Session was presented with one addition.

Sup. Ellarson moved to approve the agenda with the addition.

Sup. Ramsden seconded the motion, Carried.

Chairman Scullion announced that a Statement of Receipts and Expenditures for January 1 - March 31, 1987, was handed out to each County Board member and that they should review it. Sup. J. Murn asked if it was possible to include the previous years receipts and expenditures for the same time frame in the future, so that they could compare the two years. County Clerk, Claire Olson, stated that he would check with the Data Processing Manager to see if this is a possibility.

The following letters and reports were presented to the Board:

(A) A letter from Governor Tommy Thompson thanking the Board for receipt of Iowa County's resolution regarding the Task Force on County and Local Mandates.

(B) An invitation from Joseph Alexander, Bloomfield Manor Administrator, to a recognition dinner for Dr. Hohler on April 29, 1987.

(C) A letter from the Department of Administration thanking the Board of Supervisors for sending them a copy of the County and Local Mandates resolution.

(D) Notification of a Wisconsin Counties Association Southern District Meeting on May 8, 1987.

(E) Labor Market Highlights for February, March, 1987.

(F) Chairman Scullion read a letter and resolution relating to the support of Jackson County's bid for a State correctional facility.

RESOLUTION NO. 2A

Relating to Supporting Jackson County's Bid for a State Correctional Facility

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin is continuing to consider various locations for the construction of the prison within the State of Wisconsin Correctional System, and

WHEREAS, the placement of such facilities should equitably distribute the responsibilities and benefits to the geographic regions of the State and to accomplish that goal, a facility should be located in the West-Central region of the State, and

WHEREAS, Jackson County has adequate resources to support such a project within the County, including but not limited to airport facilities, building sites, potential employees, educational facilities, fire and police protection, a community hospital, other excellent community support systems, the Interstate System and central locations between major regional cities, and

WHEREAS, on April 7, 1987, the citizens of Jackson County voted on a referendum question regarding location of a prison in Jackson County. Said vote tally was seventy-five percent (75%) to twenty-five percent (25%) in favor of locating a prison in Jackson County. More specifically, the referendum passed by an eighty-five to fifteen percent margin in the City of Black River Falls, Jackson County, and

WHEREAS, on April 7, 1987, voters in Sturtevant, Racine County voted on a referendum question regarding locating a prison in Sturtevant, Wisconsin. Said vote tally was fifty-one to forty-nine percent against locating a prison in Sturtevant, Wisconsin.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Iowa County Board of Supervisors encourage Gov. Tommy Thompson and area legislators to support Jackson County's bid for the site of the new prison.

Sarah Weler, Iowa County Home Economist, explained her purpose in the Iowa County Extension Program. Extension Homemakers

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Grace Schwartz and Carla Rohowetz spoke to the Board on the benefits of the Homemaker program.

Resolution (No. 2) recognizing that February 12, 1987, marks the 75th anniversary of the educational partnership between the counties of the state and the University of Wisconsin-Extension was read.

RESOLUTION NO. 2

WHEREAS, Ernest L. Luther was appointed the state's first county Extension Agent in Oneida County on February 12, 1912; and

WHEREAS, February 12, 1987, marks the 75th anniversary of this unique educational partnership between the counties of the state and the University of Wisconsin-Extension; and

WHEREAS, this partnership, as pioneered in Wisconsin, embodies the true meaning of the "Wisconsin Idea" — that the resources and knowledge of the University shall be extended to the people of the state wherever they live and work; and

WHEREAS, the 75th anniversary of Mr. Luther's appointment commemorates the contributions of all Cooperative Extension county agents to the growth and development of the entire state; and

WHEREAS, the vitality of today's county Cooperative Extension programs can be credited to the men and women of vision who accepted the challenge in 1912 to create the Wisconsin county extension system;

