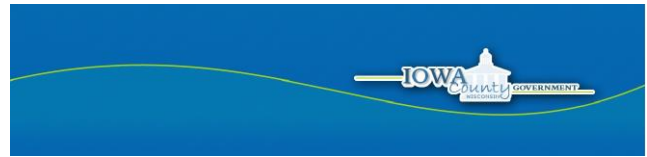

Case Count at 1711; COVID-19 Vaccine Clinics Underway; Dashboard Update

Iowa County – The Health Department reports an increase of 46 cases this past week bringing the total of cases to 1,711. During the previous week, 52 cases were reported, the week prior the increase was 71 cases and the week prior to that, 111 cases. The number of individuals that have recovered is 1,658, meaning 53 cases are active. Cases are in all age ranges and across the entire county. This week's dashboard update saw the percentage of positive cases remain steady at 8.5%, similar to 8.6% at last Dashboard report, allowing our status to remain yellow. The average cases reported daily metric has decreased to 7.5, from last week's average of 11.14, remaining at red status.

"It is good news that the numbers are decreasing and we hope that the coming weeks continue with this trend, however, we continue to monitor any potential post-holiday surge. In addition, we can't let our guard down when it comes to continued diligence in following public health recommendations. The arrival of vaccine is truly exciting news, but until we achieve notable levels of vaccine uptake, every act of prevention still matters", states Debbie Siegenthaler, Director, Iowa County Health Department.

We are asking the Iowa County community to continue to:

- Limit indoor gatherings to 10 people or less.
- Limit outdoor gatherings to 25 people or less.
- Post-poner or cancel all non-essential events, gatherings and travel
- Wear a cloth face covering in public settings, especially when difficult to practice physical distancing.
- Stay at least 6 feet away from other people when you leave your home.
- Wash your hands regularly for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

COVID-19 Vaccine Planning and Administration

Iowa County Health Department, Iowa County Emergency Management, Upland Hills Health, Long Term Care facilities and Public Safety agencies continue with Covid-19 vaccination planning. Agencies are working in a collaborative manner to administer vaccine to those in Phase 1. Upland Hills Health, the Iowa County Health Department and Skilled Nursing Facilities in Iowa County have received and administered vaccine this week to eligible recipients in the Phase 1A group.

In an effort to reach others in the Phase 1A priority group, the Iowa County Health Department and Upland Hills Health are putting out a call to independent healthcare workers who need a COVID-19 vaccine. "We are looking

for healthcare workers who are independent and have no other way to obtain vaccine through an employer,” said Debbie Siegenthaler, Director, Iowa County Health Department.

Following tiers defined by a state advisory group, individuals who provide direct patient service or engage in healthcare services that place them into contact with patients who may have COVID-19 are defined as [Tier 1a](#), and are currently eligible for vaccine. Independent healthcare workers are those not employed by a facility who can vaccinate them.

Independent healthcare workers are asked to email the Iowa County Health Department at healthinfo@iowacounty.org. The Health Department will then follow up to verify your license or credential and gather your contact information.

If a healthcare worker is employed as part of a healthcare system, clinic, pharmacy, or dental office, we ask that they speak with their employer about the plan to receive vaccine.

Vaccine is not yet available to the general public. Iowa County Health Department asks for residents’ patience as we first vaccinate healthcare workers and long-term care facility staff and residents. We will share information widely when we are authorized to start vaccinating other populations. Please keep up to date with the vaccine roll-out through press releases, the Iowa County COVID-19 website and/or the ICHD Facebook page.

Iowa County Dashboard Metrics

Epidemiology: Our percentage of positive cases decreased slightly, now at 8.5%, remaining yellow. The average cases reported daily metric decreased to 7.5, remaining in the red. The Outbreak metric remains red.

Healthcare Status: Testing rate remains green with an average of 88.5 tests performed daily. We encourage anyone with symptoms to contact his/her health care provider to be tested. Local health care partner’s facility use status (represents med surge and ICU capacity) has changed to red. Staffing status indicates the number of available staff to care for the volume of patients and remains yellow. Critical supply status reflects at least fourteen days’ worth of supplies. This metric remains green. Our regional health care infrastructure metric represents regional hospital bed use and has changed to green. Currently there are 77.2% of regional hospital beds in use, down from last week. In addition, 75.6% of total regional ICU beds are in use, the same as last week.

Public Health Status: Community spread increased to 53%, so more than half of cases are reporting no known source of transmission in the past two weeks. Our goal is that fewer than 20% of cases have no known source of transmission. This value is a reflection of current information, some data is missing, as not all cases have been in contact with the health department. Our contact tracing efforts are at 90%.

This metric is dependent on individuals either answering the phone or returning our calls, which remains an issue. Our health department volume and staffing metric remains yellow.

Emergency Management: Our emergency management partners remains green. PPE demand continues to be up and the supply chain is experiencing issues with gloves, gowns and N95 masks.

This dashboard contains metrics from our Iowa County COVID-19 Dashboard along with new case rate metric (per 10,000) in the past two weeks. Today, the new case rate is 44, a decrease from 66 per 10,000 at last dashboard report and the prior week's value of 86.

Community Testing

Testing will continue in 2021 on Thursdays, alternating between Iowa and Lafayette Counties, from 11am-1pm, weather dependent. The next testing site will be held on **Thursday, January 14, 2021 from 11:00 – 1:00pm at the Health and Human Services Center located at 303 West Chapel Street in Dodgeville.**

Testing is free and open to anyone (age 5+) who feels they have a need to be tested. Minors must be accompanied by a parent or guardian with consent. Appointments are not required, but it is requested that those who wish to be tested pre-register at <https://register.covidconnect.wi.gov>.

People should consider visiting the testing site if:

- * They have had close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19.
- * They have COVID-19 symptoms
- * They have regular exposure to a large number of people (i.e., people who work in grocery stores)
- * They work closely with high-risk populations (i.e., healthcare workers, people who work with people who are incarcerated, people who work in long-term care facilities)

There are additional testing sites in southwest Wisconsin in Grant, Lafayette and Richland counties. Visit the Iowa County COVID-19 website to see the full regional schedule and/or follow our Facebook page for a list of weekly testing opportunities in southwest Wisconsin.
