SESSIONS OF 1988

RULES FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE IOWA COUNTY BOARD

- Rule 1. The hour of meeting shall be 10:00 o'clock A.M. or 8:00 o'clock P.M., unless a different hour shall be prescribed.
- Rule 2. The Chairperson shall call the meeting to order at the hour fixed for the meeting. (1) The clerk shall call the roll of members and (2) a majority being present, the journal of the preceding meeting, if printed copies are not available, shall be read, that any errors may be corrected.
- Rule 3. The Chairperson shall preserve order and decorum, may speak on points of order in preference to other members.
- Rule 4. The Board shall elect at the April meeting in even numbered years, a chairperson and also a vice-chairperson who shall serve for a two year term. The vice-chairperson shall act in the absence, disability, death or resignation of the chairperson or on a request to act and possess powers of the chairperson.
- Rule 5. The chairperson and vice-chairperson with the Committee on Committees shall appoint standing committees.
- Rule 6. All questions shall be stated by the chair. If the chairperson doubts as to the voice of the majority the chairperson or any members of the Board may call for a vote by either roll call or rising vote on the questions to be decided.
- The following committees shall be appointed: Committee on Claims, Printing, Audit and Property; Committee on Salary and Personnel; Committee on Finance, Bonds and Insurance; Committee on Agriculture, Soil and Water Conservation Supervisors; Committee on Health & Institutions: Committee on Courts: Justice & Law Enforcement; Committee on Civil Defense; Area Manpower Planning Board Delegate; Department of Social Services Board (elected); Committee on Tax Claims and Veterans Service Officer: Data Processing Committee; Committee on Zoning and Planning, and Rural Planning Commission; Southwest Community Action Program Board: Committee on Highways (elected); 51.42 Board - Iowa County Representatives Unified Board - Grant and Iowa Counties: Advisory Members of Commission on Aging: Advisory Council - Commission on Aging; Hodan Center Board Members; Regional Planning Commission; Community Development Block Grant Committee; Hidden Valleys Committee; Committee on Resource Development; Legislative Committee; Southwest Wisconsin Library Board; County Traffic Safety Commission; Iowa County Board of Adjustment and Administrative Appeals Board; Joint County Transit Commission; Emergency Medical Services Council; Committee on Committees, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, and 3 elected members; Regional Policy Advisory Committee for S.W. Wisconsin (lowa County Representatives); Mineral Point Airport Commission, Tri-County Airport (Iowa County Representative); Nutrition Board. The size of committees shall be limited to not less than three nor more than five members.
- Rule 8. After the journal shall have been read the order of business shall be as follows: 1. Letters, Petitions, Remonstrations, Communications and Accompanying Documents. 2. Resolutions. 3. Reports of Committees, first standing and afterward special commit-

- tees. 4. Miscellaneous business. All individuals and groups requesting to appear before the County Board, first appear before a committee and be referred to the Board by said Committee.
- Rule 9. Every member present shall vote unless excused by the Chairperson.
- Rule 10. Every vote taken in regard to levying taxes, appropriating money, or dividing or altering the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be taken by Yeas and Nayes, and the same shall be entered on the journal.
- Rule 11. Roll Calls shall be taken by signed ballot. Ballot pads with names printed on pads will be furnished each supervisor.
- Rule 12. No petitions, resolutions or motions having for its object the division or alteration of the boundaries of any town, city or village shall be entered on or considered at the same session of the Board at which it was introduced, but the same shall lie over for consideration at the next regular adjourned or special session of the Board.
- Rule 13. Each member prior to speaking shall rise and address himself to and be recognized by the Chair. If two or more members arise at the same time the chairperson shall decide who shall speak first, but in all other cases the member who arises and addresses the chair first shall have the preference.
- Rule 14. No report or resolution appropriating any money shall be acted upon until the next day after presentation without permission of two-thirds of the members present.
- Rule 15. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern in all cases where they are applicable.
- Rule 16. Any of the foregoing rules, except Rules 10 and 12 may be rescinded, changed or suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- Rule 17. Rules Nos. 10 and 12 may be rescinded, altered or suspended by a two-thirds vote of all the members entitled to seats on the County Board.
- Rule 18. No informal ballot cast by this Board shall be declared a formal ballot. In no case shall any official be elected by this Board by casting a unanimous vote in favor of any candidate or nominee.
- Rule 19. The Board shall meet monthly on the third Tuesday, in addition to the statutory meetings in April and November of each year. Special meetings shall be held subject to the call of the Chair.
- Rule 20. All officers elected by the County Board except those elected at the April session, shall be nominated and all nominations lay over to the following day before they are voted on.
- Rule 21. All resolutions or petitions to be presented to a session of the County Board shall be presented five days in advance of the scheduled session and a report or copy shall be mailed to each County Supervisor. An emergency situation may grant an exception provided approval is given by two-thirds of the membership.
- Rule 22. All purchases for the courthouse, courthouse annex and jall shall be channeled through the Purchasing Committee.

Rule 23. No new business may be brought before the Board after 11:00 p.m.

DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Committee on Claims - Audit - Printing and Property
It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To audit, allow or disallow all claims filed in the office of the county clerk or referred to the committee, and shall file a schedule of such claims allowed with the county clerk for payment and shall make a report to the County Board of all claims audited.
- To meet with the State Auditors to study and examine the report on the accounts covered in their audit and make a report of the findings to the County Board.
- To accept bids on the printing of the County Board proceedings, stationery, envelopes and general printing for county officers and offices and court calendars.
- To act on all matters of printing referred to them by the County Board or any department of the county.
- To supervise and have charge of the courthouse, courthouse annex, county owned buildings (not including highway and county home), county jail and the grounds of these buildings and the Gov. Dodge home site.
 - To keep in repair and good condition these properties.
- 7. In order to maintain uniformity of equipment, this committee shall purchase the equipment for all offices in the courthouse, courthouse annex and jail with the following exception — no office equipment shall be purchased for the Highway Department, except when such purchases are made from the general fund or a mutual agreement on cost savings can be reached, through volume purchases of miscellaneous supplies.
- This committee shall function during the year and when the County Board is not in session.