THEREFORE, be it resolved, that the members of the lowa County Board hereby commend the University of Wisconsin-Extension, its division of Cooperative Extension, and its local county extension faculty for their cooperation and support which have enabled the people of lowa County to apply the research and knowledge of the University in their homes, farms, schools and businesses.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Cooperative Extension Service has been staggered by unprecedented budget cuts which will likely further intensify as federal, state and county governments struggle to balance budgets; and

WHEREAS, since January 1, 1985, Agriculture/Agri-Business programs have lost nine county agents, two area, four paraprofessional, 16 full time state specialists, and several state program support positions; and

WHEREAS, during the next four years an additional 14 county agricultural agents and 8 to 10 state specialist positions are scheduled to be eliminated - a 30 percent reduction; and

WHEREAS, the capacity of University of Wisconsin-Extension to address the educational needs of Iowa County agriculture and agribusiness - our county's largest industry - will be sharply curtailed at a time when the need for unbiased research-based information and educational programs is critical; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa County agriculture and 4-H positions are critical positions for the profitability of agriculture in Iowa County; and

WHEREAS, the cut in state level specialist positions will include both a dairy nutritionist, an agronomist (forages), and farm management specialist;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Iowa County Cattlemen's Association expresses its sincere concern regarding the reduced support for research and education to improve the productivity and profitability of forage-livestock systems at both the state and county level and urges University of Wisconsin-Extension, the Iowa County Board of Supervisors and the state of national legislators to maintain support for these vitally important Agriculture/Agri-Business programs.

WHEREAS, the rural counties of the state recognize the value to the state of having the urban library systems properly funded for the resources which they provide to the entire state; and

WHEREAS, the member counties of the Southwest Wisconsin Library System area have contributed their requested allocation to the Southwest Wisconsin Lilbrary System but the state has not met its statutory obligation under the formula; and

WHEREAS, an indexed formula provides the fairest method for distributing aids to public library systems; and the indexed formula was revised during the 1985-86 legislative session to improve the fairness of the formula; and

WHEREAS, it would create further chaos in system funding if the formula were to be eliminated solely because its existence creates an expectation of a firm funding level, and because such expectations are the intended purpose of the indexed formula; and

WHEREAS, It is inherently unfair for a legislature to establish a formula which has had the support of the entire library community of the state and then refuse to fund it at the statutory level and further seek to eliminate the formula; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the board of supervisors of Iowa County call upon the legislators to restore full funding for public library system aids for 1988 at the full indexed level of 13 percent, and to maintain that funding level for the next biennium so that public library systems throughout the state may experience stable and predictable funding levels for the first time in their history.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, that Iowa County shall contract with the Village of Muscoda for the right to use a specified portion of the Facility, and that, in consideration for the right to use the Facility, the County shall (a) designate the Facility as its principal resource recovery facility and take such action under the Wisconsin Solid Waste Flow Control Statute (Section 144.794, Wisconsin Statutes) as is necessary to assure an adequate supply of solid waste to the Facility, (b) be responsible for a portion of the annual debt service on the Bonds to be issued by the Village and (c) obtain a state trust fund loan in order to provide a source of funds to satisfy the County's obligation to pay such debt service. The rights and obligations of the County and the Village generally shall be as outlined in the Agreement on Solid Waste Disposal presented to this Board.

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Ordinance (No. 3) of the Law Enforcement Committee to prohibit TRESPASS TO LAND in Iowa County was presented.

To the Iowa County Board of Supervisors:

Whereas, the Iowa County Law Enforcement Committee recommends that the County Board enact an ordinance to prohibit TRESPASS TO LAND in Iowa County.

Now, Therefore, the Iowa County Board of Supervisors adopts as a County ordinance, Section 943.13 of the Wisconsin Statutes, which reads as follows:

TRESPASS TO LAND

(a) Enters any enclosed or cultivated land of another with intent to catch or kill any birds, animals or fish on the land or gather any products of the soil without the express or implied consent of the owner or occupant to engage in any of those activities.

