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What's new this week?

Epidemiology: Our percentage of positive cases continues to increase, now at 11.37%, changing this metric to red. The average cases reported daily metric increased to 16.86, remaining in the red. The Outbreak metric remains red, with fifteen active outbreaks in lowa County.

Healthcare Status: Testing rate remains green with an average of 148.3 tests performed daily. We encourage anyone with symptoms to contact his/her health care provider to be tested. Local health care partner's facility use status (represents med surge and ICU capacity) has changed to green. Staffing status indicates the number of available staff to care for the volume of patients and is currently red. Critical supply status reflects at least three days worth of supplies. This metric remains green. Our regional health care infrastructure metric represents regional hospital bed use and is currently yellow, as 84.1% of regional hospital beds are in use. In addition, 85% of total regional ICU beds are in use.

Public Health Status: Community spread did not change and remains in red, as 42% of cases are reporting no known source of transmission in the past two weeks. Our goal is that fewer than 20% of cases have no known source of transmission. This value is a reflection of current information, some data is missing, as not all cases have been in contact with the health department. Our contact tracing efforts dropped some, now at 93%. This metric is dependent on individuals either answering the phone or returning our calls, which is becoming an issue. We've added an additional metric indicating the ability and availability of the health department to manage daily operations. With the continued increase in cases, we have had to modify our outreach to close contacts so this metric is now red.

Emergency Management: Our emergency management partners remain in green status; however, PPE demand has picked up and the supply chain is experiencing issues with gloves, gowns and N95 masks.