Committee on Social Services

It Shall Be the Duty of this Board:

- At the first meeting of such board, elect from their numbers, a chairperson, a secretary, and such other officers as they deem necessary. Vacancies in such offices shall be filled for the unexpired terms. The chairperson shall preside at all meetings when present, and shall countersign all actions taken by the board. In case of the absence of a chairperson for any meeting the members present shall choose a temporary chairperson.
- Appoint a county director of public welfare subject to the provisions of s. 49.50 (2) to (5) and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.
- Supervise the working of the county department of social services and shall be the policy-making body determining the broad outlines and principles governing the administration of the functions, duties and powers assigned to said department under s. 46.22 (4) and (5).
- 4. Whenever it determines that there is a need therefor, appoint committees consisting of residents of the county, which committee shall advise with the board on any matter for which they are created, but members of such committees shall serve without compensation.

Consult with the county director of the social services concerning the preparation of the annual budget, the annual report of the county department of social services and the appointment of necessary personnel.

Committee on Highway

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. The County Highway Committee shall have supervision over the maintenance and construction of all roads and bridges as provided by statutes and shall submit to the County Board an annual report including the report of the County Highway Committee of all receipts and expenditures in the County Highway Department and shall submit an annual budget and recommendations for the tax levy for road and bridge purposes to the County Board at the annual session and any other duties as outlined in the statutes or as directed by County Board action.
- The Highway Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the operation of the county ambulance.

Committee on Salary and Personnel

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To conduct collective bargaining, including mediation/arbitration, with recognized collective bargaining units of County employees.
- 2. To submit the final negotiated agreement with each bargaining unit to the County Board for approval or rejection.
- 3. To hear and consider grievances, to administer the contracts, and to exercise all management functions, including hiring, laying-off and discharging, both represented and non-represented employees, except that the Committee on Highway shall exercise such authority relative to employees of the Highway Department, and the Committee on Courts, Justice and Law Enforcement shall exercise such authority relative to employees of the Sheriff's Department.
- To defend or institute legal proceedings relative to county rights under the collective bargaining contracts or 111.70 Wis. Stats.
- To review the wages, hours and conditions of employment of all employees not represented by recognized employee organizations and submit recommendations to the County Board each year for the following year.
- To be responsible for all other matters involving County employees arising under the collective bargaining contract or 111.70 Wis. Stats.

Committee on Finance - Bonds and Insurance

- To prepare and present to the County Board at the annual session the budget and tax levy; first in a temporary form, and finally in a complete form as changed during the County Board session.
- To report upon all resolutions and petitions for appropriations presented to the Board.
- To report and make recommendations on the finances of the county from time to time when required.
- To meet annually with the supervisor of assessments and county assessors at their spring meeting.
 - 5. To determine the amounts of bonds to be furnished for the

county officers to the county and to report on the sufficiency of such bonds.

- To designate and report to the county board the banks of Iowa County that may apply as a depository for county funds.
 - 7. To have charge of all county insurance.

Committee on Agriculture and Extension Education

- It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:
- 1. To perform all duties prescribed by law as further instructed by the County Board.
- To work with the UW-Extension Office to set county policy and procedure for the operation of this office.
- To work with state and federal representatives to enter into, consummate and cancel contracts.
- To represent the UW-Extension Office on salaries and appropriations, and to examine and approve all claims filed by Extension Agents.
- Extension Agents are: Agricultural, 4-H and Youth, and Home Economist.
- 6. To serve as Soil and Water Conservation District Supervisors. In this capacity, set local policy for the Soil Conservation Service office maintaining a good program of soil and water conservation.
- 7. To administer and carry out all Soil and Water Conservation responsibilities as required by Chapter 92, State Statutes.
- To work with County Forestry service to promote reforestration and better management.

Committee on Health and Institutions

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- To protect and promote the public health of citizens of lowa County as set forth by State statute, through direct employment of qualified personnel.
- To act as governing body for the Iowa County Community Health Nursing Agency, and to oversee all policies and programs of that agency.
- To meet annually at Bloomfield Manor to review the State Survey and the Annual Budget.

Committee on Tax Claims and Veterans Office

- To consider, examine and report to the County Board, its findings in all matters of illegal assessments, tax titles and delinquent lands that may come before the board for action.
- 2. To supervise all delinquent taxes returned to the county, supervise the taking of tax deeds, supervise the sale of real estate taken on tax deed to the end that the property is returned to the tax roll and aid in the collection of delinquent taxes. Where the value of the property involved warrants it, the committee shall have the power to appraise the property and in its discretion insure it for the benefit of the county.
- To make appraisals pursuant to Chapter 75.69 of the county owned tax deed lands.
- To sell and dispose to the best interest of the county those lands to which the county has taken tax deeds.

- To employ the services of the county surveyor to establish the location of county owned property when necessary.
- To authorize and recommend the county treasurer at their discretion to assign to heirs, mortgages or adjacent property owners, tax certificates purchased by the county at the annual sale of tax certificates.
- 7. To advise with and assist the service officer regarding his duties in compliance with Wisconsin Statutes.
 - 8. To meet as necessary.
- To have charge of and supervise the operation and use of the addressograph system.

Committee on Courts, Justice and Law Enforcement It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

- 1. This Committee shall be responsible for the operation of the Sheriff's Department, including:
 - Hiring and firing of personnel, subject to county personnel policies, and general supervision of all non-elected personnel.
 - b. Setting salaries in consultation with personnel committee.
 - Initiating all requisitions for purchases within the department.
 - d. Upkeep and maintenance of the jail building and equipment; and major repairs, remodeling, or additions to be referred to the County Board, through the Public Property Committee.
 - Presentation of an annual budget to the County Board, for approval. This budget will anticipate all purchases of major equipment such as cars, radio, radar, office equipment, etc.
- 2. This committee shall have the same authority over Courts and Justice including the following offices:

Judge District Attorney Clerk of Circuit Court Juvenile Officer Register in Probate Family Court Commissioner

Child Support Investigator

To consider the reports and information made available by the courts for presentation to the County Board.