(b) Enters or remains on any land of another after having been notified by the owner or occupant not to enter or remain

on the premises.

(c) Hunts, shoots, fishes or gathers any product of the soil on the premises of another, or enters said premises with intent to do any of the foregoing after having been notified by the owner or occupant not to do so.

(d) Enters any enclosed or cultivated land of another with a vehicle of any kind without the express or implied consent of

the owner or occupant.

(2) A person has received notice from the owner or occupant within the meaning of this section if he has been notified personally, either orally or in writing, or if the land is posted. For land to be posted, a sign at least 11 inches square must be placed in at least 2 conspicuous places for every 40 acres to be protected. The sign must carry an appropriate notice and the name of the person giving the notice followed by the word "owner" if the person giving the notice is the holder of legal title to the land and by the word "occupant" If the person giving the notice is not the holder of legal title but is a lawful occupant of the land. Proof that appropriate signs as herein provided were erected or in existence upon the premises to be protected within 6 months prior to the event complained of shall be prima facle proof that the premises to be protected were posted as herein provided.

(3) Whoever erects on the land of another signs which are the same as or similar to those described in sub. (2) without obtaining the express consent of the lawful occupant of or holder of legal title to such

land is subject to the penalty provided for in this ordinance.

That the penalty for a violation of this ordinance will be a forfeiture not to exceed \$200.00.

Resolution (No. 22) of the Highway Committee for county aid construction and maintenance during the calendar year 1988 was read.

RESOLUTION NO. 22 COUNTY AID CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1988

SECTION I. The County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the county for highway work in the year 1988 under the provisions of Section 20.395 and Chapter 83 of the Statutes, and the additional sums herein appropriated, shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

SECTION II. COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENT WHEREAS, the Division of Highways has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be Seven Hundred Thirty Seven Thousand Four Hundred Eighty Three & 55/100 Dollars (\$737,483.55) will become available at the end of the fiscal year under the provisions of Sections 83.10 and 20.395(1)(qa) and (qb) of the Statutes, for the county trunk highway system in the county, but the actual amount will not be known until the close of the fiscal year ending next June 30.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the said sum to the extent required to match and supplement Federal aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any Federal projects located on the county trunk highway system of said county, which are not recovered from Federal funds, and to expend any balance for constructing, repairing and maintaining such county trunk highway system and the bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 83.10(1) of the Statutes, and to reimburse the general fund for any expenditures that may be made therefrom pursuant to Section 83.01(6) of the Statutes. The distribution to such purposes is estimated, but not specifically directed.

SECTION IV. WHEREAS, it appears that certain additional highway improvements in the county are necessary and warranted.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Board does hereby appropriate the following sums for the purpose hereinafter set forth:

For the maintenance of the County Trunk Highway System the sum of:

General Maintenance - Six Hundred Thirty Five Thousand Nine Hundred Twelve & 42/100 Dollars (\$635,912.42).

Winter Maintenance: Three Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$310,000.00).

For the purchase of machinery and for machinery repairs the sum of One Hundred Sixty Five Thousand Two Hundred Four & XX/Dollars (\$165,204.00).

For administration, including salaries, per diem, office and travel expense of the County Highway Committee, the County Highway Commissioner, his clerks and assistants not paid from construction or maintenance funds, the sum of One Hundred Twenty Thousand & No/Dollars (\$120,000.00).

SECTION V. WHEREAS, appropriations are made herein, in addition to the amounts to be received from the state and available for work in the county under Section 20.395 of the Statutes,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Board does hereby levy a tax on all of the property in the county to meet such appropriations as follows:

For County Aid under Section 83.14, as provided by Section III hereof, the sum of One Hundred Fifteen Thousand Three Hundred Sixty & 91/ Dollars (\$115,360.91).

WARNING: It is directed that provision for this levy shall be made in the county budget, but that this levy shall not be duplicated.