Committee on Civil Defense

It Shall Be the Duty of This Committee:

 This committee, under the direction of the County Board chairperson, shall to the extent of its ability carry out the duties of the Civil Defense program as covered by Wisconsin Statutes.

Committee on Rural Planning and Zoning

- To function as governed by Wisconsin Statutes 27.015, 59.97, 236 and any other requirement of law relating to planning or zoning as affecting the county.
- To have jurisdiction (to the extent of Committee authority as a delegate of the County Board) over the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, the Shoreland-Floodplain Ordinance including Sanitary Code and the Subdivision Ordinance.

- To confer with local units of government, hold hearings, and make recommendations on matters relating to planning and zoning in the county.
- To prepare a plan and coordinate the implementation of Chapter 91 (Farmland Preservation Act) and review applications for inclusion in the program.

Committee on Resource Development

- To give assistance in an advisory capacity in so far as is possible for all resource development in Iowa County.
- To have charge of and advise with the County Board on all matters regarding airports.
- To audit the accounts of any money appropriated by the County Board for conservation work.
- To supervise the purchase of equipment and supplies used in association with the duties of this committee where the funds were appropriated by the County Board.
- To have charge of and advise the Iowa County Board of all matters relative to conservation of the natural resources of the county and to cooperate with all county, state and federal organizations in the development of the same.
- 6. To receive all petitions referred to it by the County Board, by the Highway Committee and any citizen group relating to the construction, relocation, maintenance and repairs of any federal, state or county road in the county and report their recommendations to the next session of the County Board.
- To confer with the Highway Committee on all allocations and grants of federal and state funds and on any other highway matters of major importance.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE ORGANIZATIONAL SESSION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY SUPERVISORS OF IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN

April 19, 1988

The Board of Supervisors met in Organizational Session at the Courthouse in the City of Dodgeville on Tuesday, April 19, 1988, at 7:00 p.m., and was called to order by Honorable Richard Scullion, Chairman of the Board.

Certification (No. 1) of the County Clerk stating notice of this meeting had been posted, reported to the press and radio station as re-

quired by law was read.

Sup. Ellarson moved to approve the certification. Sup. Laufenberg seconded the motion. Carried.

Certification (No. 2) of the Iowa County Clerk certifying the members of the Board of Supervisors elected at an election held on April 5, 1988, was read.

Sup. Bentzler moved to approve the certification.

Sup. Whitford seconded the motion. Carried.

Oaths of Office (No. 3) were administered by the County Clerk and Certificates of Election were provided each member.

Roll call taken. All members reported present with the exception of Sup. Draves who had been excused. They are as follows: District No. 1, Jean C. Ellarson, Robert T. Mellom; District No. 2, Marjorle Ramsden; District No. 3, Richard Scullion; District No. 4, Jerome Laufenberg; District No. 5, James C. Murn; District No. 6, Vincent Limmex; District No. 7, LaVerne Draves - Excused; District No. 8, O. Robert Eichorst; District No. 9, David Murn; District No. 10, Bernard L. Sersch; District No. 11, Jack J. Parman; District No. 12, LaVerne McCarville, Dale Theobald; District No. 13, Thomas Paull; District No. 14, Paul Finkelmeyer; District No. 15, Lambert Palzkill; District No. 16, Douglas Watters; District No. 17, James Whitford; District No. 18, Daniel Bentzler; District No. 19, Paul J. The Agenda for the April 19, 1988, Session of the Board was presented with additions.

Sup. Parman moved to approve the Agenda. Sup. Paull seconded the motion. Carried.

The Minutes of the March 16, 1988, Session of the Iowa County Board were presented.

Sup. Palzkill moved to approve the minutes as printed and mailed. Sup. Bentzler seconded the motion. Carried.

The Board proceeded to the election of Chairperson for a term of two years.

As a result of the election Richard Scullion was declared elected Chairperson for a term of two years.

The Board proceeded to the election of a Vice-Chairperson for a term of two years.

As a result of the election, Paul Finkelmeyer was declared elected Vice-Chairperson for a term of two years.

The Board proceeded to the election of three (3) members to serve

on the Committee on Committees with the Chairperson and Vice-

Chairperson for a term of two years.

As a result of the election, Sup. J. Murn, Sup. Parman, and Sup. Elchorst were declared elected to serve as members of the Committee on Committees.

The Board proceeded to the election of five (5) members to the

Highway Committee for a term of two years.

As a result of the election, Sup. Palzkill, Sup. Bentzier, Sup. J. Murn, Sup. Finkelmeyer, and Sup. Theobald were elected as members of the Highway Committee for a term of two years.

Sup. Eichorst moved to pursue with other matters on the agenda and to elect the three members of the Social Services Board later on in the evening.

Sup. D. Murn seconded the motion. Carried.

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Proclamation (No. 4) proclaiming May as Older American Month in the County of Iowa was read.

WHEREAS, the door is opening for 30 million Americans who suffer from mental illnesses because of improved insurance benefits and living arrangements within the community,

WHEREAS, now there is treatment for people who suffer from anxiety disorders, depression and other mental illnesses, thanks to

biomedical research,

WHEREAS, now there is hope for people who suffer from severe mental illnesses such as schizophrenia and depression,

WHEREAS, being mentally healthy is as important as being

physically fit,

WHEREAS, the Mental Health Association in Iowa County is helping patients, their families and the public learn the facts about mental health and mental illnesses, and

WHEREAS, every year since 1953, May has been designated Men-

tal Health Month in America;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that all citizens in lowa County hear this call for action to join the volunteers, staff and supporters of the Mental Health Association in "Working for America's Mental Health" during May and throughout the year.

Resolution (No. 6) of the Ag. Committee recommending that the Soil Conservation Department receive limited term help to get the farm programs in place before December 31, 1988, was read.

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, agriculture is the number one industry in Iowa Coun-

ty,

WHEREAS, most Iowa County farmers are either participating in the Wisconsin Farmland Preservation Program or the USDA Federal Programs or both,

WHEREAS, both programs require participants to comply with

Conservation Plan requirements.

WHEREAS, these two programs contributed over 18 million dollars into the Iowa County economy in 1987.

WHEREAS, the Soil Conservation Service has granted lowa Coun-

ty an additional \$28,900 to provide added technical assistance.

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin has granted lowa County an additional \$35,000 to assist in implementing the programs.

WHEREAS, the added workload requirements for conservation does not allow the Iowa County Land Conservation Department and Soll Conservation Staff sufficient time to meet program requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, to help meet planning needs, the Iowa County Land Conservation Department requests limited term dollars in the amount of \$5,000 from the Iowa County General Fund to help ensure Iowa County landowners stay eligible for both State and Federal program benefits.

munization program.

(D) Response from Senator Richard Kreul for receipt of the resolution involving the status of state funding for vaccinations.

(E) A letter from Rep. Tregoning regarding the immunization

program.

(F) Richard Kreul thanked the Board for supporting Section 73.08 of the Wisconsin Statutes relating to "review of assessment practices."

Sup. Whitford seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. Luciani moved to adopt Roberts Rules of Order and rules for the Government of Iowa County to govern this Board.

RESOLUTION NO. 7

TO THE IOWA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

We, the Committee on Salary and Personnel, do hereby recommend that the responsibilities of the Iowa County Child Support Investigator be transferred to Carolyn Olson on a trial basis until January 1, 1989. This period may be shortened by the Law Enforcement Committee.

We further recommend that compensation to Ms. Olson be on a contract basis of \$1,000.00 per month with no fringe benefits. All inter-

views with clients are to be administrated by Carolyn Olson.

Carolyn Olson, Clerk of Court, responded that she was trying to save the county some money and that she had contacted another county in which the Clerk of Court office administered the Child Support Of-

fice and it was working out fine in that county.

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE REGISTER OF DEEDS TO DESTROY OBSOLETE CHATTEL DOCUMENTS

WHEREAS, the Register of Deeds Office maintains files and indexes of all documents pertaining to security interests in personal property, crops or fixtures, as required by law, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sec. 409.403(2) and (3), Wis. Stats., financing statements or continuations so filed are effective for a period of five (5) years from the date of filing, after which time the effec-

tiveness of such filling lapses, and

Section 349.11(10) of the Wisconsin Statutes empowers local authorities and County Highway (Transportation) Committees to post temporary speed limits on local and State/Federal highways below the limits imposed by SS. 349.11 or 346.57, while the highways are being constructed, repaired or maintained.

It is the opinion of the Iowa County Highway Commission that Imposing such temporary speed limits on work sites on County and State/Federal highways in Iowa County will promote the safety of highway construction and maintenance workers, and the general

public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that any such temporary speed limits will be imposed by the posting of temporary regulatory speed limit signs of the same face size and design as permanent regulatory speed limit signs, Type R2-1, as described in the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" as adopted by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Division of Highways, on 4/12/84, and that the signs will be posted on any highway under the jurisdiction of the Transportation Committee, but only in the immediate area of the work being performed.

In accord with the direction given to this committee in 1981, we have reviewed the matter of jail facilities as existing and the projected needs for lowa County. While formed as a study committee, we were later designated a building committee. During the time of our involvement, we have reported to you on a regular basis, seen the facility closed for a time by a State order and at your last session presented a proposed addition plan with a consultants use and projected needs

report.

The alternatives have been considered and it does not seem to be feasible to either do nothing or do expensive remodeling without an addition if State mandated segregation requirements still could not be met. Based on all of the information obtained and data considered, it is our opinion that the long term interests of Iowa County will be best served by an addition to the present facility in accord with the plan and report now before you. In submitting this recommendation it is not without reservation due to the projected construction and operational costs and our concern for the economic conditions in this county, including the present severe drought. We believe that if the recommendation to advance is approved the proposal should be closely monitored throughout the balance of this year. It is, however, our majority opinion that the dictates of our current society have led to this point and since our task was a specific assignment, we feel that we have exercised, as have other individuals no longer serving on this committee, our best judgement in the consideration of Iowa County and to the taxpayers who must pay the bill.

the status of this project.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the following action be

1) Iowa County will transfer ownership of the ambulance vehicles currently titled to Iowa County, but purchased with funds raised in the Dodgeville Service Area to the City of Dodgeville, and by this action, transfers all like equipment, supplies, and operational responsibility to the "Dodgeville Area Ambulance Service" effective on a date to be mutually agreed by the City Council and this Committee.

2) Fund balances as of January 1, 1988, in the county records indicate that Arena, Avoca and Mineral Point owe money as borrowed from the ambulance account. These loans remain payable to Iowa County and shall be credited from the service area tax raised until paid in the amount of: Arena Service -\$12,865.14; Avoca Service - \$3,998.41; Mineral Point Service -\$28,726,92. The outstanding loans shall be allocated as paid to the county to an account established as a loan account for future vehicle purchases by the services of Arena, Avoca, Barneveld, Dodgeville, Highland or Mineral Point. Any of these services seeking to borrow from the county account shall first submit a statement of approval from the governing bodies of the City or Village in which the vehicle is located and the surrounding Township. As of January 1, 1988, service area accounts with

fund balances are Barneveld - \$212.09; Highland - \$7,343.99; and Dodgeville - \$154,045.07, and these balances are to be divided as follows: 75% shall be transferred to the borrowing account and 25% shall be paid to the individual ambulance service. In addition, \$13,208.67 shall be transferred from the EMS/Fire Frequency Account to the borrowing account. This will create a borrowing account of \$180,000.00 when fully funded to allow a not to exceed \$30,000.00 max/mum for each named service.

- 3) 1988 funds collected by Iowa County at the rate of 10° per equalized thousand shall be paid to the ambulance services that do not have a county debt in accord with the service area collections previously established. It is now intended that the 10° per equalized thousand collection by the County will continue with future tax levies and therefore that in 1989 and thereafter annually after September 1st, the collections allocated for the year will be returned to the town, village or city from which collected and in turn the municipalities may use the same for the purchase of ambulance service as agreed by the municipalities and providers, possibly on the same basis as the service districts are currently established. Municipalities who are served by providers who borrow from the account as outlined above shall receive a credit notice toward the outstanding debt in lieu of payment during the time a balance remains due from the individual service(s).
- 4) Any funds still to be collected by the lowa County/Dodgeville area ambulance for service prior to this change in operational status shall be turned over to the Dodgeville Service.