SECTION VII. WHEREAS, the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefor.

BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the county budget, for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year.

SECTION VIII. WHEREAS, the exact amount of the funds that will become available from the State for highway purposes in the county under Section 20.395 of the Statutes will not be known until on or after next June 30.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as hereinbefore authorized, from any funds in the County treasury that are not required for the purposes for which appropriated prior to next August 1 and to reimburse such funds in the County treasury from the sums received under Section 20.395 of the Statutes.

SECTION IX. WHEREAS, the County Highway Committee and the County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenance of highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory and administrative duties.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Highway Committee shall have authority to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate such personnel necessary for such purposes. The County Highway Committee may by action recorded in its minutes determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate any such person. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen, laborers, foremen, clerks, stenographers, or

other employees necessary to carry on such activities.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the State Highway Commission be and is hereby petitioned to advance pursuant to Section 84.03(5), Wisconsin Statutes, upon the filing of a request therefor by the County Highway Committee of this county, which said Committee is hereby authorized to file, such sums as may be required and are not otherwise available for any such previously authorized or additionally needed construction improvements in this county, with the understanding that the amounts thus advanced will be deducted from future state allotments for state trunk highway construction in this county under Section 84.03(3) of the Statutes, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the State Highway Commission be and is hereby petitioned, upon the filling of a request therefor by the County Highway Committee of this county, which said Committee is hereby authorized to file, to transfer to or between any such previously authorized or additionally needed construction improvements in this county, any funds allotted by the State under the provisions of Section 84.03(3), Wisconsin Statues, and previously allocated to any other improvement or remaining unallocated in reserve.

Nick Kramer, Attorney, explained that the project would not be run by the Village of Muscoda, rather by a 17 member Commission comprised of people from the three countles involved.

Frank Berryman, Corporation Counsel, asked that the language of the contract be cleared up by Indemnifying the Commission along with lowa County. It was agreed that this would be cleared up.

No decision was made and a request was made to find out what the other two countles had decided.

RECESS UNTIL 1:00 P.M.

Tom Schaefer appeared before the Board In regard to the Wisconsin County Mutual Insurance Corporation.

Mr. Schaefer explained that Iowa County has paid approximately \$201,398.00 for liability insurance in 1987 but he stated that underwriting runs in a cyclical manner and that the County should see a downward trend in premiums for the upcoming years.

Mr. Schaefer also explained the following points:

(A) If some of the 39 countles do not participate, rates and fixed costs will go up.

(B) The Wisconsin Counties Mutual Insurance Company can surcharge those counties having losses in addition to assessing all counties.

- (C) Future years budgets are committed to this year's insurance costs.
- (D) While assessibility is currently limited to the year's premium, there appears to be no limit on the number of years you can be assessed.
- (E) The Board of Directors may amend the years premium rule and make it unlimited if they so desire.
- (F) Three year participation commitment but accessibility will continue for years beyond that if necessary.
- (G) Administrative and unbundled costs are probably underestimated.

Roll call taken. All members reported present with the exception

of Sup. D. Murn, who had been excused.

Certification (No. 1) of the County Clerk stating notice of this meeting had been posted, reported to the press and radio station as required by law was read.

Sup. Paull moved to approve the certification. Sup. Michels seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. Finkelmeyer led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The Minutes of the January 20, 1988, meeting were presented.

Sup. Paull moved to approve the minutes.

Sup. Palzkill seconded the motion. Sup. J. Murn asked to have his motion from the January 20, 1988, Session of the Board changed to read that the bids for liability insurance be advertised once a week for three weeks in The Shopping News, The Dodgeville Chronicle, and The Wisconsin State Journal.

Motion carried with the change.

The Agenda for the February 16, 1988, meeting was presented with additions.