RESOLUTION NO. 2

SUPPORT FOR CHANGES IN THE ELIGIBILITY RULES OF THE CONSERVATION RESERVE PROGRAM OF THE FOOD SECURITY ACT OF 1985

WHEREAS, the eligibility rules for the Conservation Reserve Program presently require the land to be eroding above tolerable soil loss (T), except for class VI-VIII land, for the period 1981-1985; and

WHEREAS, the "T" requirement prohibits a considerable amount of Highly Erodible Land from being eligible for the CRP; for example:

1. A long rotation of hay from 1981-1985 reduces the "C" factor of the Universal Soil Loss Equation, thereby showing a soil loss below "T" for that 5 year period, resulting in CRP ineligibility. 2. Contoured fields reduce the "P" factor of the Universal Soil

Loss Equation by approximately one-half (depending upon

siope) thereby also reducing "A" by the same amount of onehalf. This situation also results in ineligibility for CRP.

and

WHEREAS, the above situations are:

1. Keeping many Highly Erodible Land acres, which are either

steep lands and/or shallow solls out of CRP.

Discriminating against those landowners who are "Soll Stewards," by using against them the very soll conservation practices they incorporated on their farms on a volunteer basis.

and

WHEREAS, the "T" requirement is creating hard feelings between the "Soil Stewards" and the "Soil Abusers."

AGREEMENT

Agreement (No. 3) of the Health Committee for the transfer of the Home Health Care Program to Memorial Hospital of Iowa County was read.

AN AGREEMENT between Iowa County, a Wisconsin municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as the County, and the Memorial Hospital of Iowa County, Inc., hereinafter referred to as MHIC.

Purpose: The County currently maintains a public health service facility known as the lowa County Health Nursing Agency.

Among its services is a home health care nursing service designed to provide the public with in-home nursing care.

MHIC operates the Iowa County Memorial Hospital and has elected to offer as a part of its services an In-home health care service

similar to that now being offered through the County.

The County has elected to terminate its home health care service and in a cooperate effort agrees to relinquish ownership, management and operation of the home health care service to MHIC.

II. Agreement:

In consideration of the mutual promises and covenants expressed herein, the parties agree as follows:

A. MHIC Responsibilities.

1. To commence operation of a home health care agency on January 1, 1989, or at such other time as MHIC shall be licensed and able to commence operations. In order to assure a continuity of available services, MHIC agrees to continue to provide the County with nursing staff as per the agreement between the parties dated September 28, 1988, and to continue to make such provision until MHIC commences its home health service.

2. To operate a home health care agency in a fashion similar to that which the County has in the past been offering. MHIC agrees to follow the same criterion for the provision of services as did the County and to continue such service for a period of not less than two years from the date of commencement of said

service.

3. To accept clientele without regard to race, color, national

origin, handicap, age or financial condition.

 To transfer to the County upon receipt any payments received for services provided by the County home health agency before its date of termination.

To submit claim resubmissions completed by the County to the proper fiscal intermediary for up to six months following termination of the County's service as shall be requested by the County.

 To offer a position of employment in the community service department of MHIC to all County home health agency personnel to commence with the opening of the MHIC home health program.

To pledge its best effort to provide such quality professional home health nursing services as shall meet the needs of the

general public.

B. County Responsibilities.

 To make available to MHIC all relevant County policy and procedural manuals, contracts, forms and other information necessary to assist MHIC in the conduct of its program.

2. To make County personnel available to MHIC to facilitate the smooth transfer of responsibility for services to MHIC and to assist in the billing process and patient management process of the program as may be requested by MHIC. The County reserves the right to charge MHIC for County personnel services rendered and MHIC agrees to make payment for said services when presented with itemized statements setting forth

time and services provided to MHIC.

3. To contact current clients for the purpose of advising them of the discontinuance of the County home health service; to advise of various alternatives available to the County service including the home health service to MHIC; to provide forms for the release and transfer of all pertinent patient information to alternative home health services and to make transfer of all released client health information as directed by the clientele. 4. To provide to MHIC a lump sum monetary contribution of Twenty-Five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars to assist MHIC In the formation and operation of its home health care service. Such payment shall be made at such time as shall be requested by MHIC upon commencement of its home health program. 5. To transfer to MHIC any supplies or equipment pertinent to the operation of a home health care agency which supplies or equipment are deemed by the County In Its sole discretion to be obsolete in operation of the County Nursing Agency. The County reserves the right to bill MHIC for any supplies or equipment so provided as well as for procedural manuals or other information furnished to MHIC under paragraph B.1. above for which the County has expended funds. The parties shall agree

6. To notify the Bureau of Quality Compliance within ten days of the date of discontinuance of the County service. The County shall also notify all regulatory and fiscal intermediaries as is

on the cash value of such items transferred prior to their

required by law.

Both parties further agree to comply with all state and federal regulations applicable to the commencement, operation or termination of a home health care agency and to accept full financial and legal responsibility for the operation of the parties' individual programs and to hold the other party harmless from any and all claims and liability incurred in the operation of the parties' individual programs.

7. To continue to operate the County's home health care service until commencement of the MHIC home health service.

The insurance policy for Rails and Trails was presented by Sup. Palzkill. Mr. Palzkill explained that the policy given to him to review was an accessible policy of the Wisconsin County Mutual Insurance with a deductible of \$10,000.00 per occurance. Also, Iowa County is not

named on the policy.

Sup. Eichorst moved that the Rails and Trails Committee deny this insurance policy and take whatever steps necessary in finding a better policy.

Resolution (No. 4) of the Land Conservation Committee authorizing Iowa County to participate in the Wisconsin Wildlife Damage Program was presented.

Resolution authorizing Iowa County to participate in the Wiscon-

sin Wildlife Damage Program.

WHEREAS, Section 29.598 of the Wisconsin State Statutes creates a wildlife damage abatement program, and a wildlife damage claim program, administered on the state level by the Department of Natural Resources under administrative rule NR 19.

WHEREAS, participating counties administer the program on the

local level, under the terms of an agreement with DNR.

WHEREAS, the administrative costs are reimbursed to participating counties.

WHEREAS, program funding is through a surcharge on hunting

licenses.

WHEREAS, only landowners in participating counties may receive abatement assistance and damage claims.

WHEREAS, Iowa County has a wildlife damage problem.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Iowa County enter into agreement with DNR to administer the program in Iowa County.

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the lowa County Land Conservation Committee shall administer the program in lowa County.

RESOLUTION NO. 2 PURCHASE OF HIGHWAY EQUIPMENT - IOWA COUNTY

WHEREAS, for the construction and maintenance of highways, including the removal and control of snow and ice, it becomes necessary from time to time to purchase equipment, the nature of and necessity for which cannot be accurately anticipated.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Highway

Committee is hereby authorized, pursuant to Section 83.015(2) of the Statutes, to purchase without further authority, and to the extent that revolving funds accumulated for such purpose or appropriations made for such purpose are available, such highway equipment as they deem necessary to properly carry on the work, and to trade or sell such old equipment as may be considered to be for the best interests of the county:

PROVIDED, that no one complete unit of equipment of a value exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be purchas-

ed without further authority of the County Board.

Resolution (No. 3) of the Highway Committee for the County Aid Construction and Maintenance for 1989 was presented.

RESOLUTION NO. 3 COUNTY AID CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE **DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1989**

The County Board of Supervisors of Iowa County, Wisconsin, regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the county for highway work in the year 1989 under the provisions of Section 20.395 and Chapter 83 of the Statutes, and the additional sums herein appropriated, shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

SECTION II. COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENT. WHEREAS, the Division of Highways has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be seven hundred twenty-two thousand, one hundred thirty-three and 88/100 Dollars (\$722,133.88) will become available at the end of the fiscal year under the provisions of Sections 83.10 and 20.395(1)(ga) & (gb) of the Statutes, for the county trunk highway system in the county, but the actual amount will not be

known until the close of the fiscal year ending next June 30.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the sald sum to the extent required to match and supplement Federal aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any Federal projects located on the county trunk highway system of said county, which are not recovered from Federal funds, and to expend any balance for constructing, repairing and maintaining such county trunk highway system and the bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 83.10(1) of the Statutes, and to reimburse the general fund for any expenditures that may be made therefrom pursuant to Section 83.01(6) of the Statutes. The distribution to such purposes is estimated, but not specifically directed.

SECTION IV. WHEREAS, It appears that certain additional highway improvements in the county are necessary and warranted.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Board does hereby appropriate the following sums for the purpose hereinafter set forth:

- For the maintenance of the County Trunk Highway System the

sum of:

General Maintenance - Four Hundred Seventy-Four Thousand, Three Hundred Fifty-Six and 60/100 Dollars (\$474,356.60).

Winter Maintenance - Three Hundred Ten Thousand and 00/100

Dollars (\$310,000.00).

 For the purchase of machinery and for machinery repairs the sum of One Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand, Two Hundred Four and 00/100 Dollars (\$165,204.00).

- For administration, including salaries, per diem, office and travel expense of the County Highway Committee, the County

Highway Commissioner, his clerks and assistants not paid from construction or maintenance funds, the sum of One Hundred Twenty. Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$120,000.00).

SECTION V. WHEREAS, appropriations are made herein, in addition to the amounts to be received from the state and available for

work in the county under Section 20.395 of the Statutes,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Board does hereby levy a tax on all of the property in the county to meet such appropriations as follows:

 For County Ald under Section 83.14, as provided by Section III hereof, the sum of Eighty-Four Thousand, Three Hundred Nineteen

and 08/100 Dollars (\$84,319.08).

WARNING: It is directed that provision for this levy shall be made in the county budget, but that this levy shall not be duplicated.

The County Clerk is directed to levy the special benefit assessments made herein as special charges against the respective municipalities as provided by law.

SECTION VII. WHEREAS, the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of

making the appropriation therefor.

BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the county budget, for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year.

SECTION VIII. WHEREAS, the exact amount of the funds that will become available from the State for highway purposes in the county under Section 20.395 of the Statutes will not be known until on or

after next June 30.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as hereinbefore authorized, from any funds in the County treasury that are not required for the purposes for which appropriated prior to next August 1, and to reimburse such funds in the County treasury from the sums received under Section 20.395 of the Statutes.

SECTION IX. WHEREAS, the County Highway Committee and the County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenance of highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory

and administrative duties.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Highway Committee shall have authority to employ, discharge, suspend or reinstate such personnel necessary for such purposes. The County Highway Committee may, by action recorded in its minutes, determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend or reinstate any such person. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen, laborers, foremen, clerks, stenographers, or other employees necessary to carry on such activities.

The foregoing resolution was adopted on November 15, 1988.

Wisconsin Statutes, upon the filling of a request therefor by the County Highway Committee of this county, which said Committee is hereby authorized to file, such sums as may be required and are not otherwise available for any such previously authorized or additionally needed construction improvements in this county, with the understanding that the amounts thus advanced will be deducted from future state allotments for state trunk highway construction in this county under Section 84.03(3) of the Statutes, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the State Highway Commission be and is hereby petitioned, upon the filling of a request therefor by the County Highway Committee of this county, which said Committee is hereby authorized to file, to transfer to or between any such previously authorized or additionally needed construction improvements in this county, any funds allotted by the State under the provisions of Section 84.03(3), Wisconsin Statutes, and previously allocated to any other improvement or remaining unallocated in

reserve.

Ordinance (No. 9) to authorize the use of a citation to be used for violations of ordinances including ordinances for which a statutory counterpart exists was presented.