RESOLUTION NO. 2

A RESOLUTION PROHIBITING SMOKING IN COUNTY BUILDINGS

WHEREAS, cigarette smoking has been determined to be harmful to smokers and nonsmokers who breathe second-hand smoke; and

WHEREAS, the County of Iowa deems It appropriate to protect Its employees from risks associated with tobacco smoke by providing on-

ly selected areas for such activities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that smoking of cigarettes, pipes, cigars and similar materials shall be prohibited in all County-owned and rented buildings at all times, subject only to the exceptions contained herein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that smoking shall be permitted in the lowa County Courthouse only in the room now designated as the

basement coffee room.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that with respect to all other county buildings owned and operated by the County, the department supervisor at such location may, in their sole discretion, designate one room as a smoking area. In the event of such a designation, smoking shall be permitted only in the designated area.

This resolution shall become effective on the 1st day of March, 1988.

Ms. Crow explained the following benefits to the hospital of taking over the program:

Enhance coordination of home services.

(2) Increase scope of services the hospital has to offer and therefore expand presence in the service area.

(3) Deteritally allow hospital to maximize the Medicare reim-

(4) Fulfill the hospital need to provide home care services. The following were benefits Ms. Crow listed for lowa County:

(1) Simplicity of eliminating the program on the County level.

(2) Supportive of local hospital.

(3) Remove financial risk to Iowa County.

(4) Assurance of good quality care.

(5) Liability of home care is reduced.

(6) Eliminates financial subsidy after 1 year.

The Board was concerned about the \$25,000.00 subsidy. Sue Milz, Director of Nurses, reported that the Public Health Program is subsidized somewhat by the Home Care Program.

No decision was made on the program and will be discussed at a later date.

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The Veterans Service position was discussed. Personnel Committee Chairman, Jerome Laufenberg explained to the Board that he had spoken with the Veterans and they are pleased with the present Veterans Service Officer. He stated that by exercising management rights, the present person can continue in the position of Veterans Service Officer when made full time, If the county so chooses.

The following changes and/or additions should be made in the collective bargaining agreement between lowa County and the Sheriff's Department Unit.

(1) ARTICLE V

Modify Section 5.01 to read:

"Employees shall serve a one (1) year probationary period."

(2) ARTICLE VIII, HOURS

Modify the first sentence of Section 8.1 to read:

The normal work schedule shall be (6-2) (5-3) for road patrol and dispatchers, and (5-2) for clerical employees, unless mutually agreed otherwise.

(3) Delete the last sentence in paragraph 2 of page 5 (Section 8.2) and replace with:

and replace with.

"One-half (1/2) of the scheduled overtime shifts available in any given month and unscheduled overtime shall be assigned

in the following manner."

Create a new paragraph after the third full paragraph on

page 6:

"The remaining one-half (1/2) of the scheduled overtime shifts available in any given month shall be filled by the Sheriff with the officer(s) of his choice. If an odd number of scheduled overtime shifts are available in any month, the Sheriff shall schedule the extra shift (e.g., three of five shifts)."

(4) ARTICLE IX

Create Section 9.02 to read:

"Notice of recall shall be sent by the employer via certified mall, return receipt requested to laid-off employees' last known address. Employees who do not respond to such recall notice within fourteen (14) calendar days shall be dropped from the list and all rights shall be lost."

(5) ARTICLE X. HOLIDAYS

10.1 Add Election Day for secretaries to the existing list of scheduled holidays.

(6) 10.3 Employees working on a holiday shall receive one and one-half (1½) times their regular pay for all such hours worked.

(7) ARTICLE XI. VACATIONS

11.1 All employees shall be granted vacation time on the following basis:

One (1) week after one (1) continuous year of service. Two (2) weeks after two (2) continuous years of service. Three (3) weeks after eight (8) continuous years of service.

Four (4) weeks after eighteen (18) continuous years of service.

(8) 11.3 Vacations may be used from January to January. However, if an employee is separated from employment with the County, he will reimburse the County for any vacation which was taken but unearned.