ORDINANCE NO. 600,10

WHEREAS, Section 66.119(1)(a) of the Wisconsin Statutes, authorizes counties to adopt and authorize the use of a citation to be used by law enforcement personnel for violations of ordinances including ordinances for which a statutory counterpart exists; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa County District Attorney recommends that the County Board enact an ordinance authorizing use of citations;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the provisions of Section 66.119(1)(a) of the Wisconsin Statutes, the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Iowa does ordain as follows:

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE USE OF A CITATION TO BE USED FOR VIOLATIONS OF ORDINANCES INCLUDING ORDINANCES FOR WHICH A STATUTORY COUNTERPART EXISTS

OPERATIONS AGREEMENT

AN AGREEMENT, this 5th day of December, 1988, between Iowa County, a municipal corporation, hereinafter called the County, and Iowa County Land Conservation Commission, hereinafter called LCC, and the Village of Barneveld, hereinafter called the Village.

BACKGROUND:

The State of Wisconsin, through the State Conservation Commission, acquired ownership in fee simple of certain lands located in the Twin Parks Watershed in Iowa County, which lands were used for the construction of a multiple use dam and development of a public recreational area.

On June 28, 1963, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin granted to the County an easement and right in perpetuity to construct, operate and maintain a multiple use dam to flow the land and to develop, operate and maintain a public recreational area on any and all portions of the lands described in said easement.

The Village of Barneveld has been operating and maintaining the Birch Lake Recreational Area on behalf of itself and of lowa County since the construction of the dam which created the Birch Lake Recreation Area under the terms of the County's lease with the State of Wisconsin.

The County and the Village now wish to continue to operate the Birch Lake Recreational Area and to do so under terms and conditions which honor the County's obligation to the State of Wisconsin under the easement of June 28, 1963.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this Agreement is to define the legal relationship between the parties hereto as it relates to operational control and authority of the Birch Lake Recreational Area. Of paramount importance is the continuing operation of the facility.

AGREEMENT:

The parties hereto agree as follows:

Except as is otherwise herein provided, all powers concerning
the operation, improvement, management and control of the Birch
Lake Recreational Area shall vest in lowa County. The County may
direct any or all of such powers to be exercised by its agents,
employees, committees or duly appointed commissions including LCC
as the County Board of Supervisors in their sole discretion determine

appropriate.

2. Unless otherwise amended or directed by resolution of the lowa County Board of Supervisors, day to day operation and management of the facility shall now be undertaken by the Village. Said day to day control shall be designed insure the uninterrupted use and continuation of the facility as a park and recreational facility for the general public. The Village shall assume without limitation among its operating powers the right and duty to maintain buildings, roads and equipment of the park. It shall supervise the public's use of the park and maintain order and cleanliness in the park. It shall insure that landscapes and vegetation remain natural and unaftered by prohibiting cropping or grazing on park lands.

3. The Village agrees to Indemnify and hold harmless the County, the LCC and the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources for any and all claims and related costs incurred by virtue of any claim made resulting from the use, operation, occupancy, management or maintenance of the Birch Lake Recreational facility. The Village further agrees to maintain a policy or policies of general public liability insurance indemnifying the Village, the County, the LCC and the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources from any and all liability with respect to ownership and operation of

the park. Sald coverage shall include:

A. Contractual liability coverage.

B. Additional insureds naming lowa County, the lowa County LCC

and the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

C. Liability coverage for bodily injury liability and property damage liability in the amount of at least One Million Dollars combined single limits.

 The County, through its departments, committees and commissions including LCC, shall be solely responsible for the maintenance of

the dam holding Birch Lake.

5. The Village may, in its discretion or as otherwise directed by the County, charge user fees to the general public. All fees and revenues collected by the Village shall be maintained in a special account in the Village's name designated for the purpose of holding all such generated revenue. Revenues so generated may be expended by the Village as necessary and appropriate for maintaining the facility, but in no case may monies be expended in excess of funds available in said account. The County may in its discretion contribute to said account to provide revenues for operation or improvement of the facility. The Village shall be responsible and shall pay first from available revenues repayment of aids in lieu of taxes paid by the State on properties included in the Birch Lake Recreational Area.

6. Each year at such time as is designated by the County or the LCC, the Village shall prepare and file a report with the LCC and the County indicating the status of operations at the facility. Said report shall include all information concerning the collection and disbursement of revenues including total receipts, the amount of money expended, the nature and purpose of the expenditures and the person business, corporation or group to whom the monies were paid. Said report shall also indicate the current status of the revenue account and

amounts of accrued and unpaid expenses.

The Village shall in no event undertake construction, remodeling or capital improvement of the facility or pay any expense in excess

of \$2,000.00 without first obtaining approval of the County Board of Supervisors.

This agreement, for mutual considerations set forth above, is sign-

ed and sealed this 5th day of December, 1988.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE JANUARY SESSION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY SUPERVISORS OF IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN

January 17, 1989

The Board of Supervisors met in January Session at the Courthouse in the City of Dodgeville on Tuesday, January 17, 1989, at 7:30 p.m., and was called to order by Honorable Richard Scullion, Chairman of the Board.

Roll call taken. All members reported present.

Certification (No. 1) of the County Clerk stating notice of this meeting had been posted, reported to the press and radio station as required by law was read.

Sup. Laufenberg moved to approve the certification.

Sup. Whitford seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. Whitford led the Board in the Pledge of Alleglance to the Flag.

The minutes of the December 20, 1988, meeting of the Board were presented.

Sup. Bentzler moved to approve the minutes as printed and mail-

Sup. Luciani seconded the motion. Carried.

The agenda for the January 17, 1989, meeting was presented with additions.

Sup. Whitford moved to approve the agenda with additions.

Sup. Palzkill seconded the motion. Carried.

The following letters and reports were presented:

(A) A letter from Robert Kastenmeler Informing the Board that Ofto Festge retired at the end of 1988 and that Diane Oestreicher will be working with Paul Rusk in providing the service to the constituents on the 4th Wednesday of each month;

(B) A letter from James Wroblewski, System Director of the SW Library System, asking to meet with the County Board to discuss the upcoming changes for the Southwest Wisconsin Library System;

 (C) A list of additional revenues received by the Department of Social Services during 1988;

Sup. Ellarson moved to approve the letters. Sup. Elchorst seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. Draves was asked to contact Larry Wroblewski to see if he could attend the February 21, 1989, Session of the Board.

Attorney William Dyke appeared before the Board to discuss the Rails and Trails project. He represents the landowners, and said that they will allow the snowmobilers to cross their land, but would like to have some guidelines written before snowmobilers will be permitted.