(9) ARTICLE XII

Modify Section 13.1 to read:

"There shall be no reduction in the level of benefits provided under this provision, however, the employer may change insurance carriers or self-fund provided the new insurance plan(s) provides coverage equivalent to the coverage that presently exists."

(10) ARTICLE XIV. LEAVE OF ABSENCE WITHOUT PAY

14.4 Funeral and Emergency Leave: Paid leave up to three
(3) working days will be granted for necessary absence
from work caused by death, injury or illness in an
employee's immediate family, immediate family shall
be limited to parents, step-parents, brother, sister,
spouse, children, step-children, mother-in-law, father-inlaw, brother and sister of spouse, grandparents, spouse's
grandparents and grandchildren. One (1) day shall be

nieces, nephews, first cousins and to serve as pail

clerical employees.

(12) 15.5 The County will purchase eight (8) bullet proof vests for deputies use. The vests shall be worn in all high stress situations including, but not limited to, calls involving guns, domestic calls and stops at night.

(13) ARTICLE XXI. COMPENSATION

Effective January 1, 1988, wages shall be increased by two (2%) percent.

Effective January 1, 1989, wages shall be increased by two (2%) percent.

WHEREAS, your Tri-County Airport Commission, utilizing funds and acting in accordance with authority previously provided by said County Boards and with financial and other assistance provided by the private, Tri-County Airport Improvement Corporation, has arranged for remodeling and Improvements necessary to utilize the former FAA Building as a restaurant and has reached a tentative agreement with Interested parties for the operation of a restaurant on the premises; and

WHEREAS, your Tri-County Airport Commission, after careful consideration of its responsibilities and duties with regard to the Airport and after consultation with interested parties, has prepared a Lease and Agreement for Restaurant Operations, the form of which it recommends to said County Boards for approval as part of the Or-

Resolution (No. 8) of the Legislative Committee on Iowa County's position on the Chapter 74 rewrite was read.

RESOLUTION EXPRESSING POSITION ON CHAPTER 74 REWRITE

In 1986, the Wisconsin Legislative Council created the Special Committee on Property Tax Collection Laws to review and recodify Chapter 74 and other Chapters of the Wisconsin Statutes relating to the local property tax collection system. The committee has drafted proposals to modernize and provide uniformity to local tax collections. Some of the advantages include:

a. Definition of previously undefined terms.

b. Clear and simple language for layman's use.

c. Simplified format for ease of use.

d. Simplification and clarification of the tax sale concept and the recognition that it is basically an accounting function.

e. Appropriate limitations on the former owner's ability to claim

part of the proceeds of the tax deed sales.

There are three main proposals which will affect Iowa County and

all counties adversely.

Currently, taxpayers may elect to pay local taxes in full or in two installments. Municipalities collect first installments by local option deadlines ranging from January 31st to February 28th. Full real property payments, all special assessments and special charges and personal property taxes are also paid to municipalities by February 28. Municipalities pay county and educational entities their respective share of current collections and turn over the tax rolls by March 15. The County collects the second installment by July 31, and settles with municipalities and educational entities by August 20. Full settlement by counties is permissive.

1. Under the new proposal, a uniform three installment payment

system would be mandatory. Full, first installment and second installment payments (January 31 and April 30) would be collected by the local municipalities. Third installment would be collected by the County by July 31. Municipalities would also have to collect delinquencies from the first payment. This provides administrative problems because many municipal treasurers are part time with other job responsibilities. Collecting delinquencies must be done on a daily basis. Problems for counties are also increased. Reconciliation of municipal records prior to settlement is difficult once. Twice is too much.

2. The new proposal changes the delinquency calculation date to the due dates of January 31, April 30 and July 31. This change may result in the same situation as in earlier years on lower interest rates for county tax delinquency than for bank interest. The county was used as a short term low interest loan, and taxes were allowed to accrue for long periods of time. This situation was cleared up when higher interest rates and a penalty, plus the retroactive delinquency calculation date served to make the taxpayer pay taxes on time. Since the taxpayer who does pay timely ends up subsidizing those who do not, it is unfair to them and to countles to reduce the incentive for timely pay-

ment provided by the currently stiff interest and penalties.

3. Under the new proposal, countles would be mandated to settle in full, i.e. "buy" ALL DELINQUENT TAXES INCLUDING REAL PROPERTY, SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS AND CHARGES AND PER-SONAL PROPERTY TAXES, lowa County has settled in full for real property, special assessments and charges for many years, but if it ever becomes impossible to do so, we now have the option to change. Making it mandatory to settle in full for everything puts an additional burden on countles whether they have the means to do so or not. Settling in full for personal property would require significant county costs to develop new procedures for the collection of personal property at the county level. These costs will be borne by all county taxpayers, regardless of how much personal property taxes remain delinquent in each municipality. The likelihood is the rural taxpayers will be reguired to heavily subsidize urban personal property tax delinquencies. Further, since these taxes are notoriously difficult to collect, the county will be left "holding the bag" for these as there is no chargeback option allowed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Iowa County supports the increased clarity and modernization provided by the propos-

ed rewrite of Chapter 74,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Iowa County go on record as opposing the three installment collection dates of January 31, April 30 and July 31,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Iowa County is opposed to the change in delinquency accrual dates from January 1, to January 31,

April 30 and July 31,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Iowa County is opposed to the mandated full settlement procedures which will require the county to pay municipalities in full for uncollected personal property taxes which they levy.

AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon passage of this resolution, the County Clerk send copies to Governor Thompson, Senator Kreul, Assemblyman Tregoning, the leadership of both houses of the legislature, the Wisconsin Countles Association and Wisconsin County Board Chairpersons.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the entire membership of the County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County urges Governor Thompson to appropriate sufficient funds from the GPR to prevent the exhaustion of the vaccine supply in 1988 and to prevent this situation from ever occurring in the future. Whereas, to implement said snowmobile trail and apply for funds through the Department of Natural Resources under the provisions of Section 23.09(26) and other applicable statutes it is recommended that a Tri-County Recreation Commission consisting of the Counties of Green, Lafayette and lowa be authorized and formed and that the county board chairman of each county should appoint two members of the county board of supervisors from each county to form the commission to act on matters dealing with the proposed recreation trail development projects and grant applications, and

Whereas, said Tri-County Recreation Commission would act on the development of the recreational trail and projects and submit grant applications to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources which grant applications would include fencing and the purchase of liability insurance with grant funds, and

Whereas, it is necessary to take action to undertake, direct and complete an approved rails to trails project prior to April 1, 1988, particularly for submission of grant funds

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the Iowa County Board of Supervisors approves the recommendation for the creation of the Tri-County Recreation Commission consisting of Green, Lafayette and lowa Countles, and the lowa County Board Chairman in conjunction with the respective county board chairmen of the other countles, is authorized and instructed to appoint two lowa County Board supervisors who would along with the two appointed county board supervisors from each of the other countles form the Tri-County Recreation Commission.

RESOLUTION

A Resolution Prohibiting Smoking In County Buildings

WHEREAS, cigarette smoking has been determined to be harmful to smokers and nonsmokers who breathe second-hand smoke; and

WHEREAS, the County of Iowa deems it appropriate to protect its employees from risks associated with tobacco smoke by providing only selected areas for such activities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that smoking of cigarettes, pipes, cigars and similar materials shall be prohibited in all county-owned and rented buildings at all times, subject only to the exceptions contained herein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that smoking shall be permitted in the lowa County Courthouse only in the room now designated as the basement coffee room.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that with respect to all other County buildings owned and leased by the County, the department supervisor at such location may in their sole discretion designate one room as a smoking area. In the event of such a designation, smoking

shall be permitted only in the designated area.