Frank Berryman, Iowa County Corporation Counsel, appeared before the Board to express his opinion of the contract creating a Commission to operate the Trail. Some of the problems that Mr. Berryman stated were as follows: That the only power that the County retained was the budgetary control, a potential liability problem, and the Commission could call upon the county employees and county attorney to perform services for them. Mr. Berryman recommended that the contract not be approved.

Sup. Draves moved to postpone any action until the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC) makes a decision.

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Sup. McCarville Seconded the motion. Carried.

Mr. Greg Huza gave a jall building report and stated that the plans should be completed by February 1, 1989. Mr. Huza explained that some changes were made to the original plans; for example, an elevator, and a restroom in the basement. The approximate cost for the jall will be 1.3 million dollars. The Law Enforcement Committee objected to the celling recommended by Mr. Huza.

The condition of the well at Bloomfield Manor was explained by Barbara Linscheid, Administrator. She stated that they renovated the existing well and a new pump was installed.

The Board of Supervisors met in February Session at the Courthouse in the City of Dodgeville on Tuesday, February 21, 1989, at 7:30 p.m., and was called to order by Honorable Richard Scullion, Chairman of the Board.

Roll call taken. All members reported present with the exception of Sup. Watters and Sup. Bentzler who had been excused.

Certification (No. 1) of the County Clerk stating notice of this meeting had been posted, reported to the press and radio station as required by law was read.

Sup. Luciani moved to approve the certification. Sup. McCarville seconded the motion. Carried.

Sup. Parman led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The minutes of the January 17, 1989, Session of the Board were presented.

Sup. Palzkill moved to approve the minutes as printed and mailed.

Sup. Mellom seconded the motion. Carried.

The following letters and reports were presented:

(A) 1988 SW Wisconsin Fair Annual Report;

(B) Financial Statements of the Iowa County Airport Commission as of December 31, 1988;

(C) Register of Probate 1988 Annual Report; (D) Ehlers and Associates, Inc., Newsletter;

(E) A letter from Peter Pfotenhauer, secretary of the Iowa County Long-Term Support Planning Committee, notifying the Board that there is a vacant position on the Committee. The Committee submitted for consideration the name of Anita Iverson for appointment to this committee position.

Sup. Laufenberg moved to approve the appointment of Anita Iver-

son to the position.

Sup. Ramsden seconded the motion. Carried.

Discussion was held on the liability insurance. Present were Robert Costello, of Corporate Risk Managers, Inc., and Tom Schaefer, of Richgels and Schaefer Agency, Inc., to address the Issue.

Mr. Costello reported that he felt that the coverage is reasonably good, but he feels that the premiums that Iowa County is paying are exceedingly high because of the underwriting methods used by the main carrier. Mr. Costello handed out a premium cost comparison showing nine other counties and premium costs per capita in each of those counties in comparison to Iowa County. He stated that he recommends that Iowa County go through the bidding process which may help reduce premiums drastically.

Tom Schaefer gave a history of the underwriting cycle from 1967-86. He stated that the market is beginning to soften again which should reduce premiums. Mr. Schaefer reported that it is not a true picture to compare premiums with other counties because most counties have different exposures. Mr. Schaefer stated that he had talked to some companies and they have assured him that premiums are going to be renewed down; maybe not on every policy, but overall they

will be down. He said, "I can assure that the reduction in premium will

be fairly decent."

At the end of the discussion, Mr. Costello stated, "If nothing else comes out of this meeting, there are 37 witnesses to the statement made that you might have a significant premium change this year if nothing else happens."

Sup. Ellarson moved to allow the Finance Committee to make a recommendation of which way to go pending on an itemized report

from Mr. Costello.

Sup. Limmex seconded the motion. Motion rescinded by Sup. Ellarson.

Sup. McCarville moved to call a special County Board meeting to discuss insurance and that an itemized report be received from Mr. Costello by this meeting date.

SNOW AND ICE CONTROL POLICY

The purpose of this policy is to define and outline snow and ice control objectives and procedures as established by the lowa County Highway Department.

IN GENERAL

The Intent of establishing the Iowa County Highway Departments' Snow and Ice Control Policy is to provide a uniform understanding of the priorities and procedures used to combat snow and Ice related road conditions. Each winter storm has unique characteristics. Climatological factors, such as intensity and duration, wind, temperature and moisture content, affect the total amount of snow/Ice accumulation and influence the methodology used to combat the resulting snow and/or ice related road conditions.

The lowa County Highway Department endeavors to maintain adequate traction for vehicles properly equipped for winter driving conditions. This does not mean bare, dry pavement should be expected after each snowfall. Furthermore, this does not mean the roads will be free of ice and snow.

Abrasives should be applied to hills, school accesses, difficult intersections, and school access routes, upon determination by the lowa County Highway Commissioner that snow and/or ice exists throughout the County. Plowing of these roads should not commence until the accumulation of snow on the roadway exceeds two inches.

LEVEL OF SERVICE

(Roads carrying less than 1,000 vehicles daily) Receive no service between 8:00 p.m. and 4:00 a.m. on weekdays and none on Sunday, except to keep them passable in all types of storms. Bare pavement near the center of the pavement sufficiently wide for traction in all types of storms, with full width bare surface on hills, curves and intersections.

EMERGENCY SITUATIONS

Provisions must be made for situations involving emergencies; therefore, in the event the County Highway Department receives notification of an emergency situation, equipment necessary to handle the emergency will be dispatched immediately to assist until the emergency has been resolved. In order to eliminate false emergency calls to the County Highway Department, it is preferable that emregency calls be routed through the lowa County Sheriff's Department. Since emergency calls will not always come through the lowa County Sheriff's Department, those individuals in the County Highway Department receiving emergency calls will inform the caller that the Sheriff will be notified of the emergency situation so as to be able to assist in handling the situation and to preclude false calls.

The Department's winter maintenance training programs will continue to emphasize the importance of tailoring field operations to these service level objectives. This information will be shared with the media and with law enforcement agencies to develop a broader understanding of winter maintenance objectives for county highways.
